

COPYRIGHT INFRINGEMENT POLICY

The copyright law of the United States (Title 17, United States Code) governs the lawful use of another person's copyrighted material, including making copies or using the original work as your own.

The copyright for this material available through the library is not held by Ohio Valley University.
