KITCHEN

Pretty

- Curvy island countertop. With a big arch to make room for seating and a rounded edge on the marble, this is not your typical boxy kitchen island.
- Industrial-style lighting.
 Too often pendant lights look
 wimpy, but these beauties
 practically have stage
 presence. They're 18 inches in
 diameter and hang 36 inches
 above the island.

Easy

- Beadboard. It has that charming cottage look, plus it's scrubbable if there's a smudge on the cabinets or scuff marks on the island.
- Adjustable counter stools. Not only can they accommodate each kid's height, the stools also tuck neatly under the island, so there's no crashing into them when they're not being used.

HOME OFFICE

Pretty

- Striped ceiling. Stretch your decorating dollar and wallpaper just the ceiling. To figure out how many double rolls you'll need, measure the area of your ceiling (length times width), then divide by 56 (the standard square feet coverage of a double roll).
- Cool shade! FYI: This style is called a tulip Roman shade.

Easy

- Sunburst mirror. It fits with any style—move it from room to room to change things up.
- Easy-access printer. The printer sits on a sleek acrylic table underneath the desk, so it's always within arm's reach. Clear tables are perfect for small spaces because they disappear.





Pretty

• Fun molding. Olivia's plain white walls come alive with the box patterns made from decorative molding. The spiky sunburst mirrors look like fireworks—a classic shape with a youthful twist.

Easy

Double-duty furniture. The bench at the end of the bed also serves as a bookshelf.

• Layers on the floor. Sue put a blue shag rug (Olivia's pick!) on top of the existing wall-to-wall carpet. "Olivia got the look she loves, and we didn't have to rip anything up," says Sue.



MUDROOM

• One awesome light fixture. Storage spaces often get the short end of the lighting stick, but not here. This blown-glass lantern, which is encased in brass mesh, is totally diningroom-worthy.

Art on the floor? Sure! A hand-painted compass injects some fun into a hardworking room. Do it yourself with cool stencils from istencils.com.

Easy

Serious clutter control. "If we didn't have this area, there would be sports equipment all over the house," says Sue. Each kid has his/her own cubby for dropping backpacks, lacrosse sticks, and lunch boxes. Shallow shoe drawers, with a window into their contents, open underneath.

Show-off spot. The children's latest school art projects go on the family bulletin board. Sue's was built in, but check ballarddesigns.com for a similar look.
