

HISTORY OF BEYOND DREAMING

The Beyond HB 1079 Committee was formed that year in 2012 and on March 29rd, 2012 the 1st annual Beyond HB 1079 Conference was held at the University of Washington Seattle. In 2013, the 2nd annual Beyond HB 1079 Conference was held at the University of Washington Bothell on March 30th, 2013. It was also the year that the first Beyond Dreaming Scholarship List for Undocumented Students was released as a project from Seattle's undocumented student Alejandra Pérez, from the University of Washington Bothell, as she saw the need to have a centralized list for students in Washington State to go to when seeking scholarships to fund their education. USING THIS SCHOLARSHIP GUIDE

The Beyond Dreaming Scholarship Handbook has the following resources:

The scholarships organized by deadline from January to December. The only way to have a shot at winning scholarships is to apply for scholarships. You'll hear it time and time again - apply early, and apply often.

Here are some tips to apply for scholarships:

1. Identify the right scholarships for you and check the requirements of the scholarship application. Make sure you qualify. If the deadline is from last year, please go on the website to see the new deadline.
2. Identify resources to help review your application. Most applications will ask for a combination of the following.
 - **Scholarship essay and/or Personal statement** - Always adapt your essay and personal statement to make sure you are answering what the application asks you and be prepared to find at least two people who can help you with reviewing the essays and personal statements.
 - **Letters of recommendation** - Ask someone who knows you well at least two weeks in advance and follow-up. They should know your academic work and be aware of your commitments outside of school. We recommend that you always provide the person who will write your letter of recommendation a copy of your resume and transcript and any draft essays you have for the scholarship. The more information you give them, the better prepared they will be to write a great letter on your behalf!
 - **Transcript**- Ask your counselor for an official transcript to submit with your application. If there has been a significant hardship that affected your transcript include a brief statement.

3. Plan ahead. Look ahead about three months for deadlines and update/confirm deadlines to ensure you apply in time. If a deadline or other important information is not posted, contact the organization and ask for missing information:

4. Save everything. Complete application requirements and save all of your written work on your computer.

5. Revise. Revise. Revise! Review your essays, statements, and all written work before submitting. Always ask someone to read your application one more time before the final submission.

Resources for Undocumented Students in Washington State

HOUSE BILL 1079 IN-STATE TUITION

What is HB 1079?

House Bill 1079 was signed by Governor Gary Locke on May 7, 2003. HB-1079 allows eligible undocumented students to pay in-state tuition at state colleges and universities starting July 1, 2003. Under Washington state law, students who are not U.S. citizens or permanent residents may qualify for in-state tuition if they meet certain guidelines.

Who is eligible for HB 1079?

Students may be eligible to pay in-state tuition rates if they meet all of the following three criteria:

- ✓ Received a diploma from a Washington high school or the equivalent of a diploma in Washington State.
- ✓ Lived in Washington for at least three calendar years (not school years) prior to receiving their diploma or its equivalent.
- ✓ Continuously resided in Washington since receiving the high school diploma or its equivalent.

After applying to the college or university of your choice, submit the Washington Higher Education Residency Affidavit to the admissions office. The affidavit is a confidential statement verifying that the student qualifies to pay resident tuition.

Washington Higher Education Residency Affidavit/Declaration/Certification

A Washington law determines whether students can be considered residents of Washington eligible to pay in-state resident tuition rates at public institutions (RCW 28B.15.012). This law was revised in 2003 to allow certain students attending public colleges and universities to be eligible for resident student tuition rates. In 2014, the state's financial aid law was amended so these students are eligible to be considered for need-based state aid (State Need Grant) if they are attending either public or participating private colleges in Washington (RCW 28B.92.101). For information on eligibility and the application process for State Need Grant, please visit www.readysetgrad.org/waafa.

To qualify for resident tuition status and/or State Need Grant eligibility, students must complete this affidavit/declaration/certification if they have met the following conditions:

1. Completed the full senior year of high school and obtained a high school diploma at a Washington public or private high school or received the equivalent of a diploma;
2. Lived in Washington for at least three calendar years (36 months) immediately prior to receiving the diploma or its equivalent;
3. Continuously lived in the state of Washington after receiving the diploma or its equivalent and until such time as the student is admitted to an institution of higher education.

WASHINGTON APPLICATION FOR STATE FINANCIAL AID (WASFA)

What is WASFA?

On February 26th, 2014 the Senate Bill 6523 was signed into law allowing eligible undocumented students to receive state financial aid to pursue their higher education degree. In order to apply to the Washington Application for State Financial Aid (WASFA), to be considered for state financial aid, you must be eligible for under HB 1079 or DACA category:

Do I qualify?

HB 1079 Eligibility:

- ✓ Graduated from a Washington State high school, or have obtained a GED
- ✓ Lived in Washington for three years prior to, and continuously since earning a high school diploma or the equivalent

Note: you do not need to have been granted DACA to qualify for HB 1079

DACA Eligibility:


- ✓ Have been granted Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA)
- ✓ Have established residency in Washington State for at least one year prior to attending a higher education institution

WASHINGTON APPLICATION FOR STATE FINANCIAL AID (WASFA)

IMPORTANT:

- WASFA opens every October 1st. Awards are given on a first-come-first-serve basis.
- The WASFA is **FREE** and you do not have to pay to fill out your application.
- Make sure to save both your username and password, as you will need that information to fill out the WASFA every year.
- Submit your WASFA application by your college's financial aid priority deadline.
- There isn't an age limit to fill out the WASFA.

DEFERRED ACTION FOR CHILDHOOD ARRIVALS (DACA)

Updates on DACA:

After the resending of DACA on September 5, 2017, federal courts ordered USCIS to resume accepting requests to renew a grant of deferred action. Until further notice, DACA policy will operate on the following terms in place before it was rescinded.

- No first time application will be accepted
- If your DACA expired on or after Sept. 5, 2016 or will expire in the next 150 days you may fill to renew.
 - If your DACA expired more than 150 days from now you may still file, you should consult with an attorney about the advantages and disadvantages of doing so.
- If you had previously DACA but it expired before September 2016 you cannot file a renewal - but you can file a new initial DACA request.
- Advance parole to travel abroad remains unavailable.

On November 12th, 2019, the Supreme Court of the United States (SCOTUS) heard oral arguments related to the termination of the DACA program. As of today, due to the uncertainty of SCOTUS decision on DACA it is important to be aware of the following;

- If your DACA expires in the next year, we strongly encourage you to submit your renewal application as soon as possible!
- You are eligible to renew if you have DACA now or have had DACA in the past.

As of today, SCOTUS can come to a decision as early January 2020 or like to the end of June 2020, please remain aware that the exact timing is difficult to predict. The following potential outcomes of the litigation were developed by the National Immigration Law Center.
