## **A Gospel Focus Transforms Difficult Circumstances**

#### Paul's imprisonment...

1. ... opened a whole new ministry field.

**Phil. 1:12** I want you to know, brothers, that what has happened to me has really served to advance the gospel,

## Extra Assignment: What Did Paul's Prayer Requests Look Like?

Read Acts 27-28. Make a list tallying "moments of providence" that secured the angel's promise (27:24). How did Paul's experiences help develop his attitude conveyed in Philippians 1:12-18? How does this bolster your own confidence regarding God's will for your life to partner in advancing the gospel?

- 2. ... exposed unbelievers to the reality of his relationship with Jesus.
  - **Phil. 1:13** so that it has become known throughout the whole imperial guard and to all the rest that my imprisonment is for Christ.
- 3. ...strengthened believers to proclaim the gospel boldly.
  - **Phil. 1:14** And most of the brothers, having become confident in the Lord by my imprisonment, are much more bold to speak the word without fear.
- 4. ... stimulated increased proclamation of the gospel (even from those with selfish motives).
  - **Phil. 1:15** Some indeed preach Christ from envy and rivalry, but others from good will. **16** The latter do it out of love, knowing that I am put here for the defense of the gospel. **17** The former proclaim Christ out of selfish ambition, not sincerely but thinking to afflict me in my imprisonment.

#### A Gospel Focus Produces Joy in All Circumstances

**Phil. 1:18** What then? Only that in every way, whether in pretense or in truth, Christ is proclaimed, and in that I rejoice. Yes, and I will rejoice...

## Remember: The Gospel Was Forged Through An Extremely "Difficult Circumstance"

**1Pet. 2:21** For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you might follow in his steps. **22** He committed no sin, neither was deceit found in his mouth. **23** When he was reviled, he did not revile in return; when he suffered, he did not threaten, but continued entrusting himself to him who judges justly.
