
COMPUTER SYSTEMS



COMPUTER SYSTEMS ANALYST

What they do: Manage an organizations wider computer system, look for ways to improve current systems, and look at the big picture of a network capabilities.

How to get there: Generally requires a

bachelor's degree

What they make: \$42.50/hour



COMPUTER USER SUPPORT **SPECIALIST**

What they do: Provide technical assistance to computer users and answer questions or resolve computer problems for clients. Troubleshoot network issues in an organization.

How to get there: Generally requires a

high school diploma or GED. What they make: \$16.02/hour

COMPUTER SYSTEMS DEPARTMENT MANAGER

What they do: Plan, direct or coordinate an IT department in a specific field within an organization, like data processing, information systems, systems analysis or computer programming.

How to get there: Requires a bachelor's degree, and sometimes a graduate degree.

What they make: \$56.96/hour



COMPUTER SYSTEMS ADMINISTRATOR

What they do: Check to make sure networks and computers are working properly. Track and maintain computers, servers, and software needed to support an organization are in place and in working condition. Install and upgrade software.

How to get there: Requires a postsecondary certificate or associate's degree

What they make: \$35.65/hour
