Our readings this week

Acts 2:1-21 The Holy Spirit comes when the faithful are gathered in one place. As a result, communication is restored between people of different tongues, reversing the effects of Babel. Further, all who are attentive gain deep insight into God's truth. How tragic it would be to miss such an event. Yet many do, while still more dismiss it as foolishness.

Psalm 104:26-end The psalm celebrates the wonder of creation. Through creation the Spirit made something good out of formless chaos, providing it with life-sustaining springs. On God's providence creation depends. The Spirit did not stop at creation, but is also constantly at work in its renewal, adding to the Lord's glory day by day.

I Corinthians 12:3b-13 Every Christian should expect to receive some form of gift from the Holy Spirit. The significance of each one of us and our gift is revealed in the way in which it enables us to help meet the needs of the whole community. Without each one of us, the community is incomplete; without the community, my gift and I are without purpose. There is a simple test of whether my gift is truly the work of the Holy Spirit: whether it honours Jesus as Lord.]

John 20:19-23 John, like the writer of Acts, makes the point that the Holy Spirit comes when, meeting as the community of Christians, we become aware of what Jesus has done for us. It is a gift given in order to empower us for the work to which Jesus sends us: the task of bringing the forgiveness of sins, won by Jesus, to others. No-one else is given this task. What happens if we do not do it?

Pointers for prayer

- Give thanks to God for the wonder and the beauty of his creation and for our place in it
- The Holy Spirit is a gift to the Christian community. We should expect to experience this power in the church community
- The church is commissioned to a great work. Can we discern our part in it?
- Pray for all those who, instead of seeing God working, can only hear nonsense.

Community Kitchen News. Last Wednesday we handed out about three hundred food bags at the Quai des Péniches, each containing a spicy vegetable, lentil dahl and rice dish (prepared in our kitchen), some fruit, a bottle of water, flatbreads and muffins donated by our volunteer home bakers. We will be distributing food bags again on Saturday 13 June. So we are continuing our call for flatbreads. We are looking to collect 300 more portions of flatbread or tortillas for this next refugee lunch. These flatbreads can be purchased or made at home following recipe such as the one found here: https://www.biggerbolderbaking.com/flatbread-recipe-3-ingredients-easy/ Long life packeted breads can be delivered to us any time. Fresh homemade ones can be delivered between 9 and II a.m. on I3 June. All donations will be gratefully received!

The Community Kitchen is also there for our own community. If you, your family or anybody you know is in need of food support from the community kitchen at this time, we also produce individually portioned meals for this purpose. Please contact Rev Fiona Simon (Fiona.simon@holytrinity.be) who will coordinate these requests.

We always need muffins! The demand for our muffins is increasing. We are now supplying them to a new partner - Les Cuistots Solidaires - who faithfully distribute food to the homeless in Brussels each week. So almost 1000 muffins are now being handed out every week. And we will also need muffins for our refugee lunches. So keep them coming!
