
I wish you all a joyous and blessed Year of Jesus in 2022.

Community and Stakeholder Engagement



One of the Authority's core priorities is to reach out and engage with our Cook Islands communities. This allows us to:

- Raise awareness and understanding on SBM issues
- Be transparent about what the Authority is doing
- Create avenues for stakeholder concerns to be heard and addressed
- Ensure a collaborative approach to the development of SBM through the contributions of our Cook Islands people
- Provide accurate and science-based information
- Provide updates on current and upcoming SBM activities
- Collaborate with other government agencies on public initiatives and events
- In the long-term, contribute towards a well-informed Cook Islands public, who can then better engage on SBM issues

In 2021, the Authority met with numerous community and stakeholder groups throughout Rarotonga and our Pa Enua. These meetings involved a wide range of people from our country's leaders to our grassroots communities, delivered in both English and in Maori depending on the stakeholder group.

Overall, while we are proud of the efforts made to engage with our communities, lessons have been learned on how we can improve our consultations in 2022. Our people have shared their concerns and hopes for the SBM sector, and we have listened. We have also come away with great suggestions from our communities on how we can better develop the SBM sector for the benefit of our country.

There are still many Cook Islands communities that the Authority has not had the opportunity to meet with, and so the Authority will continue its engagement in 2022. With the issuing of three exploration licences, the Authority will also return to our communities to explain what this means for the SBM sector and the country.

What's happening in 2022

On 23 February 2022, three exploration licences were issued to CIC, CIIC Seabed Resources and Moana Minerals respectively.

The Authority has issued 2 releases on this so far:

- SBMA Release: Historic First Seabed Minerals Exploration Licences Granted
- SBMA Release: Key messages from Exploration Licence Granting ceremony

The final release will explain more about the exploration phase and what this means.

In 2022, exploration expeditions will begin, and the Cook Islands will soon learn more about its deep seabed and marine environment.
