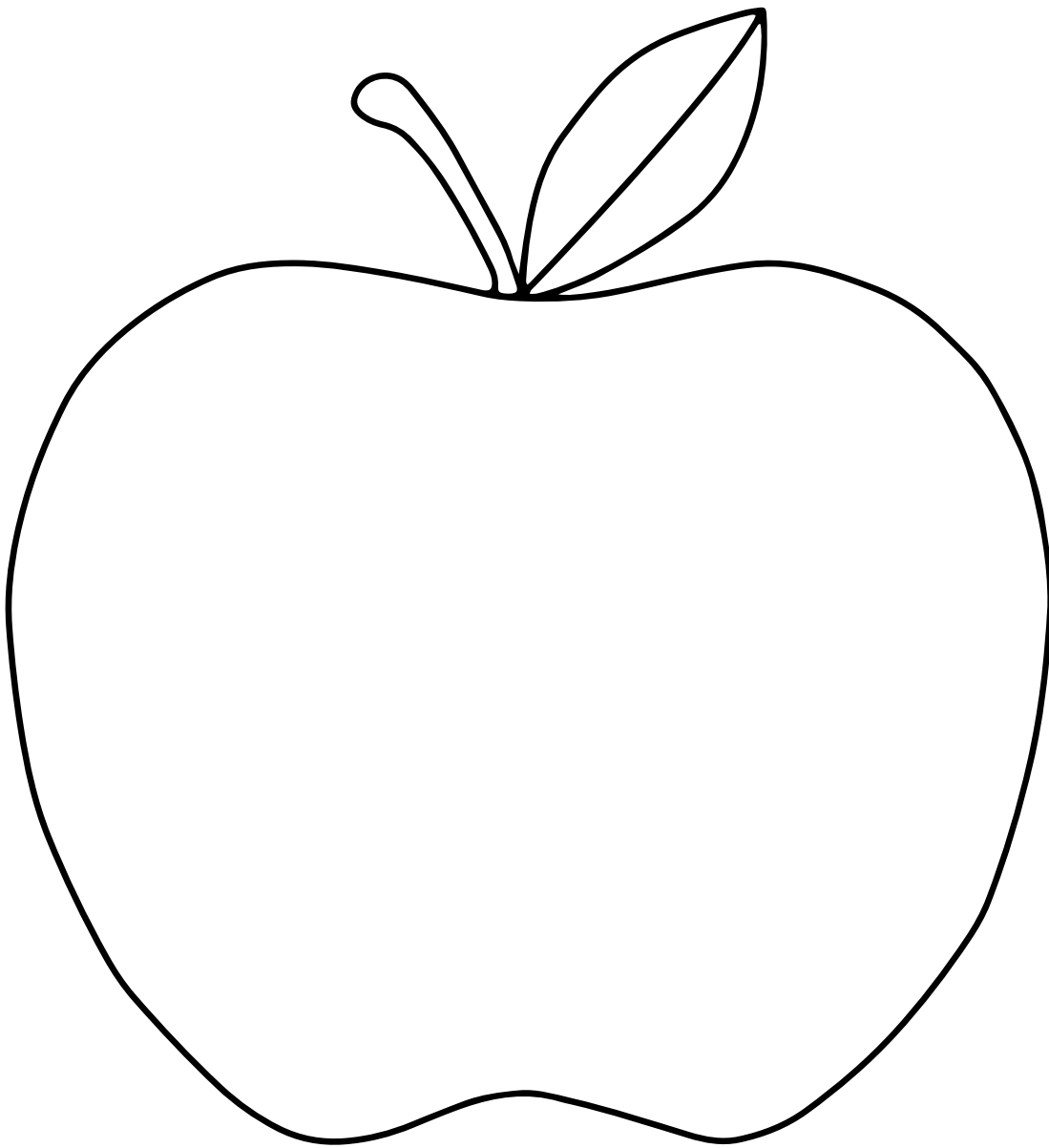

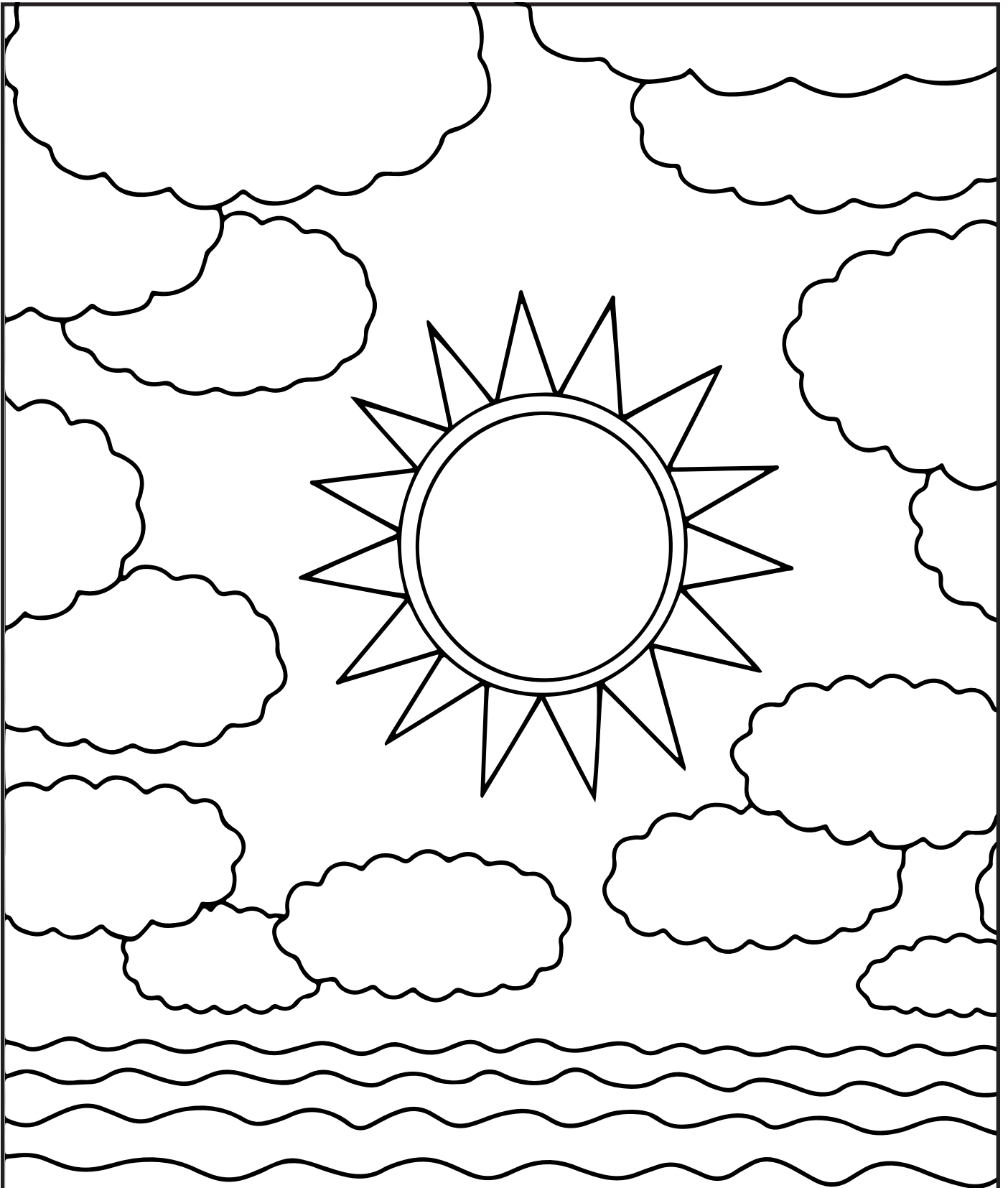
“Adam Wasn’t Into It” by John Baldessari from his Emoji Series.

“Blue and Orange Seascape” by Amy Lincoln. Feel free to match Amy or make YOUR Seascape any colors that you wish!

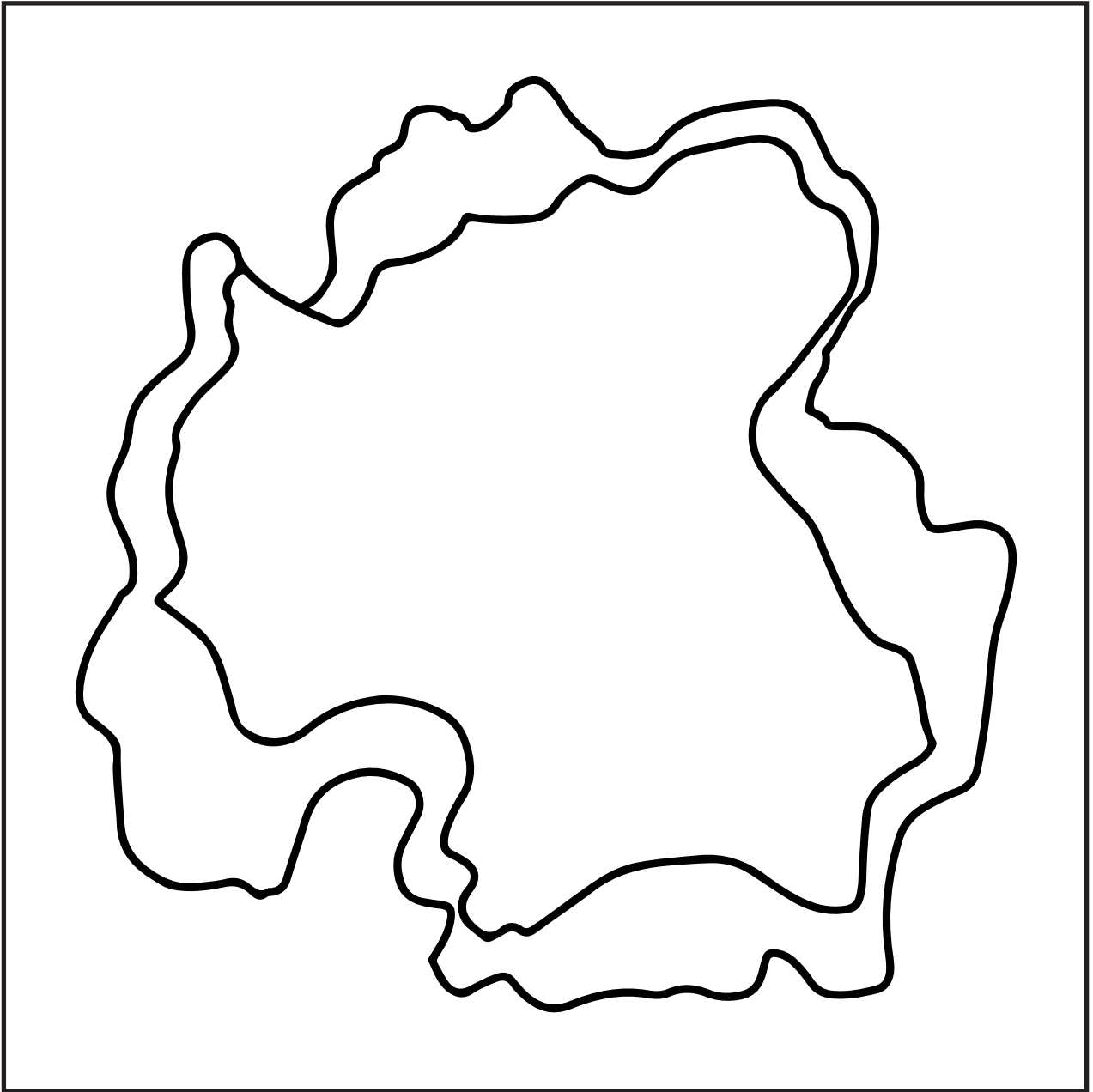

What do you see in this mirror?

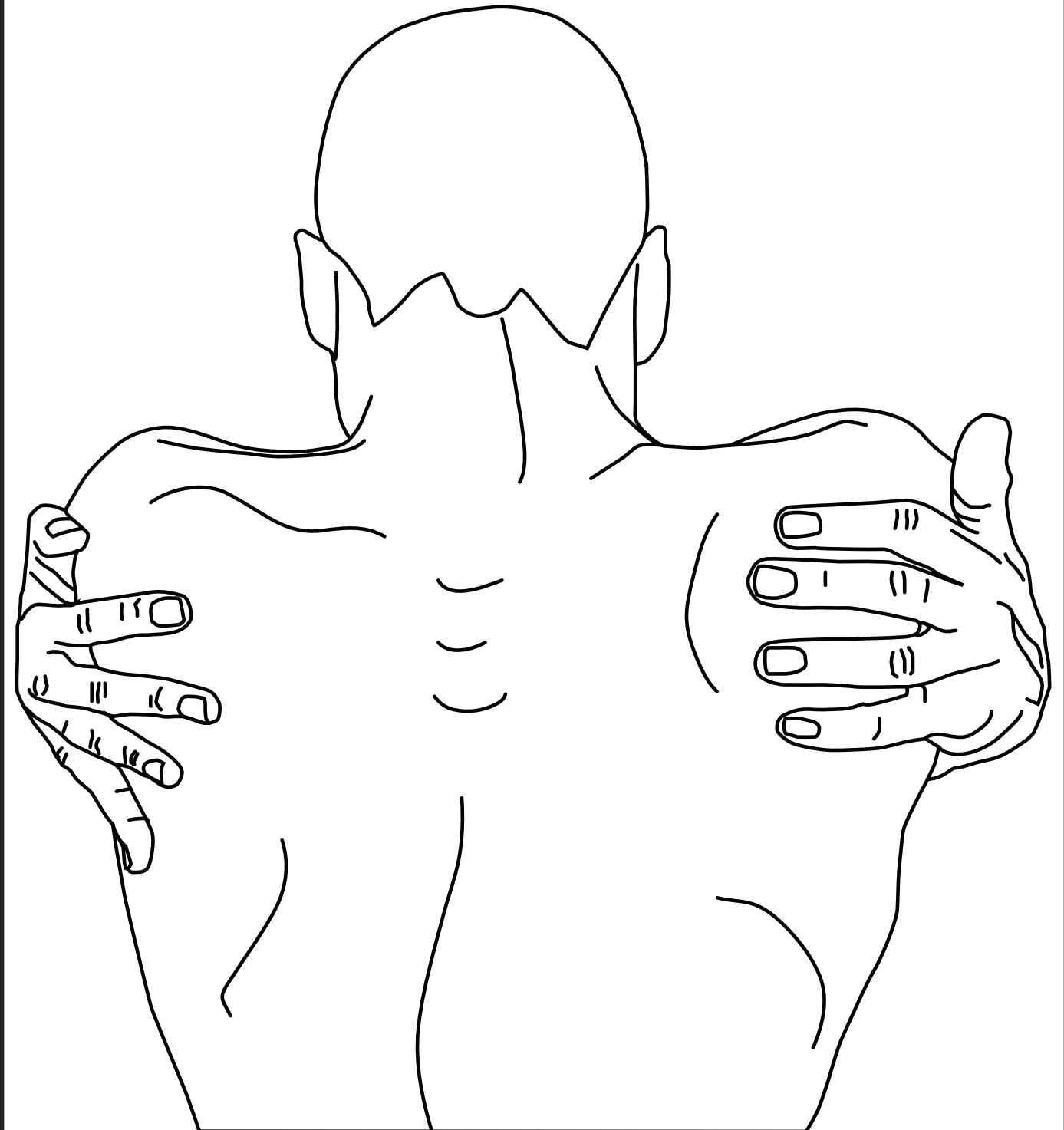


This mirror is by Snarkitecture, a New-York based collaborative design practice.

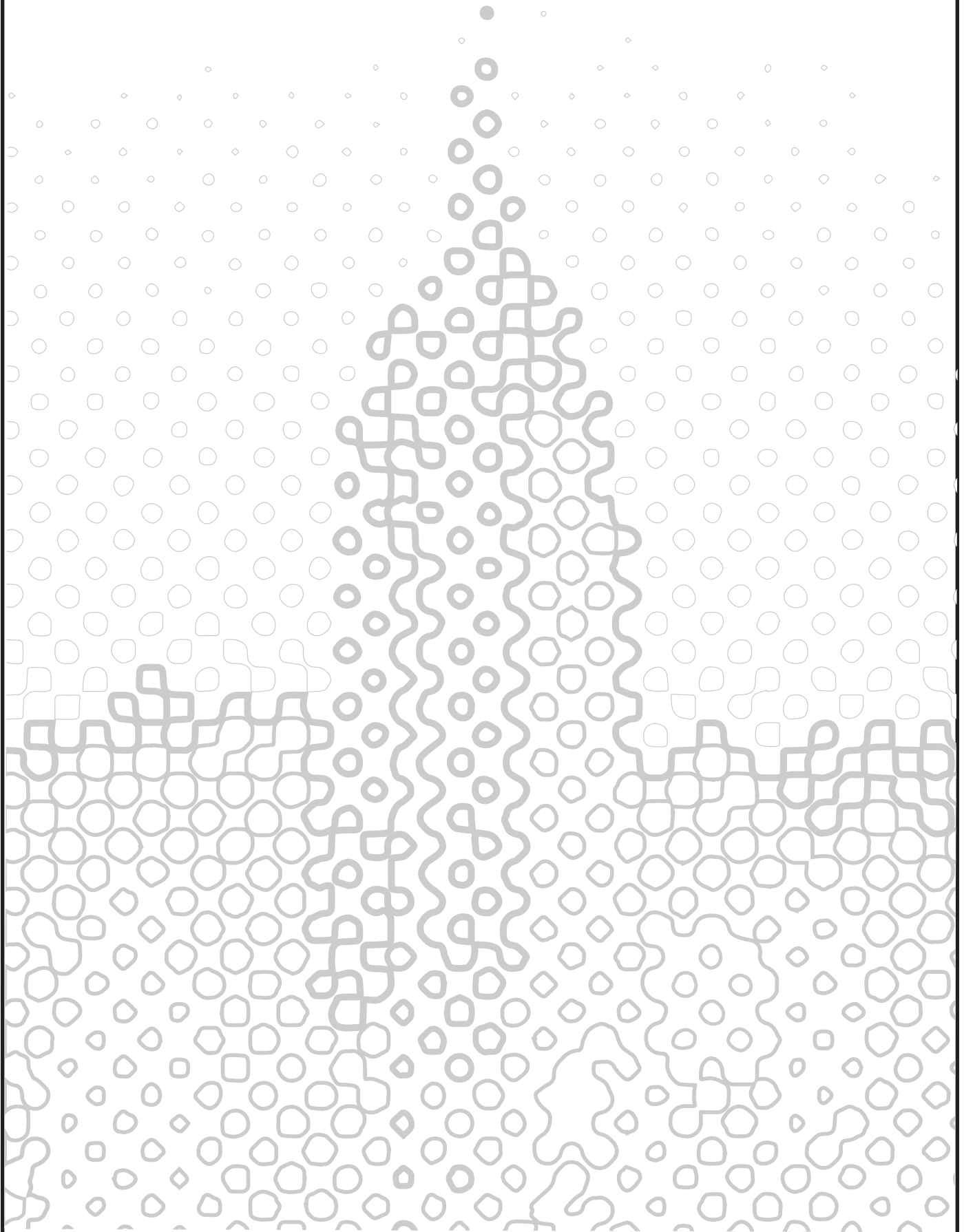
The name “Snarkitecture” is called a portmanteau: a word combining the sounds and meanings of two other words.

Can you and your family guess which two words it is made up of, and why they might have chosen this name?

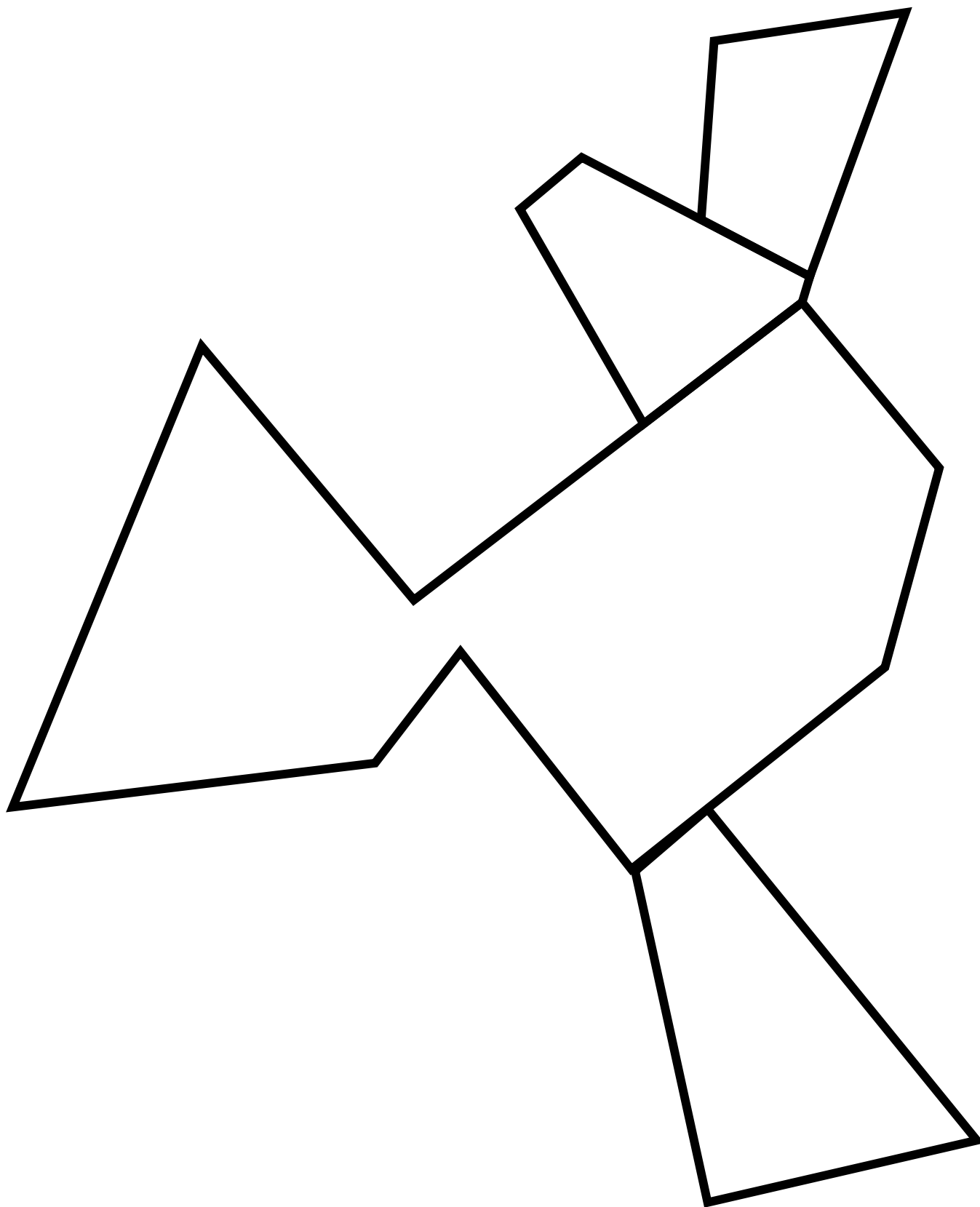
How can you use your red, yellow, green, and blue
