

Tell the Easter story as you make these cookies!

NGREDIENTS

chips)

1 cup whole pecans (or chocolate 1 zip top plastic bag 1 teaspoon vinegar 3 egg whites 1 pinch salt

1 cup sugar

SUPPLIES 1 wooden spoon scotch tape Bible

Each ingredient represents part of the Easter story. Read the corresponding Bible verses as you add the ingredients.

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 300F (don't skip this step).
- 2. Place pecans (or chocolate chips)in zip top bag, and let children beat them with the wooden spoon. The Roman soldiers arrested and beat Jesus. Read John 19:1-3.
- 3. Let each child smell the vinegar, then put 1 teaspoon vinegar into a mixing bowl. The soldiers gave Jesus vinegar to drink when he was thirsty on the cross. Read John 19:28-30.
- 4. Add egg whites to vinegar. Eggs represent life. Jesus gave His life to give **us** life. Read John 10:10-11.
 - 5. Sprinkle a little salt into each child's hand. Let each child taste it, then put the rest into the mixing bowl. Jesus' followers had salty tears. Read Luke 23:27.
 - 6. Add 1 cup sugar.

The sweetest part of the story is that Jesus died because He loves us! He wants us to know and belong to Him. Read Psalm 34:8 and John 3:16.

- 7. Beat on high speed for 12 -15 minutes until stiff peaks form. The color white represents the purity in God's eyes for those whose sins have been cleansed by Jesus. Read Isaiah 1:18 and John 3:1-3.
- 8. Fold in broken nuts. Drop by teaspoon onto a cookie sheet covered with waxed paper. Each mound represents the rocky tomb where Jesus' body was laid. Read Matthew 27:57-60.
- 9. Put the cookie sheet in the oven; close the door, and turn the oven OFF. Give each child a piece of tape, and seal the oven door.

Jesus' tomb was sealed. Read Matthew 27:65-66.

- 10. GO TO BED! Your child may feel sad to leave the cookies in the oven overnight. Jesus' followers were in despair when the tomb was sealed. Read John 16:20&22.
- 11. On Easter morning, open the oven and give everyone a cookie. Notice the cracked surface and take a bite. The cookies are hollow! On the first Easter, Jesus' followers were amazed to find the tomb open and empty! Read Matthew 28:1-9.
