
OUR BILL


To create safe learning environments:

- School districts should be required to have non security responses to nonviolent student disruptions. All school districts should also implement noncriminal restorative justice programs in schools to mediate student conflict as defined by section act.
- The definition of what constitutes a School Resources officer must be expanded to include any new or existing individual who has a role of guidance counselor, social worker, psychologist, school aide or other staff member with the appropriate training and ongoing supports to address daily interactions between students and school personnel.

HERE'S WHY

According to <u>research by Connecticut Voices for Children</u>, there's no evidence School Resource Officers (SROs) make students or staff safer, but schools with SROs have **more arrests and more expulsions** than their peer institutions without SROs.





RACIAL DISPARITIES IN ARREST

*Every arrests per 1,000 students, numbers taken from CSSD, 2018-2019 school year.

In the 2018 - 2019 school year, Black and Hispanic students were **3.1** and **1.6** times more likely to be arrested than white students. The average percent of Black students arrested in schools with SROs was over 17 times higher than those without SROs.
