SANTA MARIA ELKS RODEO'S "GOLDEN CIRCLE OF CHAMPIONS" HONOR CHILDREN WITH CANCER

The Golden Circle of Champions is an initiative conceived by the Santa Maria Elks Rodeo in 2016 to raise awareness and funds to fight Pediatric Cancer. What started in Santa Maria has now gone National for the second year at the 2019 National Finals Rodeo in Las Vegas this past December. Ten PRCA rodeos participated by sponsoring a child and ten children were sponsored by the Nevada Childhood Cancer Foundation.

Support is provided directly to the families to assist with urgent needs such as paying bills, buying medicine and more. The children and their families are honored at a banquet where they dine with the rodeo champions, receive special gifts and learn about the sport of Rodeo from the actual cowboys and cowgirls. That evening all honorees and their families attend a sold-out performance of the Wrangler NFR at Thomas & Mack Center. It's phenomenal what "Team Santa Maria" has accomplished in a few short years.

SANTA MARIA ELKS #1538 HONOR LOCAL FIREFIGHTERS

Santa Maria Elks Lodge #1538 held their 43rd annual Firefighters Appreciation Night on January 22nd. Each of the five fire agencies honored their Firefighter Of The Year nominated by their peers for their service, commitment, and heroism. Over 200 guests were in attendance, firefighters, family members, city and county officials and Lodge officers. The Fire Chief of Vandenberg AFB Response Division Chief Mark Faras, during his presentation held up a shirt emblazoned with "Space Force Fire and Rescue" and announced "we have joined the Space Force".























VA EXTENDS BENEFITS TO BLUE WATER NAVY VIETNAM VETERANS

The Department of Veterans Affairs began processing to consider Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act claims on January 1, 2020, extending the presumption of herbicide exposure to veterans who served offshore of the Republic of Vietnam during the Vietnam War. This change was required by legislation and a federal court mandate (Procopio v. Wilkie). Prior to these measures, only Vietnam War Veterans who served on the ground in Vietnam or within Vietnam's inland waterways were eligible to receive disability compensation and other benefits based on a presumption of herbicide exposure.

Signed into law June 25, 2019, the law specifically affects Blue Water Navy veterans who served as far as 12 nautical miles offshore of the Republic of Vietnam between January 6, 1962, and May 7, 1975, as well as veterans who served in the Korean Demilitarized Zone between January 1 1967, and August 31. 1971. These veterans can apply for disability compensation and other benefits if they have since developed on of 14 conditions that are presumed to be related to exposure to herbicides such as Agent Orange. Veterans do not need to prove that they were exposed to herbicides. The specific conditions can be found by searching "Agent Orange" on www.va.gov.

FROM THE SECRETARY

Members, as of March 1, 2020, there will be no more Transfer Demits granted until after April 1, 2020. It creates a nightmare for the two Lodges involved and sometimes the Member. If the transfer does not go through by March 31st then the Member trying to transfer is caught between two Lodges and will be sent back to Santa Maria #1538 where they will have to pay the dues for next year before they can transfer again.

PRICE INCREASE

Members, it has been over four years since the last price increase. Due to California minimum wage increases that started in 2017 and the increase of the cost of alcohol has given the house committee no other choice but, to increase the prices on beer and alcoholic beverages by .50 cents. Price increase will take effect April 1, 2020. In addition, all current round drink chips are still accepted; there has been no discussion in House Committee on the expiration of these chips.



SANTA MARIA ELKS **LODGE #1538 HOSTS** THE VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTERS' **CHRISTMAS PARTY FOR** THE PAST 35 YEARS

Since 1984 the Santa Maria Ells Lodge #1538 has hosted the local Vocational Training Centers' Christmas Party at the lodge completely free of charge for over 350 guests. VTC is a non-profit vocational center for adults with disabilities in our area. The party included a BBQ chicken lunch, games, festive attire, a DJ for dance music and of course a visit from Santa. This party is the highlight of the year for these folks and the Elks are proud to provide such a fun annual event.

MAJOR PROJECT LEADING KNIGHT CHALLENGE A MAJOR SUCCESS!!!

Our Esteemed Leading Knight Wes Brown asked the Members last October to help support his efforts to raise money for the California-Hawaii Major Project. This unique program funds 32 paid therapists and preschool vision screeners hired by CHEMPI to assist disabled children when no other organizations can or will. These CHEMPI professional therapists and preschool vision screeners travel, sometimes great distances, to help children get care they need. Every year a contest is held for the Leading Knights throughout California-Hawaii to raise extra money for the Major Project from November 1 thru January 31. The money raised is above and beyond the Lodge's normal fundraising during that time. This year Wes embraced this challenge and put together a plan which included the help of six local restaurants to donate a percentage of their profits on a particular day: restaurants included Blaze Pizza, Panda Express, Panera Bread, Chipotle, Red Robin and the Mayor's Place--a locally owned restaurant in Nipomo owned by one our own members Christopher Wilson and his wife Gina. Each event was fun as many Members and their families participated and enjoyed a meal and a fun time together.

Wes also was helped by having a fully stocked 38 bottle dual temperature wine cooler donated by Idlers to be raffled off and a Radio Flyer Red Wagon full of adult beverages and snacks that was raffled off on New Year's Eve. Both raffles raised a considerable amount of money. On January 19, 2020 a Major Project Fundraiser was held at the Lodge with prizes and raffles along with a Spaghetti Dinner.

During the 3-month Major Project Leading Knight Challenge many Members brought in full Purple Pigs to help increase our total contribution. On many occasions Wes Brown thanked all the Members that helped by participating in the dinners at local restaurants, buying raffle tickets, bring in purple pigs and attending the fundraiser. However, a special thank you goes out to the committees and generous Members that saw to it that our Leading Knight Challenge was a success. 

- The stainless-steel table underneath the fish screens is the area to prepare and remove your fish from your screen. Please do not remove your fish on the BBQ pit area.
