## SUGGESTED STREET NAMES FOR GARDINER

**Town Historian, Carleton Mabee** suggests looking through, Kenneth Hasbrouck's, *History of the Town of Gardiner* (1978), available in the Gardiner Town hall. Mr. Mabee says that it "has some sections about the town as whole, other sections about particular neighborhoods. So it is convenient in it to find old names associated with the history of the town in general that could be used as street names anywhere in the town, and also to find old names associated with particular neighborhoods that could be used for locations in those neighborhoods. Here are some examples:

Names for anywhere in the town:

Ulster, Dutch, Huguenot, Dairy, Milk, Apple, Vineyard, Hudson, Wallkill, Stone House

Hamlet area (train related): Flagstop Road, Station Agent Road, Trackmen Road  
Double Track Road, Single Track Road  
Gardiner Hotel was called the Callahan Hotel at one time, Callahan Hotel Way.

Aqueduct related: Aqueduct Way, Mucker Road, San Hog Road, Chuck Tender Road, Driller Road, Jackleg Road, Jumbo Road, LaGuardia Road (he came up from NYC for Ceremonies in Gardiner).

Minnewaska area: Wildmere House and Cliff House, Mountain Laurel, Quakers and Alfred H. Smiley.

Denniston road/New Hurley area: Titus C. White, Orchard Farm (1910 chicken farmer) wife Emma K. White, William E. Hemingway (son-in-law).

Burnt Meadow area: Huebeck (1948 farmer) Togna (Italian immigrant).

Benton Corners area: Oscar Hedden (bootlegger that owned the corner hotel, creator of the lake in 1930 by damming the Marakill), Widmark and Benton's Corners Road.

No. Mountain Rd., So. Mountain Rd., and Shaft Rd. area: Seeholm's ('52/'53 boarding house) Sunny Croft (Bruynswick Road Dude Ranch)

Family Names of Importance: Abraham Deyo, Daniel Deyo, John H. Wurts, Costa Family, McCord Family Clinton Family, Keeping Family and Majestic Family.

Town Features: Covered Bridges, Wooden Bridges, Foot Bridges, Grist Mills and Saw Mills.
