


#### FY 2020 \$15.4 Billion in Gross Revenues

# Where does DC's money come from?


#### FY 2020 \$8.6 Billion in Local Fund Revenue

### How does DC raise its local funds?


### FY 2020 \$15.4 Billion Gross Funds Expenditures

## Types of Spending

District government spending happens in two distinct places:



The **operating budget** includes the funding necessary to keep the government running from day to day. "Where is the spending?" – Programmatic attributes: Agency, program, activity, and service

"What are you spending on?" – Comptroller Source Group and Comptroller Source Object



The **capital budget** includes the funding for procuring or renovating District-owned capital assets: expensive, durable things like buildings, roads, vehicles, or IT systems.


### **Budget Roles**

**The Mayor**: The Home Rule Act requires the Mayor to prepare and submit to the Council an annual budget. The proposed budget must be balanced – that is, proposed spending cannot exceed estimated resources.

The Council: The Council is tasked with reviewing, modifying, and approving the Mayor's proposed budget. The Council takes an active role in adjusting the budget and incorporating its legislative priorities within the budget – and it must do all this within 70 days of the Mayor's transmission.

The Chief Financial Officer: The OCFO is charged with monitoring and safeguarding the District government's financial affairs. The Home Rule Act sets forth the duties of the CFO, including the publication of quarterly revenue estimates for the District, the maintenance of accounting and internal control systems; preparing the budget and financial plan for use by the Mayor, maintaining custody of the District government's funds and investments, and certifying the availability of funds to pay for proposed contracts.
