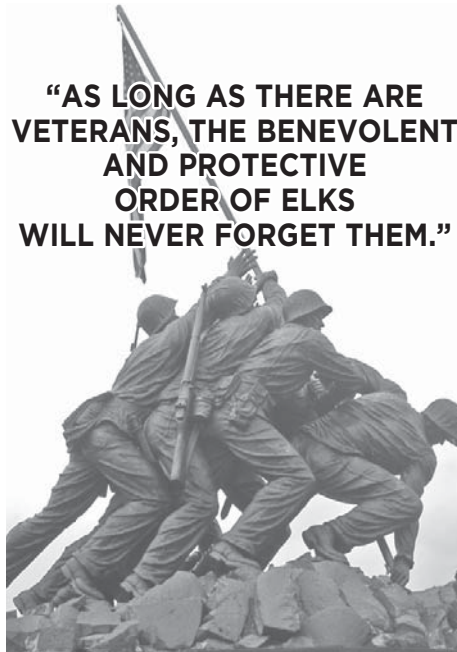

LOOK WHAT'S HAPPENING IN February

"AS LONG AS THERE ARE VETERANS, THE BENEVOLENT AND PROTECTIVE ORDER OF ELKS WILL NEVER FORGET THEM."



The Department of Defense has expanded commissary, military exchange, and morale, welfare and recreation retail privileges on U.S. military installations as required by the FY2019 Defense Authorization Act. Starting January 1, 2020, access has been expanded to include all veterans with service connected disabilities, veterans who are Purple Heart recipients, veterans who are former prisoners of war and individuals approved and designated as the primary family caregivers of eligible veterans under the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA Program for Family Caregivers).

New patrons now eligible by the act should be aware that the law requires that the DOD charge them a small user fee to offset the increased expense incurred by the Department of the Treasury for processing commercial credit or debit cards use for purchases at commissary stores.

The DOD is finalizing the details for these new privileges with the VA, Homeland Security and the Treasury. Information will be announced soon regarding installation access and the authentication process for these privileges.

Starting time is at 12:00 noon - the game starts at 3:00 pm. There will be door prizes, raffles, and bar specials!

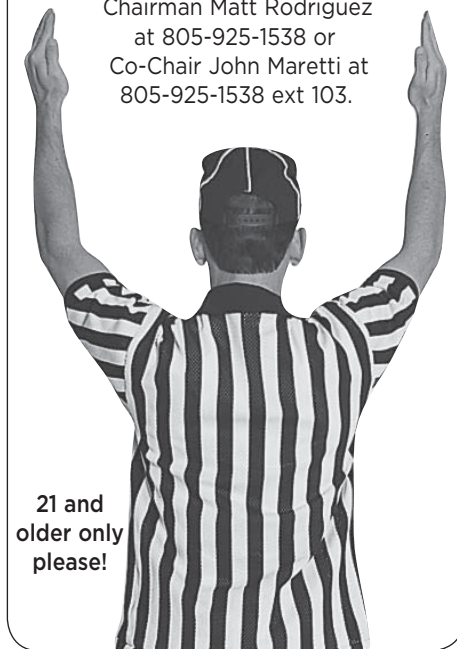

ELKS HELP FUND RESTORATION OF PEARL HARBOR SIGNAGE

Grand Exalted Ruler Bob Duitsman visited the Memorial in January 2020 and presented the first \$100,000 donated by Elks Members. An article on page 2 of the October 2019 Elks Horn detailed Past Grand Exalted Ruler Michael Luhr's plan pledging the Elk's help in restoring the exceedingly dilapidated signage at the Pearl Harbor National Memorial. All funds raised will be used to:

Replace old, faded and peeling outdoor exhibits along Pearl Harbor National Memorial's perimeter.

Upgrade current static displays with digital exhibits, build new interactive displays to engage children, and modernize the Pearl Harbor museums with iPads and touch screens.

Fabricate and install new exhibits, displays, programs, and software to better educate and serve all museum visitors.

The goal is to raise \$783,000, or a dollar per Member by the July 2020 Grand Lodge Convention, to truly help preserve history, perpetuate peace and reconciliation and ensure that the memories of our veterans, passed and living, are never forgotten.

DRESS CODE IN EFFECT FOR ALL FUNCTIONS

Elks Lodge 1538 is a flagship among Elk Lodges and not just another "Bar or Club." As such we have a Dress Code. Most times it is casual and allows more casual wear: Long shorts, like Bermuda and cargo style shorts are acceptable after 6:00 pm - except Thursday Lodge Night.

- Please no mid-thigh, cutoffs, short-shorts, or torn/frayed wear.
- Please wear all pants at your waist, not below! And no "Plumber Pants!"
- No Sweat Suits or Beach Apparel - No Flip Flops (rubber style shower shoes) - Sandals okay
- **For Ladies:** No Inappropriate tops - No dresses shorter than mid thigh
- **For Men:** No muscle shirts - No T-shirts or caps with vulgar or inappropriate slogans - No gang attire. Gentleman, wear pants at the waist, not below! Hats should be worn properly, not backwards or sideways, and please remove hats when sitting at the table to eat.

Our Greeters, Staff, and Officers do not wish to embarrass or upset any Member or guest, so please do not put them in that position. We will ask you to leave to change. Members are responsible for informing all guests of the dress code!

Members may bring up to 8 guests.

All persons attending Friday Night CYO must be over 21 years of age.

These rules will be updated as needed and are at the discretion of the Greeters, Staff, or Officer in Charge the day of the event.

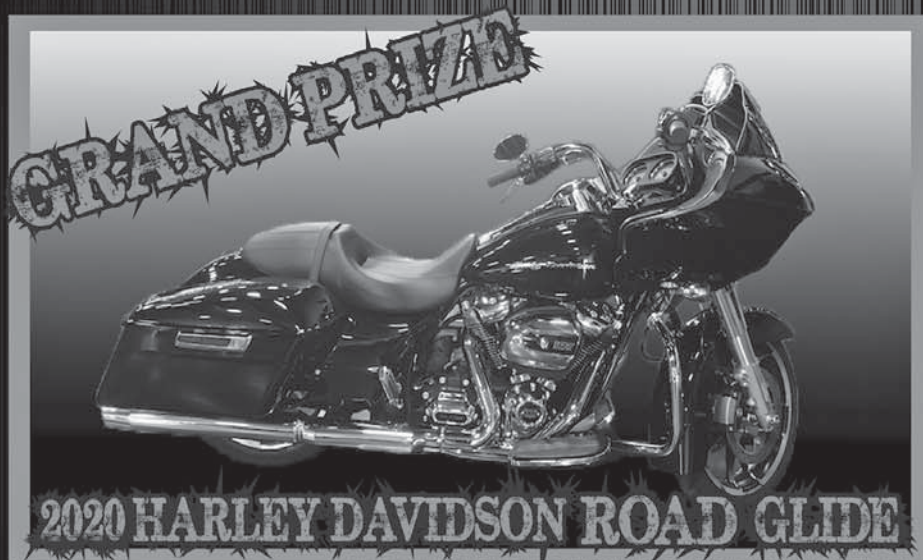
