#### 1. Public Speaking Proficiency

Complete during 11<sup>th</sup> or 12<sup>th</sup> grade year; delivered on a public stage; Deliver speech no shorter than 5 minutes in length; business dress attire; 5 pts each with required score of 24 or above. (Participating in a regional speech contest will satisfy this requirement.)

Poise (appear calm and confident; avoid distracting behaviors)

Voice (speak every word clearly; use the right volume for the space)

**Life** (express passion and emotion with your voice)

Eye Contact (connect visually with audience; look at each audience member)

Gestures (hand motions; move your body; expressive face)

**Speed** (not too slow or too fast; uses pauses for effect and emphasis)


