In Redding, California, home to Euphrates' headquarters, an unprecedented wildfire swept through the region over the summer, scorching 200,000 acres and destroying thousands of homes and structures. Immediately the local community banded together to take in and provide for those affected. Posters of gratitude and goodwill plastered the streets and the community sent hundreds of messages of love and forgiveness to the couple whose flat tire caused sparks that ignited the fire.



A Missionary for Peace and Reconciliation Our Chapter Leader in Abidjan, Côte d'Ivoire

Among our global community of changemakers are remarkable and powerful stories of reconciliation, healing and the restoration of hope and peace. James' story is one of them. These community members have sustained us, made our vision practical and enabled us to emerge into a global movement. James' nomination celebrates each of our partners in peace.





James envisions "a more just and inclusive world where engaged global citizens are fueled by the desire and the skills to come to deeply understand different perspectives, rather than to simply perpetuate their own." He pursues this vision in his work as founder of UFPACI - United For Peace

Against Conflicts International - a non-governmental organization (NGO) that uses dialogue to create an inclusive, just and thriving society.

"The 'other' holds the secret for survival."

Most notably, UFPACI successfully reconciled two tribes, entrenched in violent rivalry in Côte d'Ivoire, - the Gueree and Dozos - a feat no other NGO had successfully accomplished. He has also restored relationships between


albinos and non-albinos and Christians and Muslims, and has worked to humanize and integrate into society people with handicaps, including those who are deaf, and to address electoral violence.

James views his work of healing broken relationships as being a spiritual and metaphysical encoun-


ter. He believes strongly that everyone has a compassionate spirit, even those who commit acts of violence. He calls for the need to give space for their spirit to shine forward and the humanity in them to be revealed.

The situations James goes into, reconciling torn communities and healing broken relationships, are not easy. Yet he finds inspiration and strength to keep going in his understanding that this is his calling.







