\* Titan Focus runs from 2:30 to 3:15 (Monday-Thursday) and is used for tutoring and extra help. Titan Tech is the school's afterschool program, which costs \$12 per day and runs from 3 until 5:30.

#### Morning Drop-Off Locations

- 1. 100 Car line (Titan Circle by the pond) open 7:20 7:35 a.m., access via South Campus Drive (all grades EXCEPT Pre-K)
- 2. 300 Car line (Lower School Gym) open 7:00 7:35 a.m., access via North Campus Drive (PreK 5 only)
- 3. 900 Car line (High School Gym) open 7:00 a.m. (grades 6-12 only)

#### **Afternoon Pick-Up**

During afternoon dismissal, LOA utilizes the <u>PikMyKid</u> app-based dismissal system. Further information will be provided to get you registered as we approach the start of the 2021-22 school year.
