CHAIRPERSON'S LETTER

It is my pleasure to introduce the 2019 Annual Report on behalf of the clients, volunteers, staff, stakeholders and Board of Directors of the Sexual Health Centre.

During the year 2019, the Centre expanded its extensive list of services and continued to meet the needs of the growing Cork community in a dynamic and responsive manner.

Key priorities for the Centre include supporting people living with or affected by HIV, increasing individual capacity to engage in healthy relationships, and promoting positive sexual health and wellbeing.

Ensuring widespread accessibility to screening and reproductive health support remains a focus for the Centre. In 2019, we saw a rise in the number of people engaging with services for sexual health, crisis pregnancy, HIV, sexuality and relationship advice. This has been a clear indicator of the community's need for high quality, professional and inclusive services.

As part of Ireland's first sexual health network, the Sexual Health Centre launched a portal at www.mysexualhealth.ie, to provide a range of information on sexual health, healthy relationships and wellbeing in Cork city.

The Sexual Health Centre led Ireland's second World AIDS Day Run in conjunction with parkrun, sexualwellbeing.ie, Healthy Ireland and the Health Service Executive.

The event promoted the U=U message, and highlighted the need for everyone to know their HIV status.

The Centre launched its five year strategic plan, prioritising the delivery of sexual health services for the community. Other goals include provision of sexual health services online, face-to-face and over the phone; delivery of sexual health education programmes for individuals with an intellectual disability; production of user-friendly publications and communications; and delivery of outreach programmes to inform and support young people in out-of-school settings.

Building on old and new partnerships is of great importance to the Sexual Health Centre. By establishing relationships and collaborations with statutory and non-statutory agencies, the Centre has been able to better support the sexual health needs of an evolving Ireland.

Often at the vanguard of progressive social change, the Sexual Health Centre has made a number of policy submissions throughout the year. The Centre was proud to be a co-signatory for Cork's membership of the HIV Fast Track Cities initiative. The Centre's team members remain key collaborators and stakeholders on a number of national and local policy implementation groups.

The important work of the Sexual Health Centre would not be possible without the commitment of the staff, volunteers and board of the organisation. I would like to extend my congratulations to the team in delivering a range of innovative services, advocacy campaigns and policy recommendations in 2019. Their commitment to the provision of high quality, equitable, accessible and inclusive sexual health services is crucial to ensuring every individual's right to a positive healthcare experience.

INTRODUCTION

The Sexual Health Centre is a Not for Profit, Non-Governmental Organisation (NGO) that was established in July 1987 as Cork Aids Alliance. The vision of the organisation is for a future where sexual health is recognised as an integral part of life, barriers to access sexual health services are removed, social stigma and discrimination are challenged, each individual feels safe to express their sexuality, and people make informed decisions regarding their sexual wellbeing and treat each other's life choices with the utmost respect.

In achieving this, the Sexual Health Centre sets a mission to:

"[A]lways provide the most up-to-date and comprehensive information regarding the topics of sexual health, wellbeing and sexuality, to offer a safe space for individuals to express their concerns without fear, to get non-biased answers to their most intimate questions, to normalise the perception of sexual health and sexuality and to facilitate a nation-wide acceptance of positive sexual health and sexuality as an integral part of life."

Our values include Dignity, Confidentiality, Accessibility, Safe Space, Non-Bias, Partnership, Transparency and Quality. The Sexual Health Centre believes that everyone has a right to positive sexual health and aims to provide high quality, inclusive and client-focused services. These services relate to wellbeing, healthy relationships, HIV and sexual health, and are available to every member of the community.

For over 30 years, the Sexual Health Centre has supported the community through innovative initiatives and an adaptive team, and it will continue to do so in the future.



THE YEAR IN REVIEW

The Sexual Health Centre introduced a range of new initiatives in 2019, and welcomed a number of changes at national level during this pivotal year for Ireland.

The beginnings of an important national policy change came in the form of the Relationships and Sexuality Education (RSE) review completed by the National Council for Curriculum and Assessment (NCCA). The Sexual Health Centre has worked to promote progressive policy developments through its policy recommendations, training, workshops and counselling. The Centre devised the 'WISE' training programme in 2019 to build capacity among teachers and youth workers in their delivery of sexual health education.

A peer-led LGBTQIA+ support role was introduced at the Centre, with a view to creating a safe space for the members of the community. The Centre's peer sexual health advisor provides practical support to LGBTQIA+ individuals and their families.

Ireland saw another societal shift in the aftermath of the 2018 referendum to repeal the Eighth Amendment of the Constitution. The victory of the 'Repeal' vote sparked a surge in the amount of people availing of crisis pregnancy counselling at the Centre in 2019. This included many people who had experienced a termination in the past, and felt encouraged to undergo counselling following the referendum.

The Sexual Health Centre was a proud co-signatory to Cork's membership of the HIV Fast-Track Cities initiative. This was soon followed by the delivery of a national HIV prevention programme in the Autumn, supported by the Sexual Health Centre through its health promotion and outreach work. A one-to-one mentoring service was established at the Centre for people who are living with HIV. This service includes assistance for people facing employment issues, adherence to medication, asylum applications, and other practical issues.

The Sexual Health Centre was proud to introduce an online portal for sexual health advice, at www.mysexualhealth.ie, as part of Ireland's very first Sexual Health Network. These initiatives were funded by Healthy Ireland, along with a visual health promotion campaign displayed on bus shelters and billboards across the city.

By building partnerships with local, national and international organisations, the Sexual Health Centre has been able to contribute significantly to the advancement of Cork's sexual health service provision.

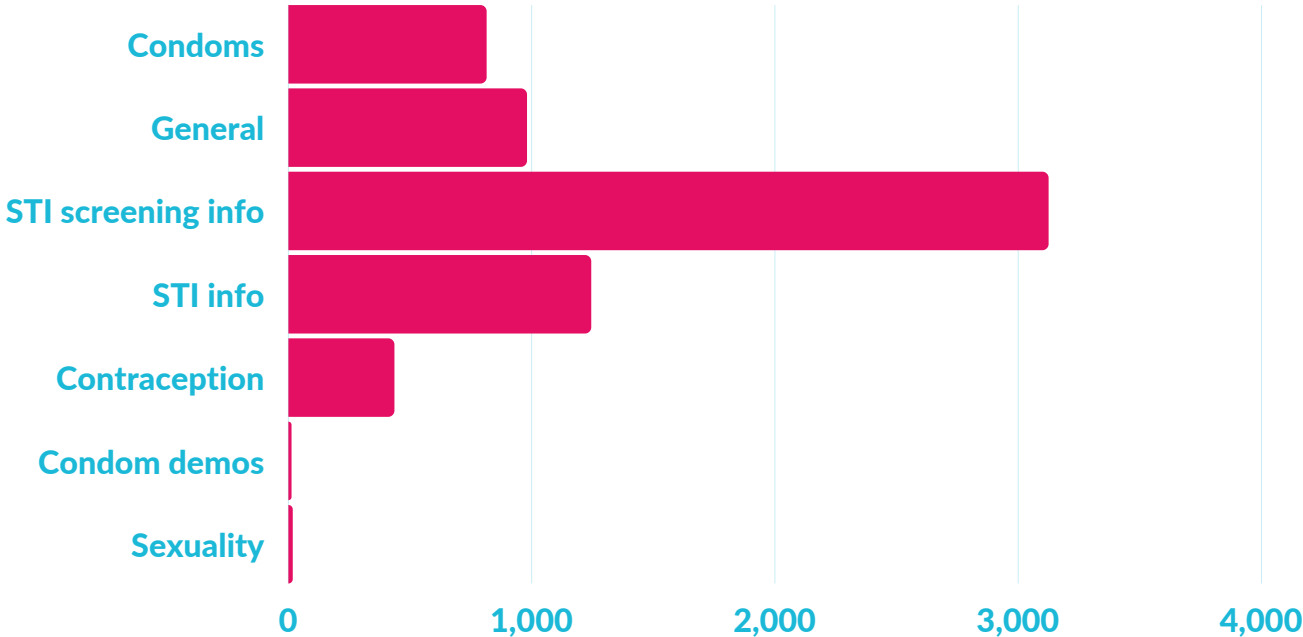
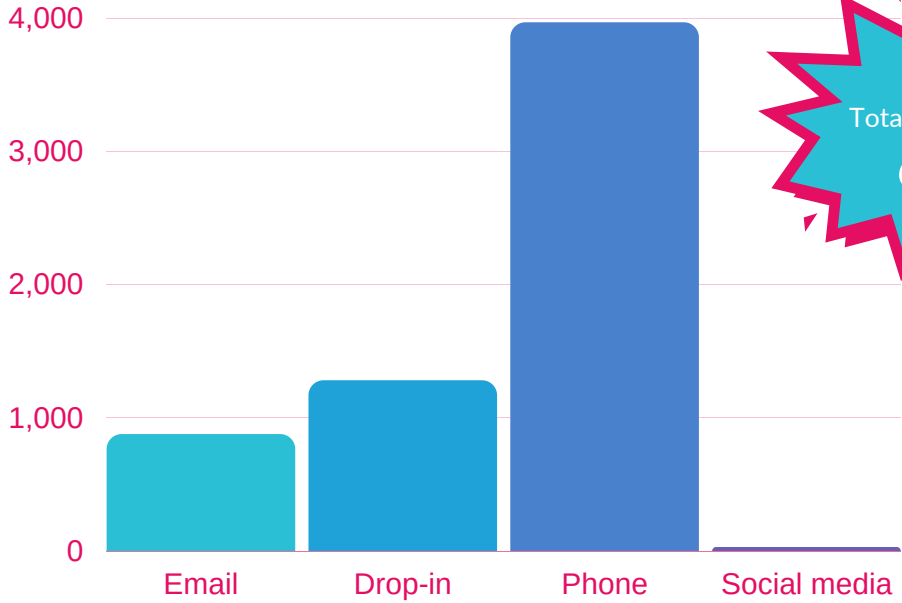

In 2019, we saw a total of **6,619 enquiries** from clients, in the form of drop-ins and contact via social media, phone and email.

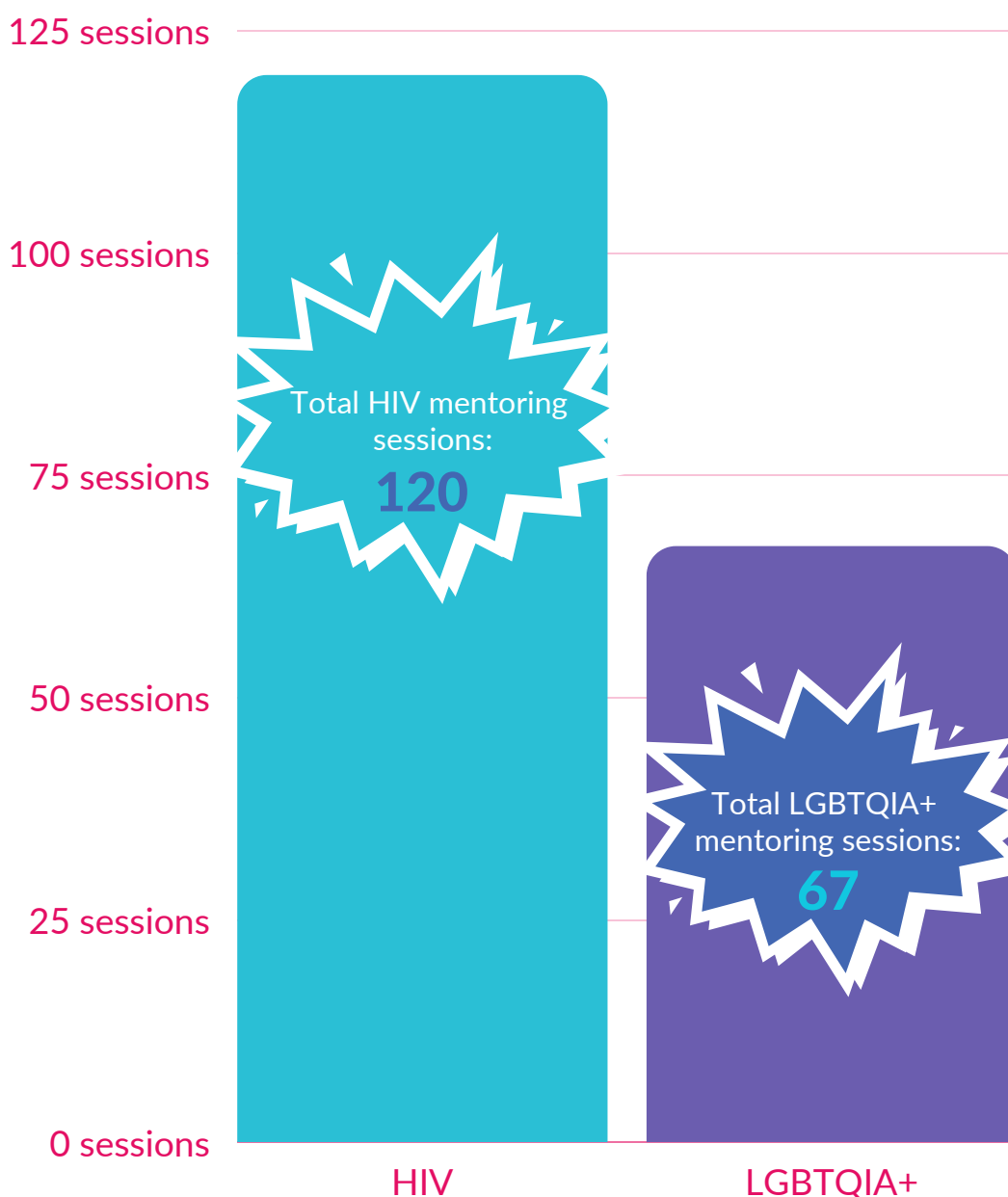

MENTORING SERVICES



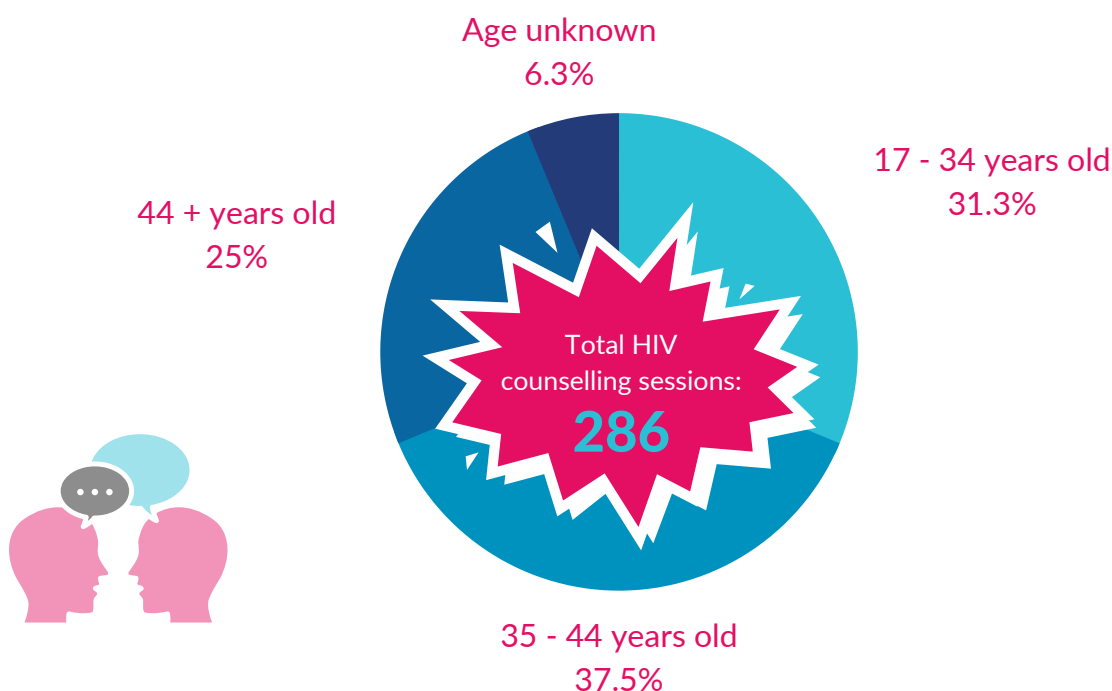

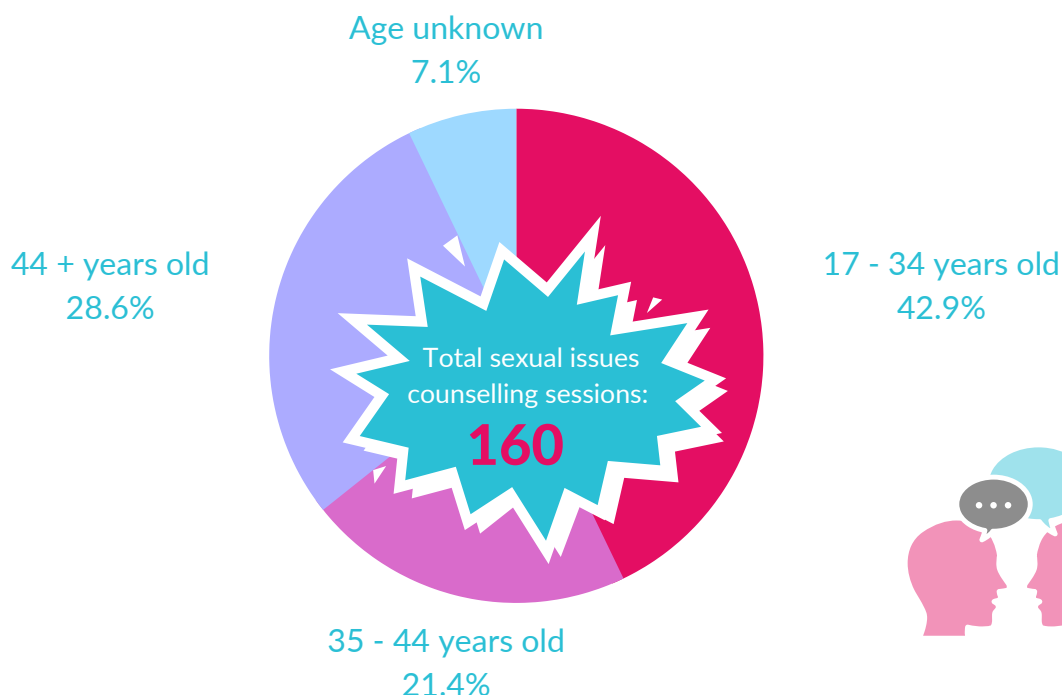
HIV & SEXUAL ISSUES SERVICES

HIV Counselling - Age Groups (New clients)



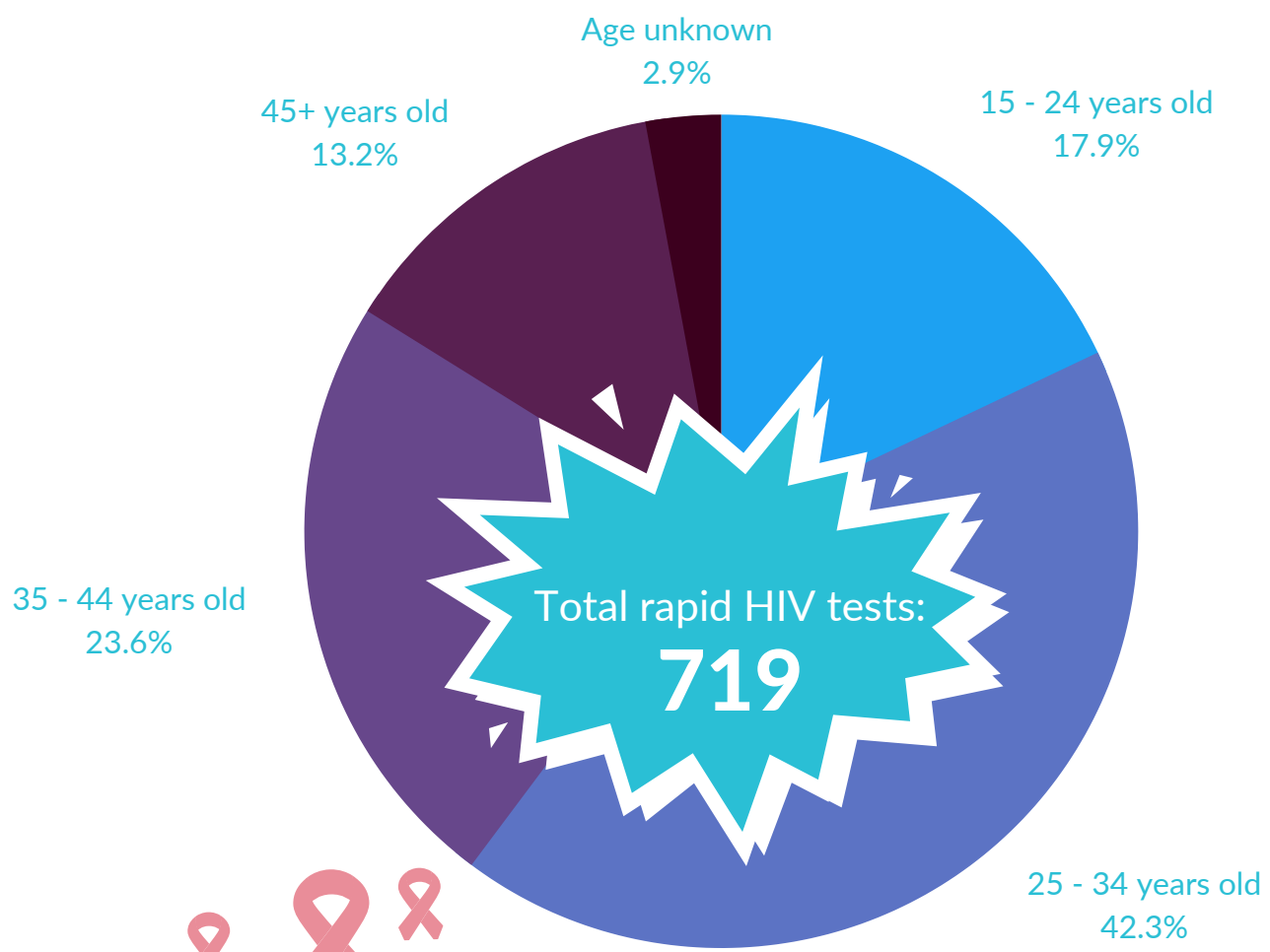
Sexual Issues Counselling - Age Groups (New clients)



RAPID HIV TESTING

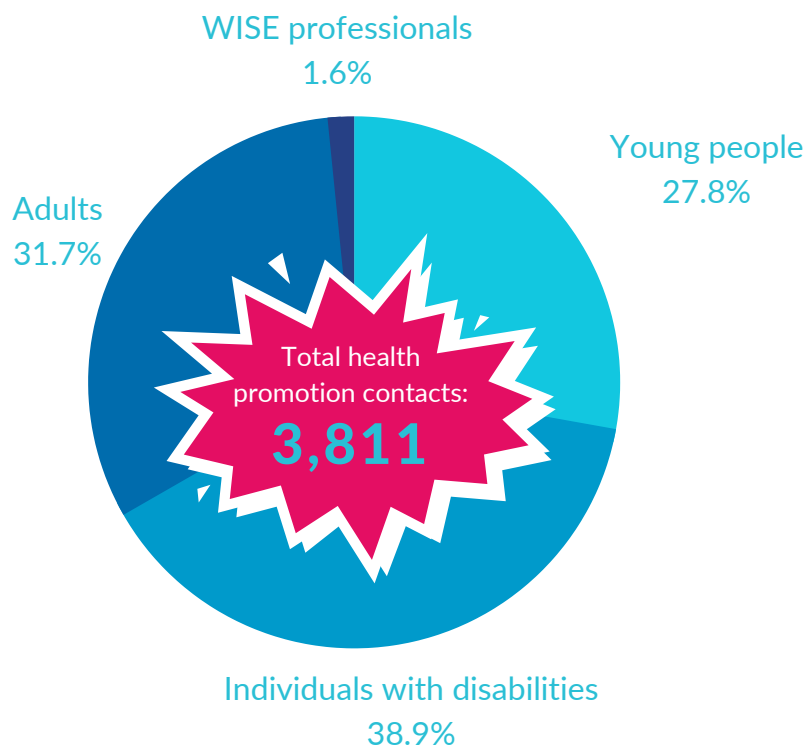
The Centre offers free rapid HIV testing, both on-site and in community settings. In 2019, we provided **719 rapid HIV tests**, as part of a partnership project with organisations across the city. This testing service is supported by volunteers as well as the Centre's health promotion and outreach workers.

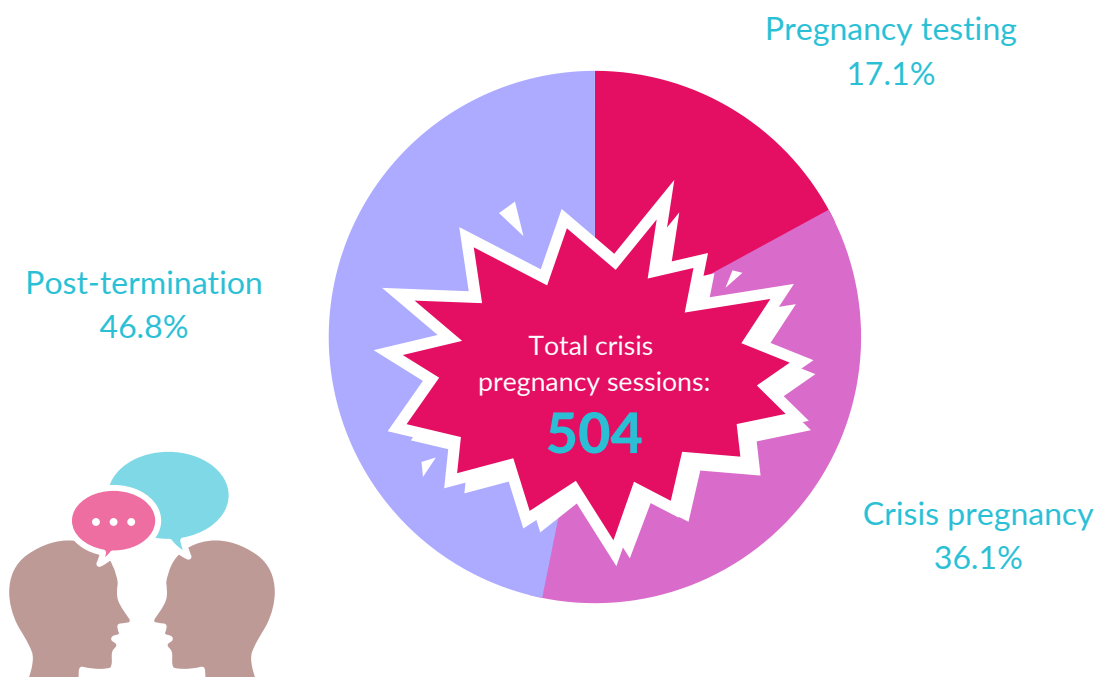

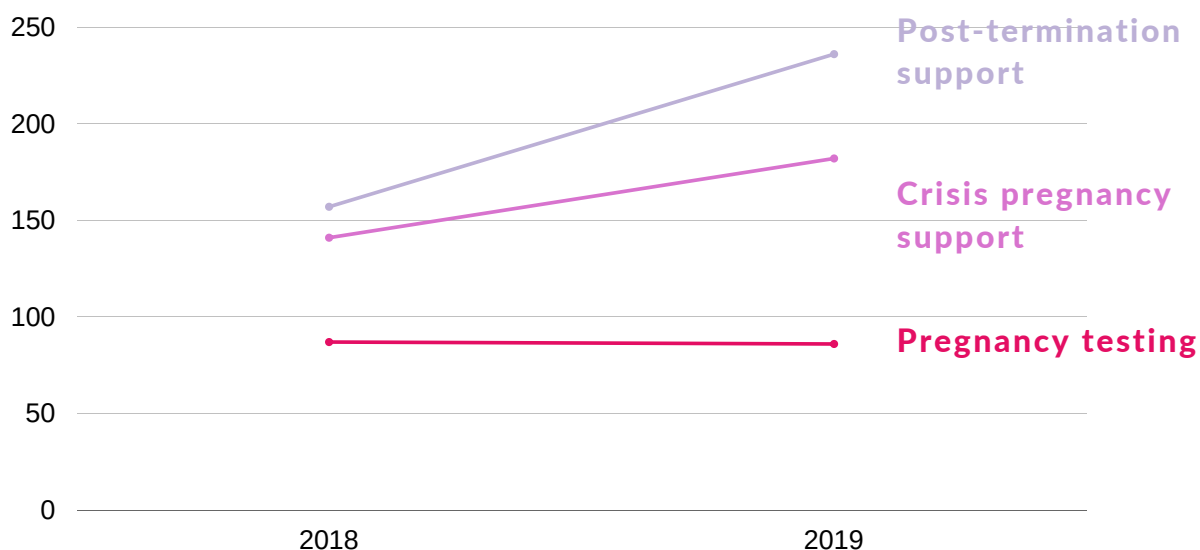

CRISIS PREGNANCY SERVICES

We provide a non-judgmental, wrap-around and free service, ranging from pregnancy testing to all-option crisis pregnancy counselling, as well as post-termination counselling and support. In 2019, the Centre provided a total of **504 sessions**.



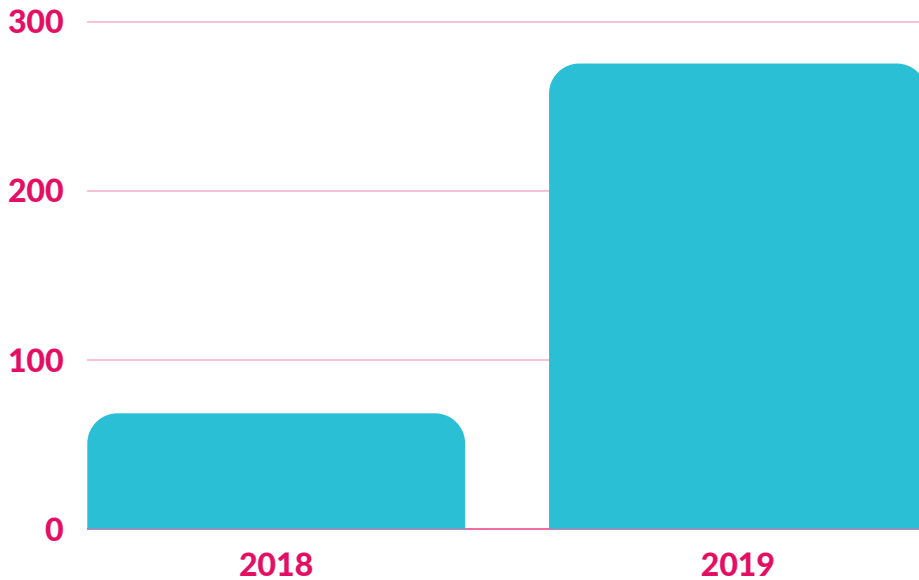
2018 vs. 2019

STI Screening clients - Age Groups

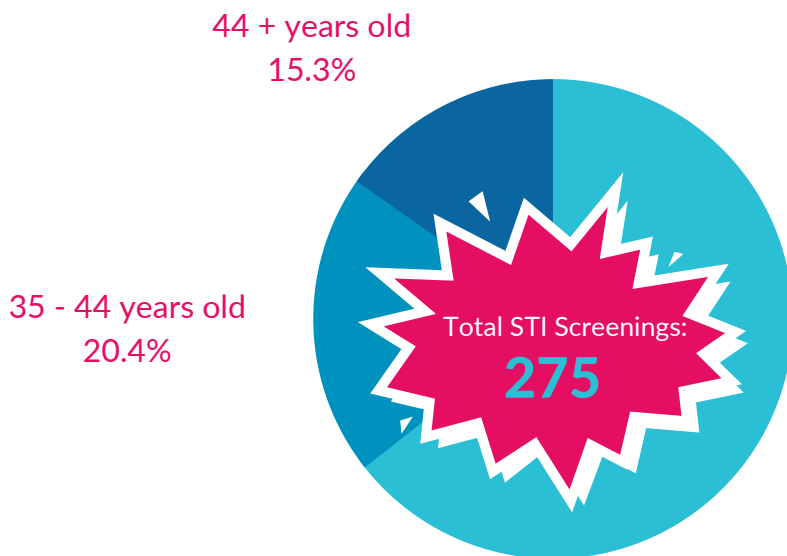

The Network launched the first portal fully dedicated to providing information on sexual health, healthy relationships and wellbeing in Cork city, at www.mysexualhealth.ie.



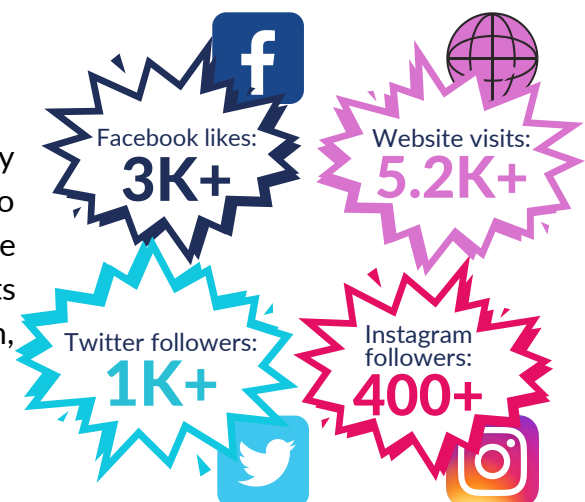

WORLD AIDS DAY CAMPAIGN 2019

Over 430 participants joined the World Aids Day run on 30th November. The run was launched by the Lord Mayor, Cllr. Dr. John Sheehan. The Centre would like to acknowledge the work of Maire O'Leary and the HSE Health Promotion and Improvement team for their efforts to expand the 2019 event to a second location in Tralee, Kerry.



GRANTS



In 2019, the Sexual Health Centre was awarded grants from the Health Service Executive (HSE), the Sexual Health and Crisis Pregnancy Programme (SHCPP), Healthy Ireland, the Department of Children and Youth Affairs (DCYA), and the Irish Research Council.

This funding enabled our team to introduce a number of new initiatives, including the WISE training programme, which was funded by the DCYA and assists teachers and youth workers in their delivery of sexual health education.

Healthy Ireland funding afforded the Sexual Health Centre the opportunity to establish Ireland's first Sexual Health Network. This innovative partnership includes the GUM/STI clinic in South Infirmity Victoria University Hospital, the HIV clinic in Cork University Hospital, the Sexual Violence Centre, the Sexual Assault Treatment Unit, Cork Gay Project, LINC and the Youth Health Service. An online portal with information on all of these organisations was launched at www.mysexualhealth.ie.

The In The Know manual is a collaborative project with Dublin-based organisation BelongTo. Funded by the SHCPP, this manual is aimed at young gay and bisexual men and trans women, and details a range of information on sexual health and healthy relationships.

The Sexual Health Network ran a promotional campaign, funded by Healthy Ireland, on bus shelters and billboards across Cork city. This visual campaign received a significant amount of traction and highlighted to the Cork community the range of testing and support services available in the area of sexual health.

Board member of the Sexual Health Centre and Senior Law Lecturer in UCC, Dr. Louise Crowley, was the Principal Investigator for a research project on 'A gendered typology of university students' sexual health, wellbeing and sexual practices'. The Sexual Health Centre collaborated with Dr. Crowley on this project, with the Centre's Executive Director, Dr. Martin Davoren named as a Co-Principal Investigator.

POLICY INITIATIVES



The Sexual Health Centre collaborated on several initiatives aimed at advancing the area of sexual health and wellbeing, improving sexual education and promoting a culture of inclusivity and acceptance, particularly in relation to people living with HIV, people experiencing crisis pregnancy, adolescents, members of the LGBTQIA+ community and other marginalised groups.

International Centre for Parliamentary Studies | HIV AIDS European Roundtable Policy Dialogue

The Sexual Health Centre's Executive Director joined this roundtable with participants from across Europe, including NGOs representatives, policy advisors, doctors and researchers, national public health agencies and government representatives from all around Europe. A list of recommendations was produced for policy makers, governments and key stakeholders to support an EU-wide strategy towards the HIV and AIDS response.

The Health Information and Quality Authority (HIQA) Health Technology Assessment (HTA) of a Pre-exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) programme

The Centre responded to the HIQA's assessment ahead of the introduction of PrEP for populations at substantial risk of sexual acquisition of HIV.

National Council for Curriculum and Assessment (NCCA) report on Relationships and Sexuality Education

A submission was made by the Sexual Health Centre to the NCCA during its review of RSE.

Drug And Alcohol Support

The Sexual Health Centre advocated for client assessments to include the area of sexual health and wellbeing. The Centre's submission led to the inclusion of sexual health in the initial case management assessment.

HIV Fast-Track Cities

The Sexual Health Centre was proud to be a co-signatory to Cork's membership of the HIV Fast Track Cities initiative. This global partnership joins almost 300 cities in collaboration with the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS and the International Association of Providers of AIDS Care.

The School of Public Health, UCC

The Sexual Health Centre's Executive Director holds an Adjunct Lecturer post in UCC. This role involves supervising research projects in the area of sexual health.



The Gay Health Network

The Sexual Health Centre is a proud member of the GHN, a network of organisations and individuals in Ireland promoting HIV prevention and sexual health and wellbeing for gay, bisexual and men who have sex with men (MSM).



The Sexual Health Network

Ireland's first sexual health network was established by the Sexual Health Centre in partnership with the GUM/STI clinic, the HIV clinic in CUH, the Sexual Violence Centre, the Sexual Assault Treatment Unit, Cork Gay Project, LINC and the Youth Health Service. The Centre's Executive Director is the Chairperson of the Network.



National Sexual Health Strategy

The Sexual Health Centre is represented in the communications subcommittee and the migrant subcommittee of the Department of Health's National Sexual Health Strategy 2015 - 2020. The Centre's Executive Director is on the Advisory Committee for the National Sexual Health Strategy.



AIDS Action Europe

The Sexual Health Centre is part of a regional network of over 420 organisations across 47 countries, whose vision is for people living with HIV to be free from stigma, discrimination and persecution, and access the necessary prevention, treatment, care and support.

The Centre Manager, Catherine Kennedy, was elected a community representative on the Cork City LCDC in January 2019.

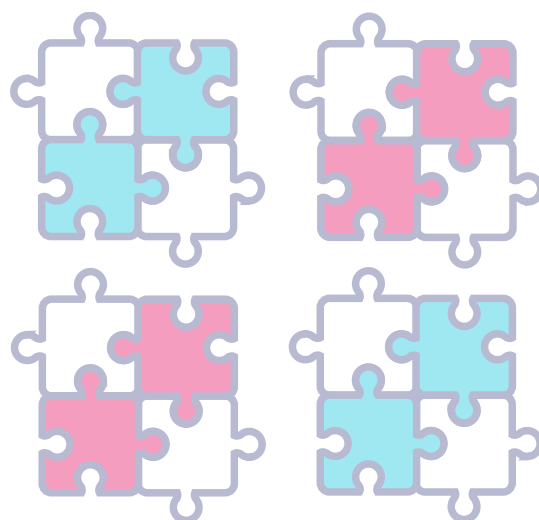
Sex Workers Alliance Ireland (SWAI)

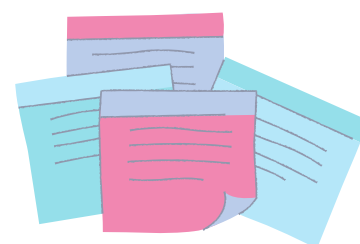
