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


PRETTY AND PAIRED BACK WEDDING DAY AT THE PUMPING HOUSE





We always think that being a wedding photographer must be a pretty special profession; spending your working day with couples celebrating their love for each other and being surrounded by joy and romance! They are also in a unique position where they experience every aspect of the entire day. From the excitement and nerves of a bride getting ready to first dances and bouquet throws, the photographer is there, snapping away, throughout the lot. And it is because of this, that we always love to get the low-down on a wedding from their point of view.

So for Amy & Jamie's wedding, we just had to ask Hannah and Ben, the dream-team behind of the lens of HBA Photography, to give us their account of this perfectly pretty Spring soiree.

Hannah says "WHAT A DAY! We loved this wedding so much.





It's always amazing when we arrive at the bride's house and everyone knows your name and is incredibly friendly & welcoming. That is when we knew we were in for a great day (and even better when we saw that Josephine Way was also there doing the make-up as she's always hilarious).

The venue, Calke Abbey, quite literally is a photographer's dream. It's actually where Ben & I had our first kiss, and now 13 years later we're still happliy married, so to be able to bring our cameras and photograph weddings there is a real privilege and Amy and Jamie only added to that. Whilst walking around with them, hanging out while we did some photos, it became very clear that they were perfect for each other. They laughed, cried, had fun and were a total pleasure to be around for the day and hopefully, we've captured some of that in the photos. Photographically, there are lots of interesting bits of light around the venue as the sun moves overhead and sets beautifully over the field. This creates the most amazing golden hour sun light to photograph in and really create some dreamier sun flared photos.

The day featured an old vintage Routemaster bus to take everyone from the church to Calke Abbey, Tosh's Troughs filled with bottles of beer for the reception, picnic boxes for starters, fish 'n' chips for main and pretty little jars filled with a delicious Eton Mess for pud. If that isn't a recipe for a good time, we don't know what is...

As if the day couldn't get any better....then a Glitter Bar turned up. Everyone was covered in glitter by the end of the night – even Ben had a beard full!"

Wow, it sounds like they all had an absolute blast at the beautiful Calke Abbey – thanks so much Ben and Hannah for sharing.




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Dopcorn at the ready, the film is about to start! There is just something so special about reliving your wedding day in cinematic style; romance just oozing off the screen and transporting you right back to that moment. Here we catch up with lovely Lou from Rather Lovely Films and, believe us, if you're wondering whether to book a videographer for your wedding, then this is a must-read for you!

We absolutely love your videography; how would you describe vour style?

Thank you so much - and for the record, I absolutely LOVE 'Save The Date' too! I am literally beyond chuffed you love what I do because the magazine was my favourite resource when planning my wedding.

These days, a lot of photographers and videographers take a natural, relaxed approach and whilst that is a crucial part of creating gorgeous memories of your wedding day, I focus on capturing your celebrations as if it's through the eyes of one of your guests. Most couples book a videographer so they can see the parts of the day they missed, but from my own experience as a bride, you'll want to re-live the whole thing a thousand times over and the best way to do that is to be put into your



guests' shoes. I consider myself to be a guest at every wedding I'm lucky enough to be invited to film so it's that principle that helps me capture every moment in the most authentic way possible.

What do you enjoy most about capturing weddings?

I mean the obvious answer is EVERYTHING because I just love weddings so much it's a bit weird! However, the atmosphere that's always in the air during the bridal preparations is a feeling I can never guite put my finger on, but I'd bottle it up and sell it if I could - it's a perfect recipe of excitement, anticipation, relief and joy that only seems to ever happen on a wedding morning. I think it's because we're all leading up to when the bride walks down the aisle and that is always THE MOMENT for me. The rest of the world just falls away...but I'm always keeping a close eye on whoever is waiting for the bride at the altar in case they shed a cheeky tear!

Tell us a bit about yourself and how you got into the wedding industry?

I started out in broadcast journalism a little over ten years ago so my roots are in telling people's stories through film and love stories have always been my favourite ones to tell (I mean, I grew up on Disney so it was going to happen!). It was around the same time that I first discovered the magic of wedding films through a friend when wedding videography really wasn't a thing. I decided then and there that when I got married, a wedding video was a non-negotiable for me whether Adam (my now husband!) liked it or not! When we married at The West Mill in 2016, we both agreed that our videographers were the best investment of the day - if you come round to our house, I quarantee Adam will crack out the wedding films within the hour!

It was after our wedding that I learnt from other newlywed friends that they regretted not having their day filmed due to cost, being self-conscious or worrying about it being intrusive...and I started Rather Lovely Films a year later hoping to make wedding videography appealing yet affordable.

Some couples worry that videography may feel intrusive on-theday so how do you work to ensure everyone is comfortable whilst capturing those important moments?


This is definitely a valid concern and one that I encounter with almost every couple I work with. Firstly, I shoot handheld on really discreet cameras with no lighting or additional equipment which means I'm a proper ninja when it comes to filming all those important moments in an unobtrusive way. Most importantly, to create a beautiful film that shows your wedding day exactly how it happened, I never boss people around. It's so cringe and instantly makes everything look unnatural. I'm there to create YOUR wedding film, not the other way round!

Do you have any advice for couples who might feel self-conscious about being on film?

One of the biggest misconceptions about videographers is that we love being on camera ourselves. Truthfully, we are just as awkward because the very concept of having a camera in your face is unnatural to all of us – so if anyone gets it, it's me!

I understand that the initial thought of watching yourself back on film is something that may make you recoil in horror! However, on your wedding day, you'll be looking your best and, ultimately, I am there to make you look good too - that's what you're paying me for, right?!

Seriously though, my couples feeling comfortable with me is my number one priority and we'll start to build up that confidence from the moment you book. I'm always a message away if you ever want to chat,



but I like to arrange a proper catch up with you about six weeks before the big day where you'll take me through your plans and we can chat through any guestions, worries you might have and any must-haves or no-aoes!

Not booking a videographer is one of the most common regrets of newlyweds, and whilst I fully appreciate that is the worst quilt-trip in the world. I would hate for it to be someone else's because they worried about how they would look on film. If this is one of the reasons stopping you from committing to a wedding video, then please do get in touch and I'd be more than happy to discuss your concerns to help you decide if it's right for you.

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

Here we have pulled together a few of our favourite pandemic parties which prove that micro definitely still is magical and romance certainly isn't dead!



Matthew says "We felt in the run up to the day, that everything was going against us. Countless wedding plan iterations, slimmed down guest lists and the reception cancelled 2 days before (due to COVID). Even the night before with forecast 40mph gusts and constant downpours predicted - I really didn't know how we were going to pull it off. However, as the day and service went on, the skies cleared and none of that seemed to matter anymore.

After the ceremony, we briefly re-convened, where our guests collected their 'pack up' three course meal, to enjoy a remote reception in the comfort of their own homes!

Later that evening, we had a video call with our wedding guests, to catch up and to conduct the speeches. We were presented with a video, with pre-recorded video messages from our guests - wishing us well. Many who had dressed up, got the fizz/confetti and baby photos out! The two of us spent the rest of the evening reading all of the messages from our quests, looking at the photos they sent of them watching the livestream, and we re-watched the live-stream with the running text commentary on the Facebook live.

Strangely - we felt like we got to spend more time with our quests than we would have usually been able to, at a 'normal' wedding day. We deeply missed having all of our guests there in person, but with all the videos, pictures, messages, calls, letters.....the day was more than we could have ever hoped for."

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



Waking up at the venue on the morning of your wedding day after a lovely evening of laughter and bubbles with your girls, having your hair and make-up done, putting on the dream dress that you have been waiting so long to wear and heading across the lawn to see your other half standing there below a beautiful archway of flowers waiting for you. After saying your vows in front of your dearest family and friends you are ready for the party to start! Music, drinks, food, love, laughter and dancing carry you through to the end of the night when you both head over to your wedding night tipi, happy and content. Feet aching from dancing and voices and hoarse from singing. The perfect end to the perfect day.

I think after the last few months, we are all in need of some beauty and inspiration, so the team jumped at the chance to create this sustainable spring themed shoot at brand new outdoor venue Measham House Farm in Swadlincote, Derbyshire.

As always I wanted to show that a more eco-friendly wedding can be just as beautiful and unique as any other kind of wedding. The amazing back drop of Measham House was a great starting point and they also offer a field for glamping, so it's the perfect venue for an outdoor festival style wedding! I chose a naked tipi as our base and mirrored this with the glamping tipi. The style I wanted to create was fresh and elegant with a vintage feel and the colour scheme just had to be spring inspired!

We had a great team of sustainable suppliers for this shoot; the wedding dress was handmade from bamboo silk and re-purposed voile by ethical bridalwear designer Frock Goddess. The beautiful stationery was designed by sustainable wedding stationer Ellie & Liv Weddings and printed on a mix of recycled and FSC certified fully recyclable cards and papers with eco-friendly organic inks.

The florals were provided by the amazing Inspired Floristry; as always she created beautiful sustainably sourced and created pieces that fit perfectly with my vision. The foliage was foraged from the surrounding area and the flowers seasonal and sourced locally where possible, specifically chosen to be robust and withstand the elements and being out of water for a prolonged period of time. We also used small individual arrangements on the table which could then be given away to wedding quests as gifts on the day.

It is important to think about the suppliers you use and where you are going to source items from for a more sustainable wedding; buying vintage and reclaimed pieces, hiring instead of buying. We used a combination of both to create this look along with naturally died ribbons and fabrics for the table linen.

Our grazing table was a mixture, sourced from local farm shops and delicatessens and the beautiful cakes and sweet treats were provided by Red Robin Cakery, a local small business. Sustainable to the end, of course, nothing went to waste as we all enjoyed eating it for lunch after we had wrapped up the shoot!










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CELEBRATE WITH CELEBRANTS

Between all of the grandeur of weddings; the styling and the florals, the outfits and the menus, it can be easy to get swept away and forget what the true essence of the day really is! The ceremony is the true heart of the day, the part where you make your promises and romantic declarations in front of your closest friends and family so it makes sense to pay it special attention.

Well, did you know that as well as a religious officiant or registrar, there is an increasingly popular third option for creating your wedding ceremony; working with a celebrant lets couples design something that suits them perfectly, reflecting their unique relationship, interests and values.

Rather than a registrar using a fixed script that's been heard many times before, celebrants work with couples as part of their core wedding team, to write and deliver a bespoke ceremony.



Karen Faulkner, a humanist (non-religious) celebrant of Stand Out Ceremonies says "As well as traditional ceremony elements, in a humanist wedding we can include special features that make the ceremony super memorable: whether that's including family, guests, your precious pooch, or symbolising your marriage by doing something a bit different! Every element is personalised; I tell a couple's story to reflect on the adventure and relax everyone, and I support couples to write their own, meaningful vows if they want to.

On the big day I'll set the tone, be a friendly face at the end of the aisle, and always try to keep out of those important photos! Your ceremony doesn't need to be inside a licenced structure; it can be outside, or somewhere truly unique. Celebrants are committed to making the ceremony an enjoyable highlight of the day, not the bit some couples (and guests!) might dread!"

Humanist weddings are still relatively niche in England and Wales, their popularity restricted by their lack of legal recognition. This means that couples need to make a separate appointment at a registry office to take care of the legal paperwork either before or after their wedding day.

Karen explains "The lack of legal recognition is something Humanists UK (the charity I'm accredited by) have campaigned to change for many years, culminating in a successful high court case in July 2020 that recommended humanist marriage should indeed have legal status. So we are confident the situation will change to bring us in line with countries such as Scotland (where humanist marriage accounts for over 20% of all marriages), but the timescale is unknown. Until that time we have to ask couples to take care of the administration separately; but to thousands of couples every year this slight compromise is worth it for the benefits in how their ceremony is created and delivered."

Of course, we couldn't let Karen go without a word on the pandemic and how the celebrant community has responded:

"The main difference to my couples is that they are calling me - an accessible, flexible and committed member of their wedding team - to discuss how we can adapt or change the celebration, while ensuring it is still an incredible, once in a lifetime event. This is quite different from dealing with the council registry office who have a huge workload and many thousands of both marriages and other registrations to deal with. With many unusual situations arising from the pandemic (such as proceeding with a small legal ceremony and then having the 'main event' later) there has been an increased awareness that we can create something for the 'sequel ceremony' that more than makes up for splitting the event in two. We have also worked closely with venues that want to open up using larger or outdoor spaces for ceremonies (without a licensed structure in place), something that we are able to do"

I will provide everything that's needed, from my own seat, the PA & if you are in a remote location struggling for power, I even have a battery powered PA. Along with providing the music on my guitar, in between sets I will provide appropriate music via Spotify.

What song would you pick for your first dance?

'Marry Me' by Train. This is a very special song for me as I played this song whilst my wife walked down the aisle. I absolutely love the song and my wife still cries to this day when she hears it (in a good way of course!).

Are you looking forward to anything in particular when you get back behind the strings after lockdown begins to lift?

I can't wait to see all the emotion, smiles and laughter that a wedding brings. Family and friends coming together, some who haven't seen each other in a long time, at a beautiful venue with their favourite drink; it is going to be extra special now!
