The child care staffing shortage is driven by low wages. Wages are SO LOW that they FAIL to meet the cost of living in EVERY county in Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly must act now and invest in a child care recruitment and retention initiative to prevent more classrooms from closing and further limiting availability for working families in need of care.
