About Us

in 1990, a determined group of families launched Boca Ballet Theatre with little more than a dream. Thirty-two years later, BBT has educated more than 10,000 young dancers, performed for more than 150,000 audience members, and presented hundreds of the world's top professional dancers. As one of the nation's largest and most respected civic youth ballet companies, we pride ourselves on being "different

by design." Our focused curriculum helps aspiring dancers gain the skills and experiences they need to compete in the world marketplace of concert dance. We hope to instill in every young student a lifelong love of dance and an appreciation for the joys it brings!

During the 2022–2023 performance season, we focused on three core elements that represent the pillars of the Boca Ballet Theatre mission:

CULTURE

Boca Ballet Theatre is dedicated to the preservation of ballet as a historically and culturally significant art form. The ballets that we present each season are chosen specifically to expose young dancers to timeless classical works as well as innovative contemporary choreography. In this sense, we are both backward and forward looking because we believe that innovation in dance comes from a strong background in its history through its various periods—from Classical to Romantic to Neoclassical and beyond.

In our 2022-2203 Season of Dance, we presented two full-length ballet

classics: *The Nutcracker* and *Giselle*. Both productions exposed our dancers to the rigor and artistry inherent in narrative ballets with multiple acts. Our dancers also performed significant contemporary works by dance innovators such as George Balanchine, David Parsons, and David Palmer. BBT's "Stars of Ballet Gala" performance put upper-level BBT students and trainees onstage with professional dancers from American Ballet Theatre, Philadelphia Ballet, and beyond, inspiring our dancers with their dedication, talent and artistry.



CAREER

Boca Ballet Theatre makes it our mission to equip our dancers with the skills they need to succeed, no matter which career path they choose. All students who participate in our program will walk away with self-discipline, dedication, confidence, and passion. However, for students who wish to continue their career in dance, we remain Florida's premier school for forging that path. In addition to providing students with the best quality of dance education, we also give students the opportunity to network with the nation's top Artistic Directors, choreographers, and schools of dance. Many of our dancers have gone on to dance for professional companies like American Ballet Theatre, Opéra National Bordeaux, and Louisville Ballet. Other dancers have gone on to star in television series on Nickelodeon and The Disney Channel.

Our Summer Performance Workshops provided a thorough and rewarding dance experience for students seeking a professional career in dance, giving them the opportunity to work with master guest Artistic Directors from top conservatories and companies from around the country. We also hosted our annual College Dance Fair, which helps ris-

ing junior and senior high school students and their parents navigate college dance programs. Participants met with representatives from participating schools such as The Ailey School at Fordham University, UNC's School of the Arts, and Butler University, among many others. We can't wait to see where our graduating seniors will take their skills and talents!

COMMUNITY

Boca Ballet Theatre continues to promote the value of dance through our professional-grade performances and fantastic outreach programs meant to

get our community moving! We are grateful for the people in our community who have recognized the value of BBT's mission and have given back through patronage, service, and attendance at our performances. Our Volunteer Guild is composed of dedicated community members who are passionate about the arts and the artistic development of our young dancers. Without the generous support of our volunteers, our wonderful events and productions would not be possible!

We also shared the value of dance through our outreach programs: BBT4PD and First Step. BBT4PD, or Dance for those living with Parkinson's disease, celebrated its 9th season of free movement-based classes. The benefits of this special program for those living with Parkinson's are immeasurable, both physically and mentally. We were grateful for the continued support of the Boca Raton Regional Hospital Foundation and The Lisa and Mike Kelleher Fund, which made this program possible. Our First Step program also shared the benefits of dance with children in our community who were in need of nurturing and mentorship. We were proud to partner with Boys & Girls Clubs of Palm Beach County, and we were grateful to have the Vegso Family Foundation's sponsorship for this special program.



EDITH STEIN PRESENTS *THE NUTCRACKER*

November 2022 — Boca Ballet Theatre's annual production of *The Nutcracker* captivated audiences at the Olympic Heights Performing Arts Theater. Professional guest artists Nayara Lopes and Austin Eyer of Philadelphia Ballet brought the Land of Sweets to life as the Sugar Plum Fairy and her Cavalier, dancing alongside a talented cast of BBT dancers. Following BBT's matinee performances of *The Nutcracker*, the company also hosted The Gingerbread Ball, which allowed children to meet the cast of dancers and see the sets and costumes up close. Choreographed by Co-Artistic Director Dan Guin, BBT's production dazzled all in attendance with its accomplished cast, spectacular sets and costumes, and custom-created pyrotechnics. This classical ballet kicked off the holiday season with its signature magic!

"STARS OF DANCE GALA" PERFORMANCE

January 2023 — For one night only, Boca Ballet Theatre assembled ballet's brightest stars at Baptist Health presents "Stars of Dance Gala" Performance, which celebrated BBT's 32nd anniversary. A dozen dancers from American Ballet Theatre, Philadelphia Ballet, and more performed in this unforgettable event, which stunned our audience at FAU's University Theatre. Following the performance, VIP guests enjoyed a fine dining experience in the historic Cathedral Room at The Boca Raton, where they could meet the stars of the show. At the gala dinner, New York City Ballet dancer and advocate for the arts Steven Caras was awarded our inaugural Lifetime Achievement in the Arts Award.

GISELLE


April 2023 — In the spring, Boca Ballet Theatre presented one of the most beloved ballets of all time: *Giselle*. Eric & Olga Jorgensen sponsored principal guest artist Oskana Maslova of Philadelphia Ballet, who enchanted audiences as Giselle. Elizabeth H. Dudley proudly presented Philadelphia Ballet's Sterling Baca, who returned to Boca Raton as a principal guest artist to dance the role of Albreicht. Philadelphia Ballet demi soloist Jacqueline Callahan cast a spell over the second act with her regal performance as Myrtha, Queen of the Wilis. Guest artist Gustavo Ribeiro gave a dynamic performance in Act I's renowned Pas de Trois, leading BBT's lively cast of dancers. We were also honored to have Toby Lewellen and Amanda Sewell return to the BBT stage to star as Hilarion and Myra. With its ethereal dancing and heartfelt story, *Giselle* was a magical experience for audiences at the Countess de Hoernle Theatre at Spanish River High School.

SUMMER DREAMS

July 2023 — Boca Ballet Theatre's mixed repertory performance Summer Dreams capped off our Advanced Summer Performance Workshop. This special performance featured the work of three exceptional choreographers, including NYCB co-founder George Balanchine, Maximum Dance Company co-founder David Palmer, and founder of Parsons Dance company David Parsons. Palmer presented the Boca Raton premiere of a work set to George Gershwin's "Rhapsody in Blue." BBT also welcomed New York City Ballet principal Anthony Huxley and soloist Emma Von Enck to Boca Raton for the first time. Their sparkling performance in *La Source* was simply unforgettable! From classical grace to contemporary innovation, this production provided audiences with the best that concert dance has to offer!

SCHOOL OF BOCA BALLET THEATRE

The School of Boca Ballet Theatre was established in 1993 in support of the Company's mission to expose the community's youth to quality concert dance and professional training. The School of Boca Ballet Theatre is one of the few non-profit dance schools in the country. Governed by a Board of Directors, all income from the school is channeled into training or performance programs.

In class, BBT's "stair step" approach teaches dancers how to dance in a series of progressive stages overseen by the school's expert faculty. Rather than teaching rote memorization of

dance routines for recitals, we teach the technique and discipline required to succeed as a professional dancer. Along the way, our students learn the importance of rigorous study and hard work, while also developing an appreciation of the artistry of dance itself—valuable lessons for all young people. Whether seeking a professional dance career, the enrichment of life through dance, or a satisfying way to keep in shape, students at the School of Boca Ballet Theatre find their needs met with the finest in dance training provided by our expert faculty members.



SPECIAL PROGRAMS COLLEGE DANCE FAIR

Each year, Boca Ballet Theatre hosts the College Dance Fair, assisting rising junior and senior high school students and their parents navigate college dance programs. During this weekend-long program, participants get to meet representatives from top dance programs around the country. Students also have the opportunity to take six master classes, speak one-on-one with representatives from participating schools, attend information sessions about each school, and network with other dance students from across the country. Past participating schools have included NYC Tisch, The Ailey School at Fordham University, Butler University, Indiana University, and AMDA, amongst many others. This program is an invaluable resource for high school students seeking a future in the professional dance world while also earning a college degree.

ADVANCED SUMMER PERFORMANCE WORKSHOP

BBT's Advanced Summer Performance Workshop has earned a reputation for being one of the most thorough and rewarding dance experiences a student can have during the summer, and many use it as a launching pad for a professional career in dance. Under the supervision of BBT's Co-Artistic Directors Dan Guin and Jane Tyree, the program offers top quality teachers and master guest Artistic Directors from top conservatories and companies around the country.

Students have the opportunity to:

- ❖ Take classes in ballet technique, pointe technique, variations, jazz, and modern. Additional classes in Pilates and hip-hop will also be included.
- ❖ Use classes to audition for visiting Artistic Directors.
- ❖ Meet and ask questions of the visiting Artistic Directors during the "Meet the Director" lecture series.
- ❖ Learn what it is to be a member of a corps de ballet, dancing with some of the finest professional dancers in the world.
- ❖ Dance enrichment sessions will include: question and answer sessions with professional dancers, technical theatre production, video critique of historic ballet performances, plus discussions on resume, make-up, and audition skills.
- ❖ Perform in a full-length concert with professional dancers.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH BBT4PD: DANCE FOR THOSE LIVING WITH PARKINSON'S

BBT4PD, or Dance for those living with Parkinson's disease, celebrated its 9th season of movement-based classes! Led by Boca Ballet Theatre's incredible dance

instructors, each BBT4PD class flowed with constant energy. The director of the program, Cindy Surman, is the only instructor in Florida certified by the founding organization Dance for PD® (a non-profit by Mark Morris Dance Group and the Brooklyn Parkinson Group). Team teacher Ines Lopez has also received training from Dance for PD! BBT4PD enjoyed sponsorship from the Boca Raton Regional Hospital Foundation and The Lisa and Mike Kelleher Fund.

The benefits of BBT4PD for those living with Parkinson's are immeasurable, both physically and mentally. These benefits include increased mobility, better balance and posture, improved mood, decreased symptoms, and reduced sense of isolation associated with disease. The support participants bring to each other is a priceless social and emotional bonus. BBT4PD is open to anyone with Parkinson's, no matter their age, ability, or the advancement of their condition. Classes this season were offered FREE of charge due to the generous support of our sponsors.

The atmosphere of each class is warm, inviting, and uplifting. This season featured live music by accompanist Aly Tejas. BBT4PD's teachers got participants moving, stretching, and oftentimes laughing! They enjoyed the classes just as much as the participants, referring to the classes as the highlight of their week.

Assistants Karen Wexler and Amanda Sewell and volunteer assistants Judi Steinhardt, Judie Stewart, and Liz Dudley provided extra hands, smiles, and hugs to participants. Each and every day, our wonderful helpers brought their hearts and souls to class with their service and support!

Boca Ballet Theatre is committed to reaching out to the children in our community who are in need of extra support and mentorship. Our First Step program, first piloted in 1999, is a special dance program designed specifically for these children in our community. There were 15 children, ages eight through ten, who attended First Step classes twice a week at Boca Ballet Theatre's dance studios. These children were exposed to ballet and modern dance in the supportive environment created by BBT's dedicated faculty members. In addition to providing transportation for the youngsters, all of their dancewear and dance shoes were provided at no cost to the families.

First Step uses the arts as a framework for learning about life, providing an interactive, hands-on method of discovery that is fun and non-threatening. Children in our program enjoyed one-on-one nurturing and a creative outlet to challenge their natural curiosity and channel their energy. They also learned the value of dance as a way to create meaning and communicate. In addition to applying critical and creative thinking skills, children learned the benefits of exercise and healthy living. The program also exposed children to dance from various cultures and historical periods, promoting understanding and tolerance for people from all walks of life.

Boca Ballet Theatre's First Step program was proud to continue its mission of increasing children's self esteem, teaching discipline and respect for authority figures, and sharing the undeniable beauty of dance with our participants!






