

ICICLE CREEK LONG SPOONS PRESENTATION 2018 HIGHLIGHTS

Icicle Creek Center for the Arts has undergone a period of significant expansion over the past five years in terms of both program offerings and impact. In keeping with the original vision of founders Harriet Bullitt and the late Wilfred Woods, the focus of work involves providing arts education opportunities to students across North Central Washington; offering performance experiences not otherwise available to area residents; nurturing creativity and artistic production; and helping to ensure a vibrant future for the Arts in NCW.

Arts Education

- The reach of Icicle Creek's arts education programs has grown from less than 200 students in 2012 to **more than 6,000 students in 2018**.
- Icicle Creek operates seven distinct education programs including: Chamber Music Institute; Icicle Creek Youth Symphony; Visiting Artist Series; Theater-in-the-Schools; Directed Film Study; Adult Piano Retreats (3x/year) and Summer Camps running from June through August.

Performances

- Icicle Creek offers classical, chamber and musical concerts across a variety of genres; opera (live and broadcast from the Met); theater, film, dance and lecture events.
- The 57 ticketed events presented so far in 2018 have drawn **more than 8,000 attendees**.
- Icicle Creek will have presented **83 public performances** by the end of 2018.

Community Support

- Icicle Creek collaborates frequently with other area non-profits and civic groups. Some examples in 2018 have included: partnering with WRI to bring David Sibley as part of BirdFest 2018; offering discounts and a benefit performance for Cascade Medical Foundation's THINK PINK campaign; facilitating the Edward Curtis 'Beyond the Frame' tour for eastern Washington; administering a community-building tour by author Dar Williams.
- Icicle Creek will have made in-kind and cash contributions in support of other non-profits and community groups in excess of \$60,000 during 2018.
- Regularly provides spaces on its campus for music educators, dance classes, yoga, mindfulness and other retreats put on by local community members.
