From the Executive Director



It is a special moment for me, personally, to be presenting the first annual report for the Observer Research Foundation America (ORF America). ORF America's establishment is in some ways the culmination of over three years of work. In its first full year of operation, ORF America managed to incorporate itself as a Washington DC-based non-profit public policy institute, grow in size, initiate several international programs, and move into new office space—all amid a global pandemic.

There are by one count almost 400 think tanks in Washington DC. But it is still a relatively rare occasion to be inaugurating a new such institution. ORF America is – as its name suggests – American. But equally, it is defined by its partnership with ORF, one of India's leading policy institutes, with the mission of addressing challenges facing the United States, India, and their partners amid significant global upheaval. The changes that we are witnessing around the world today – geopolitical and technological, economic and environmental – define our agenda and sense of purpose.

"Why ORF America?" It's a good question. The U.S.-India partnership will be a critical one for the foreseeable future: not always without its differences and difficulties, but also with a great deal of convergence and cooperation. Ties between two of the world's three largest populations, two of the world's three largest militaries, and what may soon be two of the world's three largest economies - both of them democracies, one developed and one developing will naturally have global implications. Generating a better understanding of each other's policies is imperative. This long-term investment in an 'ideas bridge' between India and the United States on global issues is, in part, what ORF America is all about. In what are sometimes divisive times, ORF America also hopes to conduct research, convene policymakers, and build networks in the spirit of nonpartisanship, diversity, and international cooperation.

A sample of some of our ongoing efforts illustrates these

objectives and values. We intend through dialogue to engage India, the United States, and their partners in three critical geopolitical theaters: Europe, the Indo-Pacific, and the Middle East (West Asia). We plan to shape the conversation and awareness around cybersecurity and capacity in the developing world, while conducting research on how geopolitics is shaping 5G and semiconductor supply chains through new alliances. We hope to contribute to conversations on development assistance and supply chain resilience between the United States and India. And we aim to elevate cooperation between the two countries on energy and climate policy, including on air quality, energy data, and climate financing. Our growing staff offer expertise in these areas and reflect diverse perspectives.

Much of this would not be possible without our broad-based partnership with ORF and the advice, guidance, and support of our Board of Directors. ORF's signature events such as the Raisina Dialogue and CyFy offer perfect opportunities to highlight Indian and global perspectives to audiences in the United States, and bring American perspectives to the rest of the world. The first year-and-a-half of ORF America's existence proved both challenging and eventful, but it represents just the start for what should hopefully become an important contributor to global policy dialogue and research.






Convening

In 2020-2021, ORF America initiated a series of virtual and in-person events, involving every region of the globe.

- Global Cyber Policy Dialogues: five regional conversations on building cyber norms and capacity with partners in Latin America, the Western Balkans, Southeast Asia, the Middle East & North Africa, and Southern Africa.
- The USA Pavilion @ Expo 2020 Fellows Program: A fellowship program for young entrepreneurs and leaders from the Middle East, North Africa, and South Asia, that met inperson in Dubai on the sidelines of the Expo.
- In 2021, ORF America also began a series of virtual discussions around democracy in Indian foreign policy and India's integration into global value chains.
- Virtual panels were organized around ORF's signature annual events: The Raisina Dialogue,
 CyFy, and the Colaba Conversation.
- A virtual edition of the India Trilateral Forum was organized in October 2021, along with the German Marshall Fund, with participants from India, the United States, and Europe.
- On the **20th anniversary of the 9/11 terrorist attacks**, Executive Director Dhruva Jaishankar had virtual conversations with Philip Zelikow, Executive Director of the 9/11 Commission, and Michael Chertoff, former Secretary for Homeland Security.
- ORF America organized virtual discussions around:

 - Quad Cooperation on Artificial Intelligence
