# Getting Started with GPRA Administration at Your Agency



The purpose of this one-pager is to help your agency start administering the GPRA to clients receiving SOR-funded services. This information sheet provides an introduction to SAMHSA's SOR grant, as well as information and resources to give to staff members completing the GPRA.



### **SOR Information**

Virginia's State Opioid Response (SOR) grant funds are used for various activities to serve clients with an opioid use disorder (OUD) or stimulant use disorder. The Government Performance and Results Act (GPRA) is a survey tool that the SOR grant uses for evaluation purposes.

Clients receiving activities funded by SOR or working with a staff members whose position is SOR-funded must complete a GPRA survey. Your agency will need to provide information and guidance to staff members so they can determine when a client is eligible to complete a GPRA.



## **Determine When to Conduct the GPRA**

Start by determining which staff members will be conducting the GPRA at your agency and provide information about the SOR grant. Staff members should be able to answer the following questions.

## Which positions are funded by the SOR grant?

Staff will need to GPRA clients who work with these staff members.

# Which services are funded by the SOR grant?

This can help determine which clients to complete a GPRA with.
