What's Included:

- P. 3: 1 card recording sheets
- P. 4: 3 card recording sheet

How Can I Use These Sheets?

These response sheets can be used in various ways.

- Cut page 3 in half to allow students to respond to one task card.
- Use page 4 to allow students to respond to three task cards.
- At the end of a lesson or session, have each student respond to task cards and record their responses as an "exit ticket." This can also be done to gauge understanding at the beginning of a lesson.
- Students can respond to task cards and then discuss their responses with the class or a partner.

What Are Task Cards?

 Task cards are cards that each have a discussion prompt or activity on them.

Why Use Task Cards?

- Task cards are low prep.
- Task cards provide prompts for students to engage in discussion with the instructor, or other students, about a specific topic.
- Task cards provide an opportunity to check how much your students understand about a specific topic. This can be done before or after a lesson.

How Do I Get Access To Task Cards?

- There are multiple ways to get or make task cards. To make task cards, you can write questions or prompts on notecards, post-it notes, or pieces of paper.
