This virtual collaboration will highlight an exhibit representing quality and vibrant regional contemporary and traditional quilts that celebrate the rich quilting culture across New York State.

This special virtual program will offer new perspectives on New York State's heritage and is being hosted to highlight historically and culturally significant sites along New York State's Path Through History during its annual fall weekend from October 10-12.
