



Postsecondary institutions must step up their role as systems change agents to close systemic gaps in green skills and green learning opportunities.




## The Opportunity

#### Wholeness approach

Integrate environmental justice with green skills development, rather than breaking these up for different spaces and places

02

#### Economy of care

Adopt values that prioritize stewardship, circularity, reciprocity, and shared prosperity, rather than extraction, transaction, profit, and exploitation

03

#### Collective action

Foster solidarity, shift power imbalances, and leverage shared resources for collective action with community-serving institutions, rather than acting in isolation of others



## Toward a New Green Learning Agenda

01 **STRENGTHEN** the ecosystem

02 **ORIENT** content toward environmental justice

03 **SUPPORT** transformative processes

04 **SHIFT** power imbalances 05 **ALIGN** strategies
