LOCKED UP IN NORTH CAROLINA? _ KNOW YOUR VOTING RIGHTS!



- 1. You are at least 16 years old AND
- 2. You are a U.S. citizen AND
- 3. You are **not currently serving a felony sentence or are on probation or parole** for a felony conviction.

Registering to vote and voting while serving a felony sentence is a felony.

SERVING A FELONY SENTENCE?

- When you complete your time, including probation and parole, you are eligible to vote in North Carolina!
- You will need to re-register once you complete all the terms of your sentence.

YOU CAN <u>VOTE</u> IF YOU ARE AWAITING TRIAL OR SERVING A MISDEMEANOR

You do not lose your right to vote for a misdemeanor or if charged with but not convicted of a felony.

- You must be registered to vote and be at least 18 years old by or on Election Day to vote.
- You can register at your address outside of jail OR you can use the jail as your address. You must use a physical address as your residency on the registration form.
- You can request an absentee ballot to vote from jail.
- Fill out ballot and mail by Election Day to make it count!

DON'T KNOW WHEN YOU WILL BE RELEASED?

• Request an absentee ballot so YOU CAN VOTE no matter what! Turn in absentee ballot requests no later than one week before primary or election days.

RELEASED BEFORE ELECTION DAY?

- If you requested an absentee ballot but did not vote, you can vote in-person during Early Voting or on Election Day.

- If you need to register, go vote EARLY! You can register AND vote at the same time during Early Voting.

2019 IMPORTANT DATES

Election dates vary by city/town

- Register by August 16 for September 10 election
- Register by September 13 for October 8 election
- Register by October 11 for November 5 election

2020 IMPORTANT DATES

Primary Day is March 3

Election Day is November 3

- Register by February 7 for March 3 Primary Day
- Register by October 9 for November 3 Election Day

Primary elections decide the candidates for the Election Day ballot. Unaffiliated voters can choose which party's ballot they want to vote.
