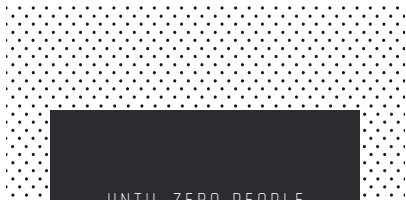

The purpose of this curriculum is to start your group off in the best possible way. We truly believe that the best way we can grow in our relationship with God is WITH other people.

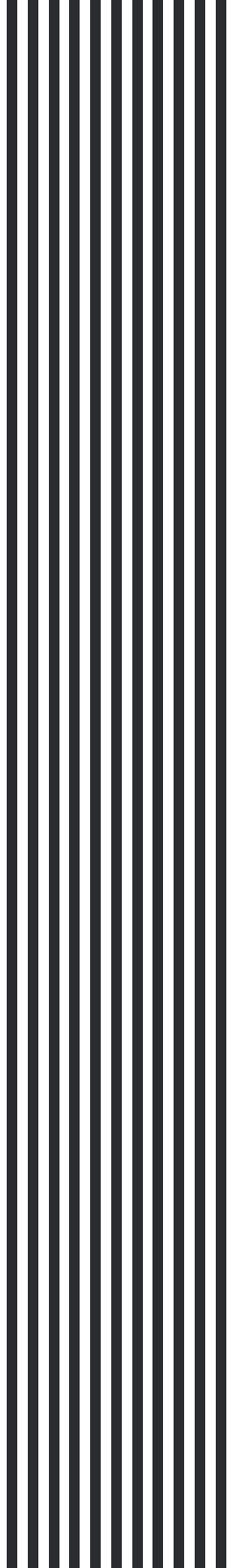

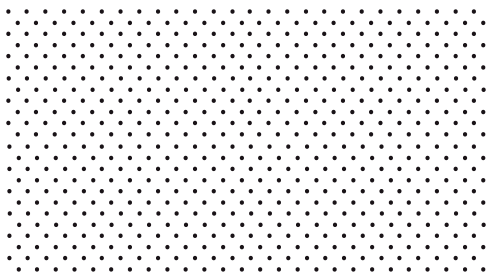

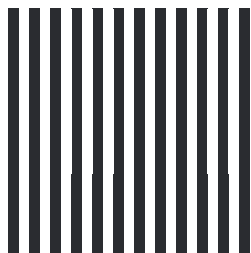

Don't be afraid to take a risk, share something personal, ask good questions, don't jump to conclusions, and enjoy this process of getting to know each other!

WEEK ONE | RELATIONSHIPS

Our hope for you today is that you will walk away meeting some new people, but we understand that many of us join groups for different reasons. Some of us are in a great spot in our relationship with God, and some of us may not have a relationship with God at all. Some may have a huge network of family and friends that they talk to regularly, others may be feeling alone or isolated. Some people in this group right now might be excited about the idea of a small group, meeting new people, and getting connected at church on a deep level, while others might be apprehensive, unsure, or skeptical.

Regardless of where you're at, this is a place where you can belong. You can bring questions, you don't have to agree with everyone, and you can engage with this group on whatever level you are comfortable with.

+ TODAY

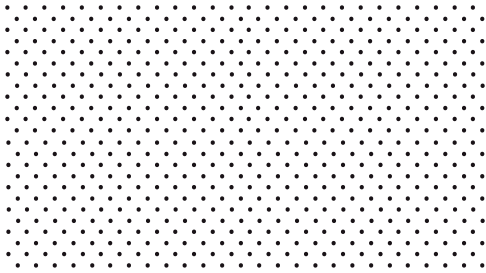
For the remainder of our time together today, we are going to get to know each other better. In the back of this book, there is an appendix of CONVERSATION STARTER questions that will help you get to know each other on a deeper level. Have fun with these questions, come up with a creative way to ask them, assign them, or turn them into a game. There's no time limit or required response. Here are a couple tips to get you started.

1. The questions become more personal and insightful as the levels increase (i.e. Level One questions are surface, while Level Three questions are deeper).
2. Ask everyone the same question or allow each person to pick a level and question number.
3. Alternatively, cut up the questions, place them in a bowl, and have each person draw one to answer.

INTRODUCTION

Talk about a time when somebody spoke something to you (verbally or non-verbally) that significantly affected your course of life. Maybe it was a parent, friend, or mentor. What did they say to you and what did that mean to you? How did it impact you at the time? Was it something positive and empowering or negative and hurtful? How does that truth or lie still affect you to this day?

READ EPHESIANS 2:1-10

How does this passage confirm or confront what you believe about yourself and the calling you have on your life?

What do you think Paul means when he calls you "God's handiwork"? How does this passage affirm or challenge what was spoken over you by that other person in your life?

READ EPHESIANS 4:1-13

As you read, highlight anything that stands out to you as it relates to calling.

EXAMINE

Spend time reflecting on and discussing the passage you've just read. What's occurring in this passage? What's the big theme or takeaway from this passage as it relates to calling? What are identifiers of a person "living a life worthy of the calling"? How does this passage speak to a person's unique calling and the way it fits alongside the callings of other believers?

APPLY

Look at the chart on the right. Which of the five roles of ministry identified in verse 11 do you most identify with? Talk about ways your unique wiring can help benefit your group, church, and community for advancing the Kingdom of God. What is a way that your role as a _____ can help your group move forward in the calling he has for this Gospel community?

How might God want to move you beyond false or secondary identities spoken over you by others into his calling on your life?

PRAY

Pray this week for God to reveal how he wants to use your history, giftings, and passions for his overall design for redemption in your community and beyond.

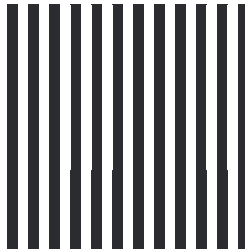


On a scale of 1-10, how sure are you of the calling God has given you?

READ

ROMANS 8:18-30

EXAMINE

Spend time reflecting on the passage you've just read. What's occurring in this passage? What's the big theme or takeaway from this passage as it relates to calling? In verse 28, Paul states we've, "been called according to his purpose." According to what you read, what is the purpose God has called us as his followers into?

APPLY

Identify 1 specific area in which you see creation experiencing bondage and brokenness (poverty, racial inequality, broken families, abortion, etc). How might your life already intersect with this area of brokenness? If it doesn't, what steps can you take to move toward it?

PRAY

Commit to pray this week for this issue and ask God how you can be part of God's redemptive purpose for this issue.

READ

MATTHEW 28:16-20

As you read, highlight anything that stands out to you as it relates to calling.



EXAMINE

Spend time reflecting on the passage you've just read. What's occurring in this passage? What's the big theme or takeaway from this passage as it relates to calling? In verses 18-20, Jesus gives the disciples 4 distinct commands. What are they? Discuss each of these 4 verbs and how they relate to our universal calling as modern-day disciples. Lastly, how do these commands, when obeyed, lead to "zero unfulfilled callings" in our community and world?

APPLY

On the journal pages, write down a short list of people in your life you have a relationship with and a desire to see them grow as a disciple. Commit to meeting up with one of them in the next couple weeks.

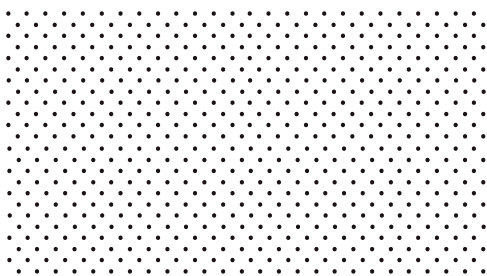
PRAY

INTRODUCTION

Tell us about a time when you were lost. Maybe you were on a road trip and were literally lost (before iPhone maps, of course). Maybe it was a season of your life when you lacked clear direction or walked away from friends and family. What did being lost feel like?

Now think about your life before Jesus. What was your life like before you met Jesus? What words would you use to describe it?

READ LUKE 15

As you read through Jesus' parable of lost things, what stuck out to you most about the stories he tells?

What prompted him to tell these stories in the first place? (See Luke 15:1-2)

Knowing what being lost feels like (whether spiritually, physically, or relationally), what can we learn from the lifestyle of Jesus about how to pursue people?

READ LUKE 19:1-10

As you read, highlight anything that stands out to you as it relates to calling.

EXAMINE

As a group, spend time reflecting on the passage you've just read. What's occurring in this passage? What's the common thread in these two passages as it relates to seeing zero lost people among us? What can we learn about Jesus' method of evangelism? (Who did he pursue? How did he pursue them?)

APPLY

Write down the name of someone in your life who doesn't yet have a relationship with Jesus. Take a few minutes to share your name and who this is. Commit to praying for this person and take a relational step with this person this week.

PRAY

Ask God to remind you of what lost felt like in your own life. Pray this week for your person. Ask God to break through in this life and show his love to them in a tangible way.

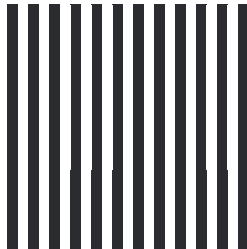

READ

ACTS 1:1-11

As you read, highlight anything that stands out to you.

EXAMINE

Spend time reflecting on the passage you've just read. What's occurring in this passage? What's the big theme or takeaway from this passage as it relates to lost people? What does Jesus give his followers to do? What's the promise within the command? What does it mean to be a witness (at work, on social media, in your family, etc.)?

APPLY

What is your responsibility (primarily)? How could your group seek lost people like Jesus and be a "witness"? Are there any ways you are damaging your witness for Jesus in the world? Spend some time reflecting below.

PRAY

Before you pray, in 3-5 minutes, Reflect on how you came to Christ. What was the deciding factor or moment? Spend some time with God in gratitude.

MATTHEW 5:13-16

As you read, highlight anything that stands out to you.

EXAMINE

Sadducees: accommodate dominant culture (assimilate).

Pharisees: separate into subculture (criticize & disassociate).

Essenes: escape from all outside culture (isolate).

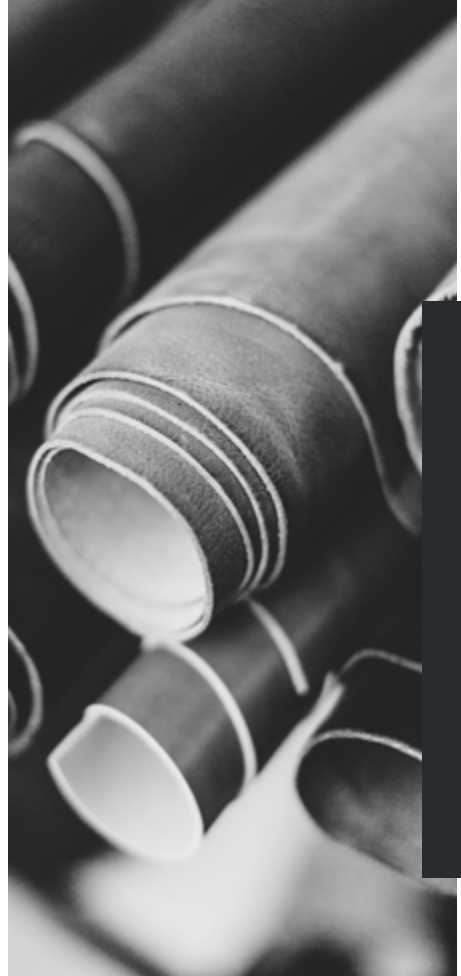
How did Jesus model a different way to engage the world from these?

APPLY

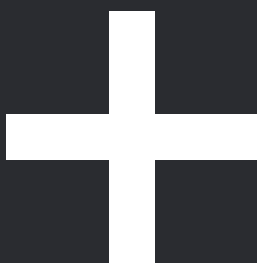
Think of one way this week you can have a more Christlike witness in the world (maybe by serving someone, sharing your story, or clearly sharing the Gospel with someone).

Pray for God to give you the courage and opportunity to be "salt and light" this week.

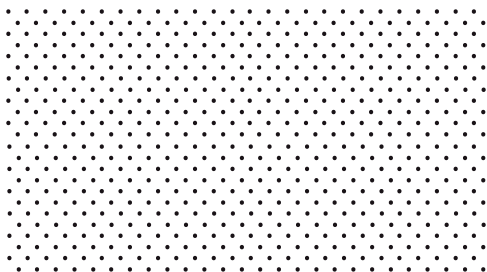

+ INTRODUCTION

Have you ever experienced a time in your life when you were in need? What was that like? When you encounter someone who is in need (whether it's a homeless person or a single parent in need of help) what is your first and natural reaction? What is God's first and natural reaction to people in need?

READ 2 CORINTHIANS 8:1-9

As you read through Paul's account of the Macedonian Christians, what stands out to you?

How might this passage change our cultural assumptions and natural reactions to being generous to others?

What is the natural outflow of those who are benefactors of God's rich generosity?

READ ACTS 4:32-35

As you read, highlight anything that stands out to you as it relates to needs.

EXAMINE

What would it be like to be part of a community with no needs? What would it take from each of us to be that kind of community?

The body of Christ is a unique community. Paul describes this body in 1 Corinthians 12 and argues that we are one body with many parts where everybody matters and everybody is needed. What is an area of need in the body of Christ you can meet but have neglected to do so (think through the lens of spiritual, physical, and relational needs)?

APPLY

Share that need with your group. Sometimes sharing your own needs is far more difficult than meeting other people's needs. Yet that is the beauty of the Gospel and the Church: a community that reflects the one who became poor for our sake. Take some time to think about a need in your life right now (again think spiritual, physical, and/or relational). As a group, make a plan to meet the needs shared with each other today.

PRAY

Take some time today to pray that as a community, we would be of one heart and mind. Pray that each of us would not only express our needs, but be willing to meet each other's needs. Finally, pray that that generosity doesn't stay within the group, but becomes a ripple of meeting the needs of an impoverished world.

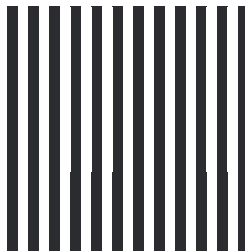


On a scale of 1-10, how aware are you of the needs of the people around you?

WHAT DOES "ZERO NEEDS AMONG US" MEAN TO ME?

READ

PHILIPPIANS 4:10-19
AND
EPHESIANS 3:14-21

EXAMINE

What do these passages have in common with each other? What is different? Looking at Philippians 4:19 and Ephesians 3:20-21, what are the two principles about how God meets our needs? Do you feel you are in a season where you are hungry for God to simply meet your needs or are you in a season where you are hungry for him to do exceedingly more for his glory in your life?

APPLY

Identify one area of your life where you need God to be your sustainer (meet a basic need) and one area where you need him to be a provider (do exceedingly more).

PRAY

Take a few moments today and surrender those two areas of need in your life to the Father. Whether they are burdens or dreams, offer them to him and watch him transform them.

WHAT DOES "ZERO NEEDS AMONG US" MEAN TO THOSE OUTSIDE MY COMMUNITY?

READ
LUKE 6:27-36

EXAMINE

The Roman Emperor Julian, writing in the fourth century, regretted the progress of Christianity because it pulled people away from the Roman gods. He said, "Atheism [i.e. the Christian faith] has been specially advanced through the loving service rendered to strangers, and through their care for the burial of the dead. It is a scandal that there is not a single Jew who is a beggar, and that the 'godless' Christians care not only for their own poor but for ours as well; while those who belong to us look in vain for the help that we should render them. Of course, before the church was born, Jesus taught quite thoroughly on our responsibility to our neighbor (i.e. Luke 6, the parable of the Good Samaritan in Luke 10).

What is our responsibility to our neighbor who has needs (spiritual, physical, relational)? Do you find yourself dismissing or engaging your neighbor's needs? Do you find yourself judging the worthiness of others to have their needs met?

APPLY

Meet one of your neighbor's needs this week. Of course, this means engaging in conversation in order to discover a need. Neighbor can be defined as anyone outside your faith community, anyone you come in contact with. End the conversation by asking this simple question: How can I best pray for you?

PRAY

After you've met the need of someone else, take some time this week to pray for that person and the specific need they shared with you.

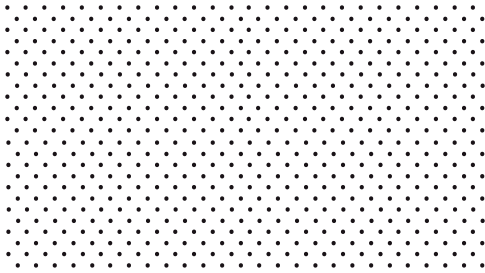

+ I N T R O D U C T I O N

Independence from God is the ultimate form of idolatry, yet it is one of the most subtle and easiest to fall into. Independence from God does not always look like outright rejection of him. It can look like an over-reliance on yourself, a behavior-focused Gospel (i.e. the need to perform), or even simple distractions. What seasons in your life do you find it easiest to live independent of God? For some of us, it may be the easiest seasons of life, for others it may be the most uncertain. Spend some time sharing about these seasons with your group.

R E A D N U M B E R S 2 1 : 4 - 9

As you read, highlight anything that stands out to you as it relates to calling. How did the idolatry of independence manifest itself in the Israelites in this passage? How did God use the bronze serpent to re-establish total dependence on him? What are some modern day "bronze serpents" God uses in our lives?

R E A D 2 K I N G S 1 8 : 1 - 7

As you read, highlight anything that stands out to you as it relates to idols. What did King Hezekiah destroy in this passage? Why?

E X A M I N E

It's crazy that the very thing God provided to Israel to redirect their affection back to him became an idol. Even the good things that God provides can become idols to us: whether it be a free country, money, or a child. In these moments, we find ourselves worshipping the provision over the provider. Are there areas of your life that were once good things that have become distractions? How have these things become a manifestation of independence from God in our lives?

A P P L Y

Read John 3:1-16. Take some time to practice communal confession and repentance together. Confession means "to agree", in other words we agree with God about who we are and who has no equal in our lives. Repentance means "to return", we take the steps to put God in his rightful place in our lives. What action (whether drastic or subtle) do you need to take to reestablish dependence on God and put him back in the rightful place in your life?

P R A Y

Take some time to pray out loud for someone else in your group who shared today. Pray that God will provide for them in a way that establishes dependence on him, that provisions will not become idols, and that we can help each other in putting zero gods before God.

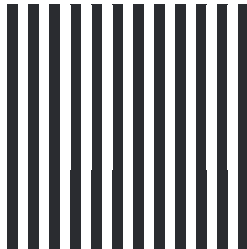
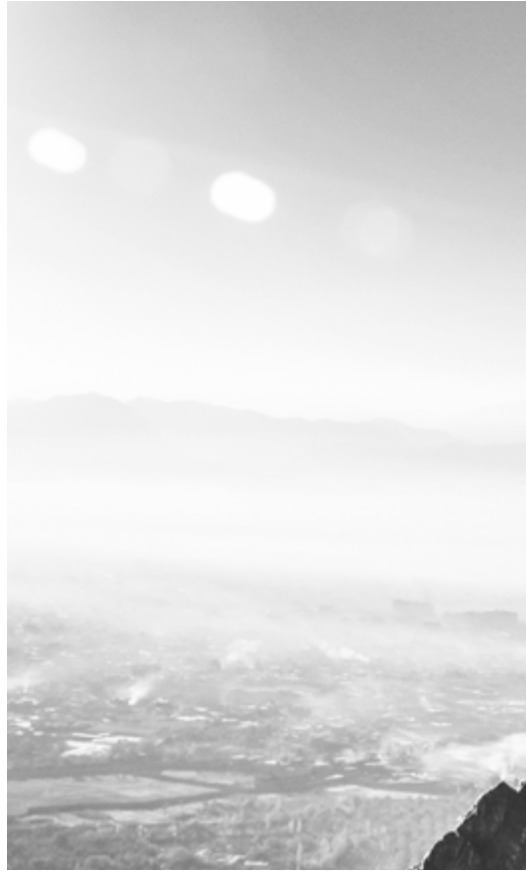

READ

DEUTERONOMY 6:4-6

EXAMINE

Spend time reflecting on the passage you've just read. What's occurring in this passage? What's the big theme or takeaway from this passage as it relates to idols? In Deut. 6 verse 5, we are told to love God "with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength". What does this verse mean to you? Is this concept a struggle to you? Why or why not?

APPLY

Identify one specific thing in your life that can be seen as an idol. This can be anything from entertainment, sports, people, your work, etc. How can you make God more of a priority in your day to day life?

PRAY

Commit to pray this week to listen to God's will for you. Pray that he will reveal himself to you in unique ways so that you can get to know him on a deeper level.

READ

EXODUS 32

As you read, highlight anything that stands out to you as it relates to idols.

EXAMINE

Spend time reflecting on the passage you've just read. What's occurring in this passage? If you were Moses, how would you react? Why do you think it is that they were worshiping this golden calf? Have you ever felt like you've done the same?

APPLY

Think of three people in your life that are worshiping false idols, and are struggling because of it. Pray for them, and discuss how you can show them the ways that God can work in their lives.

PRAY

Pray for God to show people outside the church his love, and pray for wisdom on how to show others how to make God the Lord of their lives.

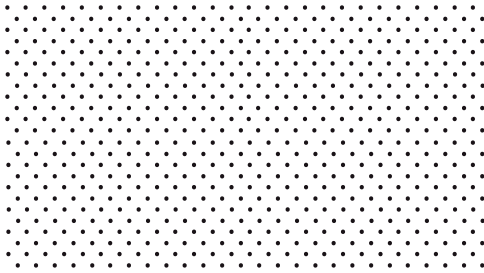

+ INTRODUCTION

Tell the group about the best community or friendship you ever experienced. What made that relationship work so well? What do you think keeps relationships from flourishing? Are there any experiences in your life that you think might be keeping you from experiencing the kind of community that God intends for you? What are some of those?

READ HEBREWS 10:19 - 25

How does Hebrews connect living in community to living out the Gospel?

What does it take from each of us to be that type of Gospel community (in other words, what can you uniquely offer to this community)?

READ JOHN 17:20 - 26

As you read, highlight anything that stands out to you as it relates to needs.

EXAMINE

You can't spell community without 'unity.' In fact, unity was a big deal to Jesus. He ties our unity with one another to our witness in the world. What is the example and standard for this unity? (Hint: see v. 21). Why is that important? What does unity in community mean to you? What are some of the biggest causes of disunity in our world and church today? How can we use the differences in our experiences, backgrounds, and even perspectives to build unity with one another? How might you act differently with your children, your marriage, at work, if you knew people were watching you and would judge the validity and effectiveness of Christ by your unity and/or love for each other?

APPLY

One way to grow in unity with each other is to get together in fellowship, having no agenda. This is just a time of fun and connecting with each other. As a group put a date on the calendar for a time to get together outside of normal group time. This could be a cookout, a pool party, a game night or whatever interests those in your group. Be mindful to make this a regular occurrence within your group and not just a one time event or gathering.

PRAY

Pray this week for your group to grow deeper in community with each other and allow God to use you each uniquely to build up and encourage each other within the group.

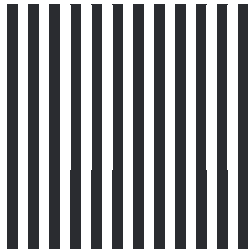


On a scale of 1-10, how connected do you feel to your church and group?

EXAMINE

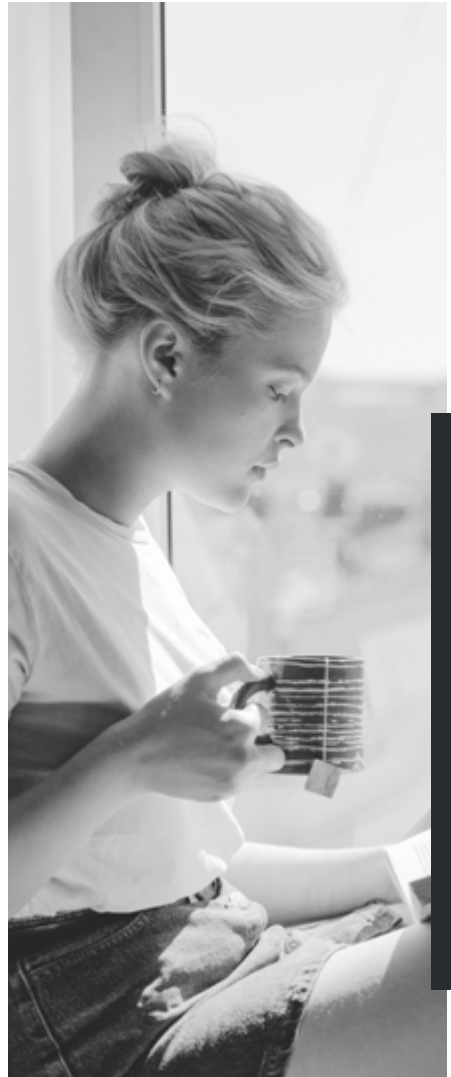
Spend time reflecting on the passage you've just read. What's occurring in this passage? What's the big theme or takeaway from this passage as it relates to being in community with others?

Maybe it is letting go of stereotypes of others, maybe it is letting go of fear of inviting someone in, maybe it is letting go of the fear of the ask itself. Take some time this week to self reflect where you are in this area. Then from that take a step in faith in order to grow deeper with others in community.

PRAY

Pray this week for God to show you where you need to take a step of faith to grow deeper with others in community.

APPLY

Identify 1 specific person you could connect with this week that you know that really could use community and invite them into community with you.

PRAY

Commit to pray this week for the person God has set on your heart and ask for God to soften their heart. Pray for God to open doors for you to connect with this person and invite them into community with others.
