2. Create a group (e.g., a specific class).
3. Post a topic (e.g., a discussion prompt).
4. Invite others to join the group or topic.
5. Record videos, and watch/interact with the videos of others.

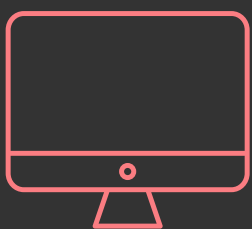
