Like I said on the last slide the plague is a bacterial infection that may be deadly. The three most common forms of plague are: Bubonic plague, an infection of the lymph nodes (infects your immune system glands that causes swelling and possibly cancer), Pneumonic plague, an infection of the lungs, and lastly Septicemic plague, an infection of the blood. It is cured by an assortment of treatments, for example: Antibiotics such as streptomycin, gentamicin, doxycycline, or ciprofloxacin are used as treatment for the plague. You would also need fluids, oxygen and respiratory support. The bad thing is back then they had pretty much none of these treatment's.


Art around the world


When was Frida born:July 7, 1910

- Did you keep playing after that performance?








