

Migration-focused entity features PC(USA) partners in Central America

The network is a creation born from a General Assembly resolution proposed by the Presbytery of the Pacific on behalf of the church in El Salvador, a PC(USA) partner church, and approved by the 223rd General Assembly in 2018.

The network is currently developing resources for education and advocacy grounded in migration theology for congregations looking to engage on migration.
