

Fact Sheet: Inter-Agency Agreement Between the Department of Education and Department of the Interior to Transfer Native Education Programs

Overview

On March 18, 2025, the White House and Secretary of Education, Linda McMahon announced the Department of Education (ED) signed six Inter-Agency Agreements to transfer the administration of programs across Elementary and Secondary Education as well as Postsecondary Education. These transfer of programs include Native American Programs transferring to the Department of Interior (DOI), including Title VI, Native Languages, Alaska Native and Native Hawaiian Education, and Tribal College-related programs. The agreements do not affect funding levels for impacted programs but do transfer congressionally appropriated funds from ED to the respective federal agencies to cover the costs of the programs being transferred. These agreements became effective on September 30, 2025, and will remain in place until terminated by the respective agencies. NIEA is monitoring these transfers closely and will provide additional updates as they become available. This fact sheet provides an analysis of the available details.

Authority of Transfer

The ED-DOI partnership utilizes an Interagency Agreement (IAA), authorized under the Economy Act at 31 U.S.C. § 1535. The Secretary of Education is authorized to enter into agreements with other Federal agencies to jointly carry out projects of common interests and transfer funds to such federal agencies. All programs will continue to be administered in accordance with the applicable statutory requirements.

Purpose of Transfer

The transfer is consistent with the policy priorities of the Administration in <u>Executive Order No.</u>
14242, Improving Education Outcomes by Empowering Parents, States, and Communities, and Executive Order No. 14278, Preparing Americans for High-Paying Skilled Trade Jobs of the Future. It is the Administrations intent to; (1) enable administrative reforms to agency policies and programmatic requirements; (2) provides process improvements to enhance the experience for education and workforce program participants; and (3) connects ED education and workforce development programs with DOL workforce programs to provide a coordinated federal education and workforce system.

Role of the Department of the Interior

- DOI will manage competitions, provide technical assistance, and integrate ED's Indian Education programs with the suite of Native-serving programs DOI already administers including by:
 - Execution of monitoring visits to ensure compliance;
 - Providing technical assistance to discretionary grantees;

- Ensuring improvement of systems via high-quality data and accountability systems and quality assurance measures;
- Providing technical assistance to ED staff;
- Managing and coordinating contracts, procurements, grants, and program administration;
- Coordination and management of physical and IT property;
- Monitoring of drawdowns to ensuring no lapses in funding; and
- Providing technical and program improvement assistance to National, State, local, and tribal education systems, programs, and organizations and on the execution of national leadership functions in American Indian education.
- States and grantees should continue to remain in contact with their respective ED and DOI programmatic staff. Announcements on any additional process-related transitions will be made available through known channels of communication via ED and DOI programmatic staff.

DOI will take an administrative role over the following Native Education Programs;

- Native Education programs funded by the Elementary and Secondary Education Act as amended, including Title VI;
- Tribally Controlled Colleges and Universities under the Higher Education Act;
- Tribally Controlled Postsecondary Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs funded by the Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act (Perkins V); and;
- Vocational rehabilitation programs serving Native American individuals with disabilities funded under the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended;

Role of the Department of Labor

- The DOL will administer select elementary and secondary education programs funded under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, as amended. These enumerated programs are currently managed by ED's Office of Elementary and Secondary Education (OESE).
- DOL will manage competitions, provide technical assistance, and integrate ED's programs with the suite of employment and training programs DOL already administers, including by:
 - Execution of monitoring visits to ensure compliance;
 - Engaging, developing, and inspiring a high-performing workforce informed by high-quality data and accountability systems and quality assurance measures;
 - Providing technical assistance to OESE staff;
 - Managing and coordinating contracts, procurements, grants, and program administration;
 - Monitoring of States' drawdowns of funds to help ensure that grant funds do not lapse; and
 - Providing technical and program improvement assistance to National, State, and local education systems, programs, and organizations and on the execution of national leadership functions in elementary and secondary education.
- States and grantees should continue to remain in contact with their respective OESE and DOL programmatic staff. Announcements on any additional process-related

transitions will be made available through known channels of communication via OESE and DOL programmatic staff.

DOL will take an administrative role over the following Programs;

Role of the Department of Education

- ED will maintain all statutory responsibilities, including policymaking authority, and will continue its oversight of these programs;
- ED will maintain management and coordination of human resource/capital services, including hiring, awards and recognition, employee engagement, workforce and succession planning, performance management, training and development for employees;
- Execution of budget formulation, execution, and resource allocation activities, including
 formulation of administrative budget requests and justifications for discretionary funding,
 salaries and staffing allocations, payroll, and spending, and acquisition plans related to
 programs in partnership with DOI & DOL;
- Issuance of annual grant awards pursuant to applicable statutory authority and applicable Education Department General Administrative Regulations; and
- Resolution of matters requiring the exercise of final and conclusive authority that has been assigned by statute to the Secretary of Education.

NIEA will continue to monitor the implementation of these program transfers. It is NIEA's position that programs directly serving Native students, as outlined in statute, must be protected during any structural changes to federal agencies. NIEA continues to advocate for formal government-to-government consultation with Tribes to ensure that Native voices are heard and considered throughout the process.
