Site Background

The Site consists of ±31 acres at 1611 Talleyrand Avenue on the west bank of the St. Johns River in the predominantly industrial port of Jacksonville. From 1893 to 1978, Kerr-McGee and its predecessors used the Site to manufacture, formulate, package, and distribute fertilizers, pesticides and herbicides. Site contaminants—primarily pesticides and metals—are present in soil, sediment and groundwater at concentrations that may pose a threat to human health and the environment.

The Multistate Trust

The Multistate Trust is a private, independent entity created as part of a bankruptcy settlement to own, investigate and clean up the Site and facilitate safe, beneficial Site reuse and long-term stewardship.

The Multistate Trust performs its Site-related work under EPA oversight in consultation with the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP). The transfer or sale of any portion of the Site must be approved by the Multistate Trust's beneficiaries, which are represented by the EPA and FDEP. Site cleanup funds were paid by Kerr-McGee and other companies responsible for Site contamination.
