# Christy Bush: Familiar

Laney Contemporary is pleased to present a selection of photographs by Christy Bush, organized by Jackson Fine Art in Atlanta. "A rebellious punk rock kid from Atlanta, Bush moved to Athens, GA in the early '90s and fell in with a well-known group of creatives and musicians." The South serves as a backdrop for the majority of Bush's work and a deep source of inspiration. Her photographs, spanning decades, traverse photographic genres with ease, serving as

a process of remembering through intimate connection with her subjects and surroundings. Bush employs a direct style of portraiture that allows her to limn her memories and explore her personal relationships and past experiences through her subject matter. In her first photographic series *Soundtrack to Nothing* (2006), Bush chronicles American adolescence via the passion-fueled relationship between teens and the alt music scene. In the following series, *Jackson*, Bush spent 8 years documenting the complex transition of a single subject from adolescence into young adulthood.

Bush's most recent series, *Familiar*, presents an introspective study of intimate relationships as it explores themes of vulnerability and empowerment through empathetic constructed portraits. The work spans 30 years of photography, including Bush's investigation of coming of age and generational unity as well as her work in fashion and celebrity portraiture. She forges intimate connections with the people she photographs with a dedicated and deferential approach, resulting in access to any subject, be it a child in the neighborhood, a barber, a supermodel, or a pop star. There is much to celebrate in this selection of work that rejects conformity, exudes reverence, and reveals a bit of the artist herself with each photograph. A monograph of this series was published by the Bitter Southerner in 2022.

Artist, musician, and longtime friend to Bush, Michael Stipe, said it best in his astute foreword for *Familiar*, describing the invitational nature of Bush's work:

"There is a simple truth evident throughout. Many of these subjects are family, people that she has gathered together and created a life with. Her documentation of that life is shown in both its rawness and in the more theatrical glamour of the staged and unstaged. It challenges us to look in different ways. It is a delight to be invited inside this life." ~ Michael Stipe

#### Bio:

Christy Bush (American, b. 1970), is an Athens, Georgia based photographer whose work has been featured regularly in top fashion magazines and across various editorial outlets. Her work has appeared most recently in Vogue, Lovewant AUS, Black Magazine NZ, Women's Wear Daily, The Guardian, and Aesthetica. Bush's photographs have been exhibited in New York, Atlanta, Paris, and Tokyo.

Christy Bush's solo exhibition, *Familiar*, opens in conjunction with Tabitha Soren's solo exhibition, *Relief*. The reception will take place on Friday, February 10th from 6 to 8pm with a food truck on premises.
