## HIGHLIGHTS

- Conducted 3 meet and learn sessions for 24 new students on international education opportunities around the globe.
- Launched our partnership with the Second Chance Program. The Program provides a second chance opportunity for a student to join university.
- We secured Financial Aid opportunities for students.
- Recruited 4 new staff to join the Ushindi Education Initiative team.

- We participated in 5 International virtual workshops on Financial Aid opportunities with Flame University, Midway University, Boise State University, Swarthmore University, and Japan University Consortium.
- We conducted a staff capacity building facilitated by our board members; Pamela Kelly Wetzell (United World College of South East Asia) and Mala Swaminathan (Pathways College Consulting). The capacity building focused on re-tooling our team on how best to support students.

- Limited IT equipment to facilitate virtual engagements

### 2021 F0CUS

- Build partnerships and support students at 20 secondary schools; broadly reach 1,000 students.
- Fundraise \$40,000 to equip the student career Hub with more technology and other support systems for HALI students.
- Build collaborations with 10 international Universities, colleges, and sponsorship agents to support High achievers but Low income students.
