Abstract:	Giovanni's Room, the oldest LGBT (lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender) bookstore in the United States, was founded in Philadelphia in 1973 and is still in operation as of 2012. The bulk of the Giovanni's Room records, circa 1975-1991, are financial in nature.

## **Biographical/Historical Note**

Giovanni's Room, among the oldest gay and lesbian bookstores in the United States, was founded in 1973 at 232 South Street in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania by three Gay Activists Alliance (GAA) members, Tom Wilson, Bernie Boyle and Dan Sherbo. In 1974 they sold the business to lesbian activist Pat Hill. In 1976, when the South Street building was sold, Pat sold out to Arleen Olshan and Ed Hermance, and they relocated the shop to 1426 Spruce, and finally to its present location [as of 2012] at 12th and Pine in 1979.

Paralleling the growth of Philadelphia's "out" community and the expansion of publishing in its subject areas, the store doubled three times from its beginning on South Street to its present two buildings (one a double trinity from the 1820s, the other a mom-and-pop store and house from the 1880s) on the corner of South 12th and Pine Streets. Olshan left the partnership in 1986.

## **Scope and Content Note**

The bulk of the records in this collection are financial in nature (sales receipts, expense invoices, and cancelled checks). There are also a small number of employment applications, inventory lists, and other records. The Archives has more Giovanni's Room materials in its ephemera files.
