







About the GPRA Survey



What is the GPRA?

GPRA stands for Government Performance & Results Act and is a survey used to collect information on:

-  Substance use history
-  Living Conditions
-  Mental health and physical needs
-  Education and employment
-  Relationships and family support
-  Recovery Support Structure

Why have I been asked to complete a GPRA survey?

Virginia has received a **federal grant** to support individuals receiving substance use services. One requirement of this grant is to complete GPRA surveys over the course of services. This will **help Virginia to continue to receive funding** to provide services for those in need.

-  The data collected informs **future work** in the field
-  The data collected informs **service delivery**

Who completes the GPRA?

All individuals receiving services funded by the grant or receiving services from a provider funded by the grant are asked to complete a GPRA survey. These services might include:



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What will I be asked to do?

You will be asked to complete three GPRA Surveys at **three** different time points:

**Intake
GPRA**

Completed at your **Intake to services.**

**Follow-Up
GPRA**

Completed **6 months after** your intake, even if discharged.

**Discharge
GPRA**

Completed when you are **discharged from services.**

Why do a follow-up GPRA?

The follow-up GPRA is completed 6 months after you complete the Intake GPRA, regardless of whether you are still receiving services at this agency. The below points outline why completing the follow-up GPRA is important and beneficial to you,



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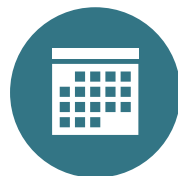
Improve your **access to** substance use and/or mental illness **treatment services**



Inform your providers of treatment successes and needs



Identify other supports your community can provide



Track progress and growth over time in your treatment



Build **mutual understanding and develop stronger relationships** with your treatment team
