MEET A KNIGHT



Richard C. "Dick" Zani

Brother Knight, Richard C. "Dick" Zani (pronounced Zah-ni), was born at the Catholic hospital in Wheeling, West Virginia, but was raised across the border in the eastern Ohio town of Bridgeport. He attended St. Anthony of Padua Catholic Elementary School in Bridgeport and the all boys Wheeling Central Catholic High School. He attended college at Ohio State University in Columbus, Ohio for two years, and then was drafted into the U.S. Army in January 1954. He trained at Fort Knox for six months, then spent 18 months in Germany. Brother Dick thought he was going to be assigned to an armored battalion, but because he could type, the Army sent him to quartermaster school and made him a Personnel Specialist. After his Army service, he came back to the States and worked at the Ohio State Highway Testing Lab. Using the G.I. Bill, he attended college part time while working and graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in Wildlife Management in June 1960. In September 1960, he

was hired by the National Park Service as a Park Ranger and his first assignment was at the Roosevelt (Home)/Vanderbilt (Mansion) National Historic Site in Hyde Park, New York. After two years there, he transferred to the Virgin Islands National Park. Four years later, he transferred to Great Smoky Mountain National Park and stayed until he moved to Florida in 1984 and worked at the Gulf Islands National Seashore. He retired from the National Park Service in 2011, after 51 years of service! He and his wife of 57 years, Patricia, bought a house seven miles east of Gulf Breeze in 1984 when he transferred to Gulf Islands. Their two children were fortunate to be raised in the Smokies during their formative years. His wife spent the summer of 1984 working as a seasonal Ranger in the Smokies before coming to Florida later that year. Brother Dick attended Mass at the Holiday Inn on Pensacola Beach until the house was ready to move into and then attended Mass at the old St. Sylvester Church in Tiger Point, with pastor, Fr. Bob Morris. Brother Dick joined St. Sylvester Knights of Columbus Council 13277 in September 2010. He is a "Sir Knight" of Assembly 2835. He has been an usher at Mass since 1985. One Sunday, he and a fellow usher decided to trade name tags to see if anyone would notice. Just when he thought no one had noticed, an elderly woman came up to him and said, "You're not Bob!" His favorite hobby is "birding", something he has enjoyed since taking an Ornithology class at college in 1958. Brother Dick is still going strong at age 90, serving his God, Church and the KOC.


