Art in the Community

Our Art in the Park program connects professional visiting artists with local families. Last year we hosted free classes in Cyanotype/Botanical printing, Ceramic Planters, Monoprinting on Paper, Screen Printing on Clothing, Indigo/Shibori Dying, Clay face sculpting, Ceramic Beads and Jewelry, and Card Making. Each class was attended by 20 - 40 members of our community. To ensure that all kids have access to the arts we partner with the Family Resource Center, Island Rec, the San Juan Sculpture Park, the San Juan County Arts Council and the Farmers Market. **Together, we brought over 65 public arts events to the community at five locations in 2021!**

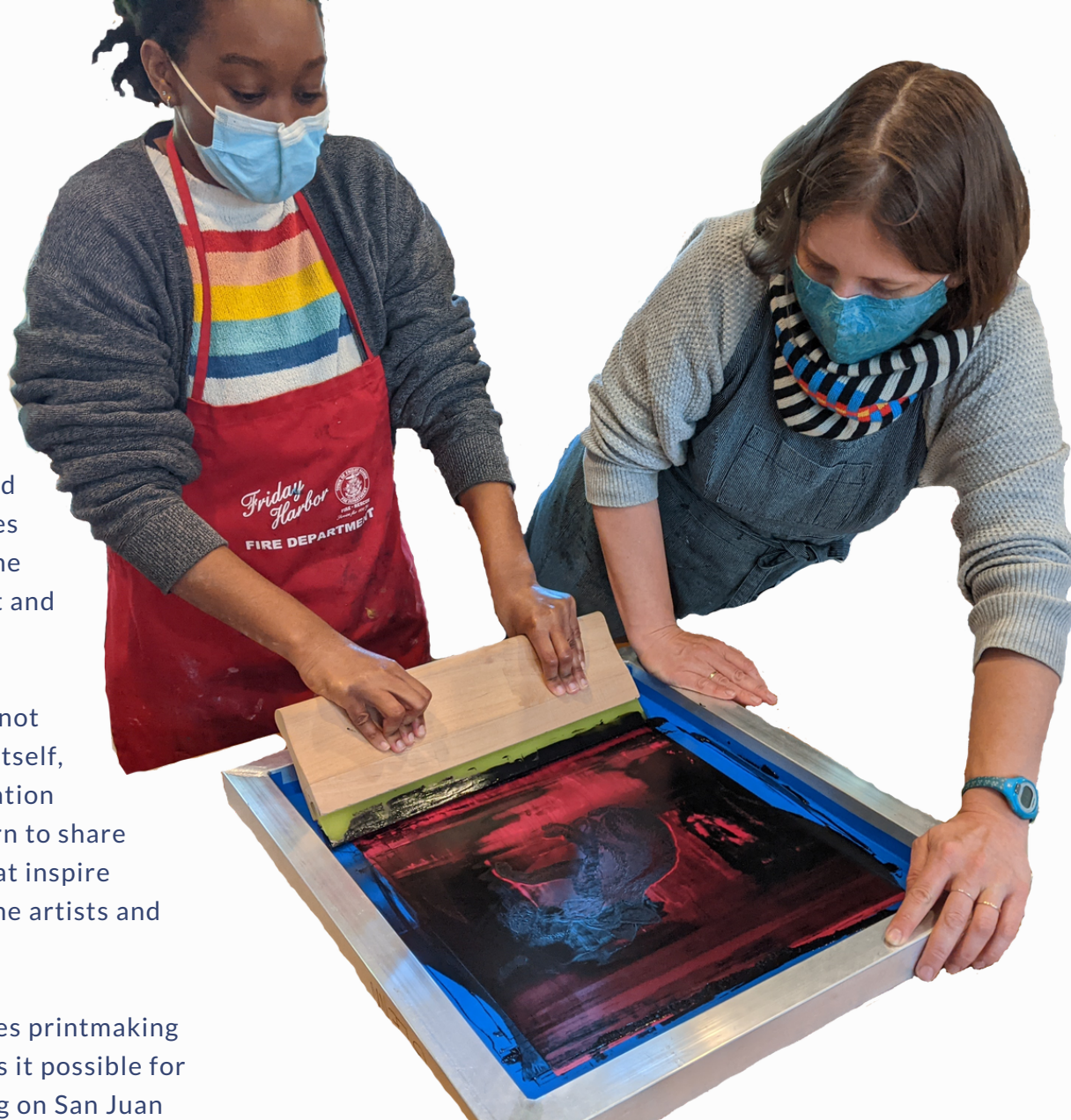
Artists in Residence

Half of our Artists In Residence last year were print makers.

Our printshop began in 2018, when we received legacy gifts of printing presses from the families of local artists Virginia Van Camp and Maryanne Rock. We continued to collect more equipment and we opened the program later that winter.

We chose to add printmaking to our programs not only because of its beauty as an art form unto itself, but because its history as a tool for communication and social justice. Students of printmaking learn to share their ideas through text and images in ways that inspire others and create positive change. Engaging fine artists and DIYers alike, printmaking is art for the people.

Our Artist in Residence program, which includes printmaking and an array of other artistic disciplines, makes it possible for young and emerging artists to experience living on San Juan Island through subsidized lodging. Artists stay in cabins in the forest for a couple months, mastering their craft and teaching others. Thanks to donations from community investors, we can offer these fundamental opportunities that help artists hone their technical skills and learn more of what it means to be a working artist.

I was in charge of all of the details in building a high-fire wood kiln, from the actual design, to sourcing the materials, to the construction" (kiln pictured right). "I wasn't confident in the beginning, but you trusted me" another intern told us, "you were so open, that gave me the opportunity to grow".

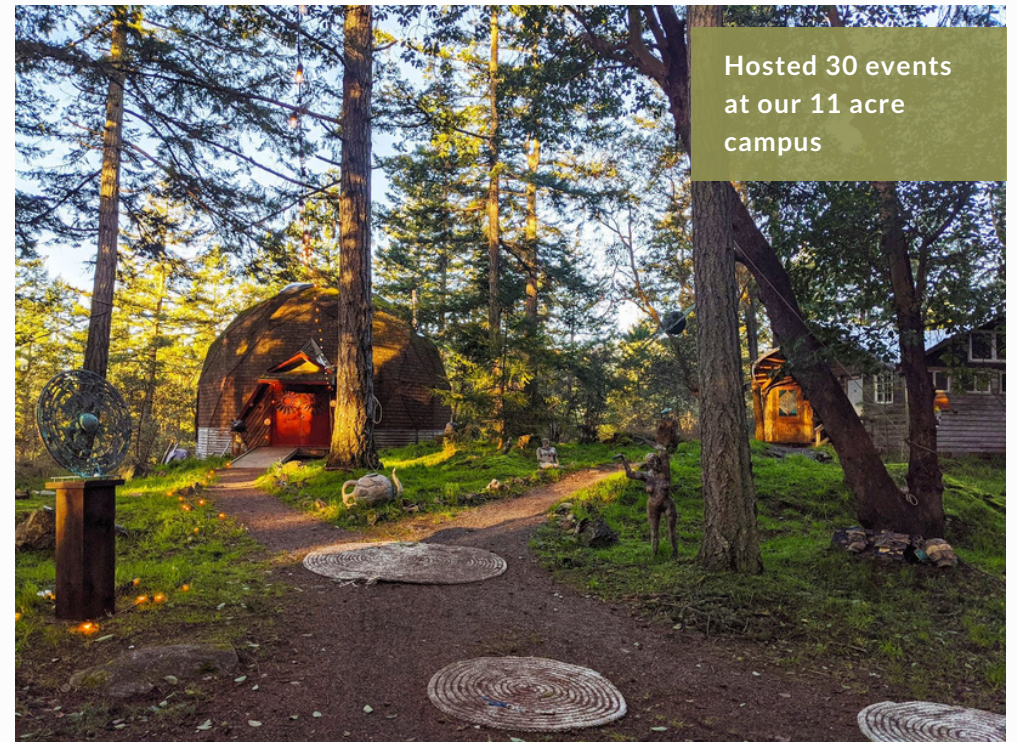
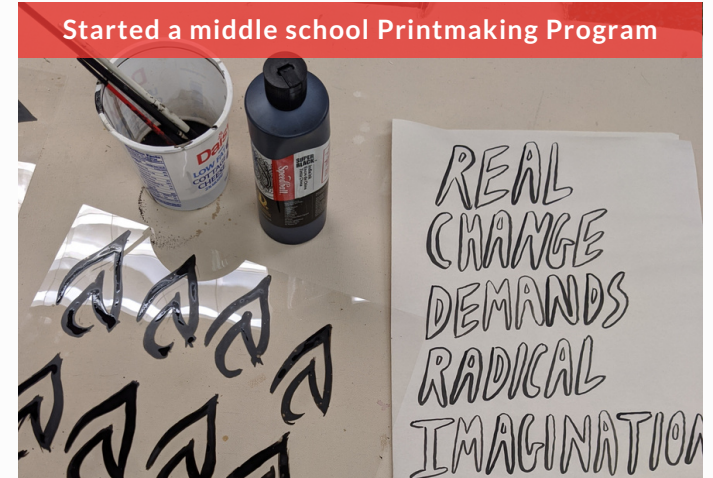
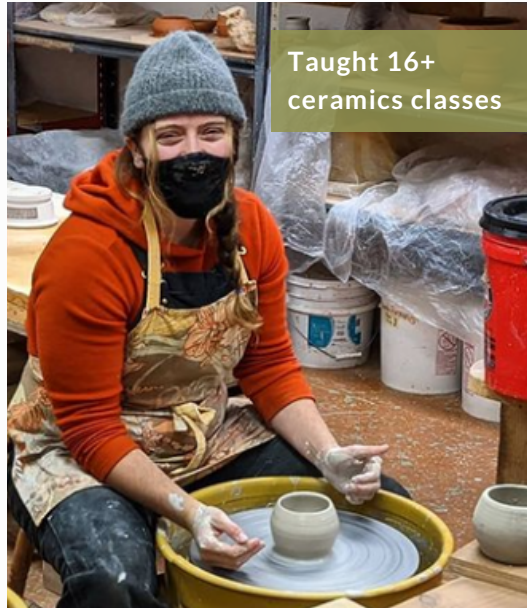

Clay, ink, wheels, and printing presses are what art uses, but the process of discovering who you are and what you can do is what art is - and why art matters.

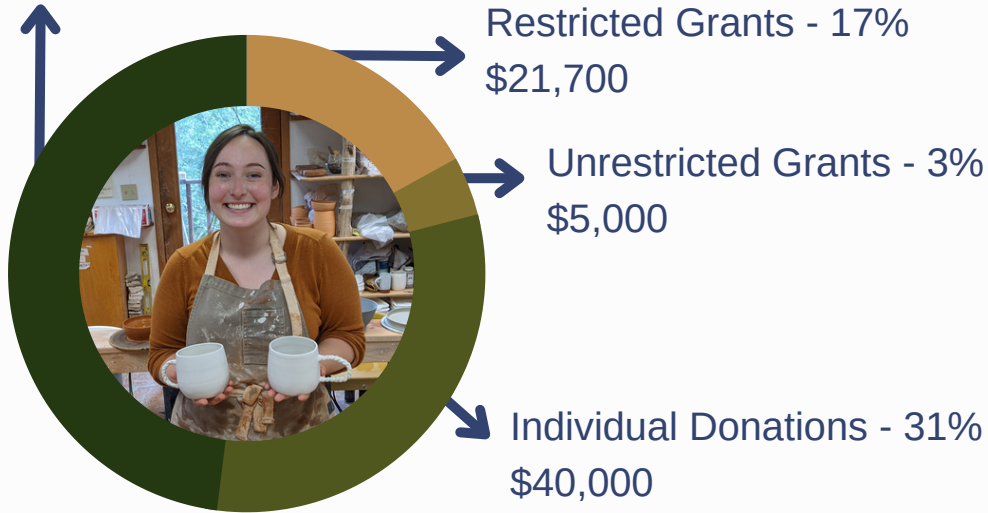
2021 Quick Facts
