From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes.

John 3:8a

The past couple of weeks I've thought a lot about wind – how powerful it is; how it seemingly comes from nowhere; how it can be a calm breeze one minute, then a howling uncontrollable force the next.

Wind can work itself into a frenzy that wreaks havoc and destruction and changes lives in a blink of an eye, leaving a swath of flattened homes, tossed cars, peeled roofs, snapped trees, and the scary reality that nothing will ever look or feel or be the same ever again.

As I go through our neighbourhood looking at piles of rubble and debris, seeing exposed foundations instead of sturdy houses, blue tarps still nailed in place of shingles, open areas where woods and clusters of trees once stood, I consider the wind of the EF3 tornado that decided to set down in our neighbourhood, on our street, and its lasting presence.*

The words of Christina Rossetti's poem are in my mind's ear, too, standing alongside the passage above –

Who has seen the wind?

Neither I nor you:

But when the leaves hang trembling,

The wind is passing through.

Who has seen the wind?

Neither you nor I:

But when the trees bow down their heads,

The wind is passing by.

Wind is unseen; only recognized by its effects. Which is probably why in this time of facing wind and the ferocity it can bring, the words of Jesus are comfort and reassurance and promise. His Wind is the Holy Spirit, who comes and goes without chaos or restraint. The Holy Spirit who brings peace into turmoil, wholeness into brokenness, hope into despair, healing into wounds, fullness into emptiness, life into death, love into numbness.

Who has seen this Wind? I believe I have – in the voices of strangers asking "how can I be helpful?"; in the generosity of a community sharing time and energy and money; in DOT work crews clearing massive trunks and limbs from the road; in hands carefully gathering what once was a person's home, doing so with reverence and making sure to keep it separated from trash heaps; in trailers from the Red Cross and Baptist Mission and

UMC and Mennonite disaster assistance ministries; in words of encouragement and smiles and even laughter shared among our neighbours; in the amazing quality of hope and unity that still endures.

This is the Wind of the holy presence of Jesus that is stronger than any threats or challenges or storms, even an EF3 tornado that decided to touch down in our small community. Jesus was there on that afternoon. Jesus is still here. Jesus will always enter – because Jesus comes and goes wherever He chooses. And where He chooses to be is with all His beloved always and forever.

Thank you for your partnership in ministry.

You continue in my prayers.

*On Wednesday, July 19, 2023, an EF3 tornado passed through Rocky Mount, North Carolina. The most concentrated destruction was in Dortches, a small town outside Rocky Mount. Many houses were completely destroyed; many had significant damage; there was other property damage such as cars and out buildings. Pfizer, the largest employer in the Rocky Mount area, had major damage to the loading/shipping dock part of the plant. With all this loss, there were only a few people who sustained injuries, none life-threatening, and all have been released from hospital. Bob and I live in Dortches. Our home was not damaged, but four of our neighbours had their homes leveled; many lost at least part of their roofs; many had other damage to their homes and property.

Property

- Estimates for repairs to the leak in the church roof and the deteriorating wood around the stained-glass windows were recently solicited. As a result, at the June

- 11 Trinity council meeting a motion was approved to begin a capital campaign for repairs to the roof over the north entrance to the Memorial Garden and the area below the stained-glass windows facing Winstead Avenue, for an estimated cost of \$7,500.00. The capital campaign will be conducted through designated offerings during the five Sundays in July.
- All of the fire extinguishers throughout the church and the storage buildings have been inspected and recharged by BFPE International Fire, Safety and Security Company. This inspection is an annual requirement to satisfy fire safety standards.
- Plans for mounting a bulletin board on the wall between the library and Sanctuary doors are underway. The board will hold special event and general information, ministers' list, calendar, and birthdays.
