
PPF also supports a call by 12 Presbyteries to identify ways in which they can take part in gun violence prevention.



Migration-focused entity features PC(USA) partners in Central America

The Calvinist Reformed Church of El Salvador (IRCES) has spent the last two years organizing stakeholders and leading the discernment process for forming the new network, with the support of PC(USA) mission co-worker Joseph Russ. The network is a creation born from a General Assembly resolution proposed by the Presbytery of the Pacific on behalf of the church in El Salvador, a PC(USA) partner church, and approved by the 223rd General Assembly in 2018. Aspirations for the new network, shared by some participants leading up to this week's conference, include:

- 1. Coordinating across borders for consistency and reform
- 2. Building spiritual and emotional practices to be able to face the difficulties of migration
- 3. Telling stories and spreading counternarratives
- 4. Advocating for fair, consistent and humane asylum policies.

The network is currently developing resources for education and advocacy grounded in migration theology for congregations looking to engage on migration.
