REPORTS AND DISCUSSION

Zlatanovic reported on the status of permits, a recent Braen Quarry presentation, radon kits available from the county health department, Haledon Day in late summer, and the status of public records requests.

Car reported that she continued to monitor COVID and the number of new COVID cases was trending downward. She also reported auditing school and daycare records.

Mora reported on the status of inspections in Haledon, including four Risk 1 businesses, six Risk 2s, and five Risk 3s. There were also several public health nuisance inspections, ongoing lead inspection, and two re-inspections. Adiga had changed its name to Bagel Nosh. Mora also reported on a new state regulation banning flavored vapes.

Webb asked who took over the Haledon Farmers Market, and discussion followed.

Zlatanovic asked PCDOH representatives regarding how free or low-cost car seats can be distributed to low-income residents, and discussion followed.

Cameron reported there were 167,511 COVID cases in the county, including about 3,000 in Haledon, since the beginning of COVID. PCDOH offers free COVID test kits. There were no recent outbreaks of COVID. Cameron also provided an update on monovalent and bivalent vaccines.

Cameron also reported on flu activity. By February 23rd there would be flu vaccines available to all children, regarding of insurance status.

Discussion also followed regarding monkeypox and legionnaires disease. There were no such cases in Haledon. There was also discussion regarding the newest omicron subvariant of COVID.

Webb moved to accept reports, and Moczo seconded. All board members present voted aye.

There were no new communications discussed.

There was no old business discussed that was not already discussed.

NEW BUSINESS
