
Let us all rejoice in the Lord and celebrate a feast day in honor of Benedict the abbot, at whose solemnity the angels rejoice as they praise the Son of God.


### **GREETING**



## PRESENTATION OF THOSE PROFESSING VOWS (stand)

### THE CALL



# ACCEPTANCE BY THE COMMUNITY (stand)

The Abbot expresses the community's acceptance of those making profession.

The monastic community responds: WE ACCEPT HIM/THEM.

WE WELCOME HIM/THEM.

THANKS BE TO GOD! (applause)

# THE PROMISES (sit)


Those making profession respond to the Abbot's questions.

# THE PROFESSION OF VOWS (sit)


Each professes vows and signs his petition on the altar.

# **SOLEMN SUPPLICATION: "SUSCIPE"** (stand)

Three times the newly professed sing "Sustain me..." All repeat it each time.



Then all bow and sing the doxology:



## **SILENT PRAYER AND LITANY** (kneel)

*The newly professed lie prostrate on the floor.* 



May *he* live by faith.

May *he* be untiring in prayer.

May he be filled with wisdom and understanding.

May *he* always be humble and meek.

May *he* be firmly grounded in peace.

# SIGNS OF FIRST PROFESSION (sit)

The Rule of Benedict and the Saint John's cross are given to the newly professed. They receive a sign of peace from the Abbot.

# SOLEMN PRAYER FOR THOSE WHO HAVE MADE FINAL VOWS (stand)

## CLOTHING OF THE SOLEMNLY PROFESSED WITH THE CUCULLA (sit)

Caris datur piae menti, Corde sonet in ardenti, Quidquid foris promitur.

Hunc per callem orientis Admiremur ascendentis Patriarchæ speciem.

Corvum cernis ministrantem, Hinc Eliam latitantem Specu nosce parvulo.

Elisæus dignoscatur, Cum securis revocatur De torrentis alveo.

Illum Joseph candor morum, Illum Jacob futurorum Mens effecit conscia.

Ipse memor suæ gentis, Nos perducat in manentis, Semper Christi gaudia. Today the joyful day of our leader is commemorated; this day brings the gifts of new light.

Grace is given to the loving soul; may what is expressed with the lips echo in ardent hearts.

Let us admire the splendor of Benedict the patriarch ascending the path to heaven.

His innumerable posterity, image of the sun, made him to be like Abraham.

See the crow serving him, and thus recognize Elijah when he hides in a little cave.

Recognize Elisha when he calls back the axe from the water depths.

The mind associates him with Joseph, pure in life, and Jacob, prophet of coming things.

May he be mindful of his people; may he lead us to joys of Christ which last forever.






### **EUCHARISTIC PRAYER**






Following ancient monastic tradition, all remain standing for the entire Eucharistic Prayer.




### **GREAT AMEN**






Celebrant: Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil,
