Tito's Prize Open Call Guidelines

General Information

The Tito's Prize is a \$15,000 award for one Austin-based artist. The Tito's Prize is funded by a generous gift from <u>Tito's Handmade Vodka</u> and facilitated by Big Medium. The award includes a solo exhibition during the spring in the Big Medium Gallery.

Curators

The Curatorial Panel includes **Erika Mei Chua Holum** (she/they), *Cynthia Woods Mitchell Assistant Curator at the Blaffer Art Museum*; **Phillip Townsend** (he/him) the *Curator of Art at Art Galleries at Black Studies (AGBS) at The University of Texas at Austin*; and **Coka Treviño** (she/her), *Curator and Director of Programming at Big Medium*. The three-member panel will unanimously select the prize-winning artist.

Criteria

Work entered into the Tito's Prize Open Call does not need to adhere to any thematic, aesthetic, or conceptual constraints but shouldn't conflict with <u>Big Medium</u> or Tito's Handmade Vodka's missions. The work does not need to relate to either Big Medium or Tito's Handmade Vodka's brand and the work will not be used on the label or other packaging of Tito's Handmade Vodka.

The curators will review applicants on the strength of work, the artist's background, and with the exhibition in the Big Medium Gallery in mind. The curators will also strongly consider artists for whom this award would help grow their artistic career and support their life in Austin.

Eligibility

The Tito's Prize is open to all artists living and working in Austin, Texas. For this purpose, Austin is defined as the area within a 17-mile radius from the capitol building, which includes all <u>ten city</u> <u>council districts</u> and other areas surrounding the Austin city limits. Artists working in any media and at any stage in their career are eligible.

In the case of work that may have not been physically realized at the time you apply, you may provide documentation describing proposed work.

Authorship and Ownership

By entering work to this open call, you represent that you are its author and that you either own or are part of a collaborative group that co-owns the work.

When to Enter

Applications will be accepted online at <u>bigmedium.org/titosprize</u> from February 16 through April 18, 2023. There will be no extension or exceptions.

How to Enter

All entries must be completed using the online form. Please read these guidelines carefully before beginning your application. You may print these guidelines for future reference. You may also access these guidelines at any time during the application process via the "Guidelines" link at the top of the application.

To begin the application process, you will be required to create a Submittable user account. Once you start the online application process, you can leave the application by either logging out or closing your browser after saving your draft. You can return to edit your application at any time before you complete your entry. Once you have completed your application, it is no longer accessible and cannot be edited. Do not click the 'Apply' button until your application is complete and you are fully satisfied with its contents. Be sure to click the 'Apply' when you have finalized your application. *Applications not submitted by 11:59 pm on April 18, 2023, will not be accepted.*

- Proof of Residence Please upload proof of residence. Acceptable formats are: jpg, png, pdf — Acceptable documents include:
 - Electric, water, natural gas, satellite television, cable television, or non-cellular telephone statement dated within 90 days of February 1, 2021
 - Valid voter registration card
 - Current deed, mortgage, monthly mortgage statement
 - Current homeowners' or renters' insurance policy or statement
 - Preprinted paycheck or pay stub dated within 90 days of February 1, 2021
 - Mail from a federal, state, county, or city government dated within 90 days of January 27, 2022
 - Current documents issued by the US Military indicating residential address
- Artist Statement Acceptable formats are: doc, docx, pdf, rtf, txt
 - Be concise, but include all pertinent information to clearly inform the curators about your work.
- CV Acceptable formats are: doc, docx, pdf, rtf, txt
- Additional documents (Exhibition proposal or other documentation, writing, etc.)
 - Acceptable formats are: doc, docx, pdf, rtf, txt, jpg, tiff, png, mp3, mp4, mov, ppt, pptx xls, xlsx
- Artwork Documentation
 - You may upload up to ten (10) pieces of documentation of relevant work. This may include still images, video, or audio pieces. Acceptable formats are: jpg, tiff, gif, mp3, mp4, avi, mov, wav, doc, docx, txt, pdf
 - Image resolution should be large enough for the curators to view the work clearly on a computer.
 - Name image files accordingly: First Name_Last Name_Image # (e.g.: Hollis Baxter 1.jpg.)
 - For each image, provide the pictured artwork's title, dimensions, medium, and year
- If it is within your means, an optional add-on payment of \$15 can be included on your form to assist with administrative and organizational expenses of Big Medium. We appreciate your support!

Notification of Acceptance

Final notification of the curators' artist selections will be sent to all artists via email by May. 2023.

Reproductions and Publicity

By entering your work and providing images and other documentation, you agree that any images and other materials you provide may be reproduced and distributed via the websites and social media channels of Big Medium and the project's partners. You also agree that images of your work may be reproduced in the context of the exhibition and its promotion by third parties such as journalists.
