White Rabbit

Barnes is known for its sense of community so we are introducing a new regular feature where we will speak to notable Barnes residents to find out a little more about them and what they enjoy about living here.

With Easter almost upon us, it seemed appropriate to start off with the one and only Barnes White Rabbit! White Rabbit has been hopping and cycling through Barnes since 2011 but we didn't realise how instrumental BCA was in his development! Rabbit fans, who are based all over the world - can spot him sitting on the wall by Barnes Bridge on the first day of every month from 7am to 8am. We took along a few carrots and went to find out more about Barnes White Rabbit from his alter ego Stevie, aka Spike McLarrity.

Prospect What are the origins of the Barnes White Rabbit?

BWR "As a BCA volunteer I used to be involved with the friends of Barnes, supporting artists from Le Pecq, to show artwork in Barnes alongside local artists. Le Pecq is a small town



outside Paris that is still twinned with Barnes. One summer, I was asked by the Chair of Friends of Barnes to join their Mad Hatter's Tea Party (pictured above) as the White Rabbit. The day before my university graduation, I happened to pass by Angel's fancy dress shop and found the perfect rabbit outfit, so the deal was done, and I travelled to Le Pecq as soon as my graduation was over! As a performance artist I seized on the opportunity to take White Rabbit to Paris and was delighted by the positive and joyous reception I received - and to this day I continue to receive from people wherever I go."

Prospect Ah! So the BCA is behind the origins of Barnes White Rabbit...?

BWR "Yes, definitely! After the Mad Hatter's Tea Party, I became part of BCA's Duck Race at Easter each year and even though that event is not taking place this year, I plan to continue with the tradition of handing out Easter eggs - kindly provided by BCA - at several venues through Barnes on Holy Saturday (30 March). I will be walking down Barnes High



Street and up Church Road as far as The Red Lion so please say hello!"

Prospect Is Easter a particularly busy time of year for Barnes White Rabbit then?

BWR "It certainly is! My other tradition is to participate in the Family Mass service at St Michael's All Angels Church on Easter Sunday where I also hand out chocolate eggs to the children."

Prospect We know that your fame has reached many British newspapers but is it true that White Rabbit is also well known abroad?

BWR "Yes, you can read about that in my book - see below for details. And each September I go to Odzaci, a small village in Serbia which celebrates The Day of

The Rabbit as part of International Multimedia Art Festival. The Day of the Rabbit, which started years ago, has become an increasingly popular event with local villagers which is why you won't find me by Barnes Bridge on 1 September, however you can catch me in the early hours on 1st April so please stop and say hello - carrots not necessary... though Easter Eggs welcomed!"

Barnes Town Centre Update

Both Emma and Raphael have been working hard over the last few months on local projects big and small.



Barnes Ponder 2

The highlight of the past few months has been announcing the results of the Big Barnes Ponder 2 which was held in October last year. Over 1,000 residents took part in the Ponder 2 exactly ten years after the original Ponder of 2013. This time we also consulted online and a whopping 600 residents offered their thoughts and ideas as well as in person at two events at the Castelnau Community Centre and the Barnes Green Centre. The results took weeks to collate but we are proud to announce that we have a fabulous, refreshed vision for the next ten years! This vision will be delivered by six project teams and we have been actively recruiting volunteers over the last few weeks. It's not too late to get involved so do get in touch with Emma if you would like to help shape the Barnes of the future.

One Barnes

This is about bringing our community together so that wherever you live in Barnes, whether it's by Hammersmith Bridge or in Little Chelsea, you feel well connected and well informed with access to new and creative social opportunities as well as to information about everything that is going on locally. The One Barnes projects include a digital hub platform to improve communication, a banking hub, the Men's Shed and the skate park at Vine Road.

High Street Barnes

This theme recognises the critical importance of all our shopping parades to our community and is about working with local businesses to ensure they thrive by supporting the introduction of a digital high street to Barnes, re-visiting a weekly spend campaign and supporting improvements to the look and feel of our parades.

Green Barnes

This is about ensuring that we maximise green spaces across our community taking every opportunity to repurpose space that is not being properly used to support our community's environmental needs. It is also about ensuring that we are a community that leads the way in sustainability. Projects will include exploring the concept of the green village, supporting Barnes Common with their flood resilience project, Plasticfree Barnes and greener streets, as well as work on the new rain gardens and front gardens maintenance.

Placemaking Barnes

This theme is about improvements to the public space in Barnes capturing ideas to maximise space and to improve the look and feel of our village including a graffiti wall at Barnes Station, improvements to Small Profit Dock and the green walkway project at Barnes Bridge, The View.

Travel Barnes

This theme is all about how we move around as a pedestrian, a cyclist or a user of public transport and the services that are provided to help us get about. Projects include improving crossing outside Essex House and on Station and Mill Hill roads, improving cycle routes and our towpath, providing a rickshaw service over Hammersmith Bridge and addressing the Howsman bus loop challenges.

Safe Barnes

Safety and security was a common theme from the Ponder and this group will explore what more can be done to ensure residents feel safe in their homes and when out in our community including initiatives to improve awareness of how we can protect ourselves and our premises, improving safety perception on the route to Barnes Station and delivering a safe haven approach across the village.

New businesses come to Barnes

As ever, Barnes continues to be a sought-after destination for new businesses and we have been delighted to welcome some new offerings in recent weeks. The Ouarter Kitchen restaurant has opened at the former Grill Bar site on the Castelnau Parade by Hammersmith Bridge offering fabulous Mediterranean cuisine. On White Hart Lane we are soon to welcome a new deli, coffee shop and wine bar called Harty's at the long-empty China Chef site. Also on White Hart Lane, the Indian restaurant Chakra has closed and rumour has it is soon to be replaced by an Italian restaurant!



BCA rickshaw service update

Over the past few months, we've been working with our MP Sarah Olney to introduce a new licensed, regulated pedicab service on Hammersmith Bridge when the stabilisation works are complete. The concept has already received support from the Mayor's office and both Richmond and Hammersmith and Fulham Councils. We hope this work will open up some funding opportunities which will enable us to re-introduce this vital service to help our most vulnerable residents to cross the bridge.





Hammersmith Bridge Closure

While the Hammersmith Bridge SOS campaign group has been less active in recent months, we are still working together as one group. Letters were sent recently to the leaders of both Richmond and Hammersmith and Fulham Councils, asking them to support short-term measures to alleviate the issues that concern the community. On security, following a number of incidents of drug dealing and muggings, we want more to be done to keep walkers safe, especially at night time. We also asked for the approach to the bridge on both sides to be made less cluttered with unused construction equipment, unnecessary traffic cones and signage. We are also pushing for a solution for the less able in our community in the form of light public transport provision as some residents simply cannot afford to wait 5 more years for the political stalemate to be resolved.



Choco-frolics

Keen to celebrate Easter but want to branch out from chocolate eggs? These local businesses offer a bevy of ways to satisfy your inner chocoholic.



If you're looking to drink your chocolate, look no further than Orange Pekoe. Yes, they are renowned for their stunning collection of loose-leaf teas but did you know they also offer a decadent hot chocolate? Using the finest Rococo's chocolatier signature 65% single origin Colombian dark chocolate flakes and enjoyed with your choice of milk, it is truly a luxurious chocolate treat!



If you need a speciality chocolate - perhaps organic, paleo or dairy-free - **Dahlia** on Castelnau should be your destination. A huge display of all types of chocolatey treats greets you at the door - all you need to do is choose!



Perhaps savoury and sweet is more your thing? In which case, head to **Base Face** and order their dough sticks and Nutella dessert for a decadent but substantial end to your meal.



And who knew that you could follow fish & chips at Rick Stein with a mouth-watering selection of Rick Stein chocolate, complete with tasting notes from Rick?! The collection is handmade in Cornwall using the finest single origin cacao sourced from Ecuador and Mexico, and comes in six sophisticated flavours - my faves are Rose or Gin & Tonic.

One of the stalwarts of the menu in The Brown Dog in Little Chelsea is the dark chocolate cremaux - an indulgent play on a Rolo dessert pot and a fruit and nut bar, this pud's molten salted caramel centre is light enough just to melt in the mouth. A newcomer onto the spring menu is a play on an English trifle and a Milky Bar pot: think Yorkshire spring rhubarb compote, amaretti fingers, doused in a little pink rhubarb gin, topped with a creamy white chocolate ganache rather than custard and elderflower-scented cream rather than the whipped cream from a can of yesteryear!

Secret Barnes

Even if you are a long-time resident of Barnes, you might not be aware of the following local history facts. Let us know if you have other points of interest to share.

It is claimed that Barnes Old Cemetery is haunted by a ghostly nun that would hover over the grave of Julia Martha Thomas, the victim of the "Barnes Mystery"

or the "Richmond Murder". This infamous Victorian crime involved a murder by her maid, a lady called Kate Webster (right). The

(right). The intrigue came from the way Kate Webster disposed of the body: it was dismembered, the flesh boiled from its bones and the remains thrown into the Thames!

Ebenezer Cobb Morley (regarded as the father of the Football Association) is another well-known individual also buried in the cemetery.

Near this place lie the remains of JOHN DEE MA
CLERK IN HOLY ORDERS
1527 - 1609
Astronomer. Geographer
Mathematician
Adviser to Queen Elizabeth I

If you wander through Mortlake, you may come across a plaque by St Mary's Church on a wall separating the churchyard from the modern flats, which mentions John Dee. John Dee was an adviser of Queen Elizabeth on all astrological and scientific matters and was consulted over the best day to

hold the new queen's coronation. His house was then home to one of the largest libraries in Europe. After John's death, the house was adapted by Sir Francis Crane for the Royal Tapestry Works and then, early in the 19th century, it was used as a girls' school.



Venture into the woods beyond Barn Elms and you may come across Barnie. Not a person, but a tree, Barnie is one of the largest Plane trees in London and is thought to have been planted in the mid-18th century by Sir Henry Hoare when he was developing his garden - though there is a chance that Barnie may be of an even older vintage!



As you pass along Queen's Ride close to Gipsy Lane, you might spot a shrine ornately decorated with flowers, posters and writing. There is also a memorial stone and a bust of Marc Bolan, who was in glam-rock band T.Rex, and who sadly died in a car crash here in 1977. Fans still flock to the location to pay their respects.

The Barnes Trail

For more info on local places of interest, why not follow the Barnes trail? It's 2.3 miles long (with a 3-mile extension) and the route is circular so you can start at any of the silver 'Barnes Trail' discs set in the ground. As you



wander, take time to read the info on the oar-shaped plaques placed along the route. For a map, scan the QR code or pick up a leaflet from Rose House.


