YOUR LODGE IS A FOODBANK DISTRIBUTION CENTER

Exalted Ruler Wes Brown was contacted at the end of March by the Food Bank of Santa Barbara County to see if our Lodge would be interested in hosting a distribution center on a weekly basis every Thursday. At this time, the Lodge had already shut down all operations; however, as Elks do, Wes saw the need in the community and asked the officers if he could count on their help to fulfill this request. April 2, 2020 was the first Thursday our Elks Lodge hosted the food distribution. Normally the Food Bank finds locations and then needs to staff them with volunteers who package and give the food away to our friends and neighbors in the community. The Food Bank loves the Elks as all they needed to do is have a large truck show up and drop off pallets of groceries and fresh vegetables. Thank you to the Berry Man who also drops off pallets of food. After all is dropped off, your officers, wives, Members and volunteers from around the community repackage into bags as needed and hand them out at 10:00 am and staying until they are all gone. The Elks guickly created a well-organized and efficient assembly line and the distribution center soon became an extremely popular center with the community. Local TV stations and newspapers did segments on the news about the distribution center, which only made it even more popular. The Food Bank soon was delivering enough food for us to package and give away 600+ bags, serving 350+ families.

When the Gratitude Grant became available it seemed only natural to help the Food Bank of Santa Barbara County.

As you all know we did a soft opening of the Lodge for the Monday and Friday night dinners on June 4, 2020, We hope to be able



ORGAN & TISSUE DONATION PROGRAM

The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the USA has joined forces with Donate Life America to increase donations of organs, eyes and life-saving tissue.



The Grand Lodge, Fraternal Committee is asking Elks Lodges nationwide to promote the Organ Donor Program in their Lodge Bulletins and Lodge Web sites to help inspire members and citizens in their communities to make these life-saving donations.

Even though 95% of Americans are in favor of being a donor, only 54% of the U.S. adult population, are registered organ, eye and tissue donors. Nationally, nearly 33,600 patients began new lives in 2016 thanks to organ transplants. 683,000 have taken place since 1988. Every year 1.5 million tissue transplants are performed. 48,000 patients have their sight restored through corneal transplants each year and 1,500,000 since 1961! Unfortunately, 119,000 men, women and children currently need life-saving organ transplants. Then, add another name to the national organ transplant waiting list every 10 minutes. No wonder an average of 22 people die each day from the lack of available organs for transplant!

We Elks Members can help close the gap! The effort of Lodges to promote the program through their Bulletins and Web site can gain them five points in their quests to be named an All American Lodge. More incentives will be announced in coming years as the program takes shape throughout Elkdom.

DRESS CODE IN EFFECT FOR ALL FUNCTIONS

Elks Lodge 1538 is a flagship among Elk Lodges and not just another "Bar or Club." As such we have a Dress Code. Most times it is casual and allows more casual wear: Long shorts, like Bermuda and cargo style shorts are acceptable after 6:00 pm – except Thursday Lodge Night.

- Please no mid-thigh, cutoffs, short-shorts, or torn/frayed wear.
- Please wear all pants at your waist, not below! And no "Plumber Pants!"
- No Sweat Suits or Beach Apparel No Flip Flops (rubber style shower shoes) – Sandals okay
- For Ladies: No Inappropriate tops No dresses shorter than mid thigh
- For Men: No muscle shirts No T-shirts or caps with vulgar or inappropriate slogans No gang attire. Gentleman, wear pants at the waist, not below! Hats should be worn properly, not backwards or sideways, and please remove hats when sitting at the table to eat.

Our Greeters, Staff, and Officers do not wish to embarrass or upset any Member or guest, so please do not put them in that position. We will ask you to leave to change. Members are responsible for informing all guests of the dress code!

Members may bring up to 8 guests. All persons attending Friday Night CYO must be over 21 years of age.

These rules will be updated as needed and are at the discretion of the Greeters, Staff, or Officer in Charge the day of the event.



SANTA MARIA ELKS LODGE #1538 DID YOU KNOW?

As the plague seems to be waning, I still have time to investigate our history because now I can't go out and about because of protests and riots not to mention the prospect of "Murder Hornets".

We begin with Elk Year 1976-1977. Political correctness hasn't come along vet apparently because the entertainment for the annual fundraiser for Cerebral Palsy and Crippled Children was a 1 D hour film on China entitled "come see how the other half live". On a lighter note the pancake breakfast for the same charity was attended by 1,197 members and guests. As of April 1st, our Lodge membership was 2,273. Mother's Day breakfast was changed to brunch, the menu was still steak and eggs. On June 4th, an Indian was stolen from the lobby (assuming a statue?) it was returned by someone but in need of repair. In September there was a new rule concerning the sauna, mirrors were not allowed, yes, I have no clue either. Also, September brought the inception of steak fries to CYO and a price hike to \$4.00. In October, Monday thru Friday lunches re-appear and are open to guests. Did you know there was a juke box in the bar at this time? November 1976 brought bylaw changes, one was an increase in Membership dues and fees. This was because "the Lodge was growing at a seemingly alarming rate". Top entertainers performed here frequently, on December 4th, the Harry James Orchestra featuring Harry James himself performed, show and dinner was \$10.00 per person.

At Tom and Jerry night on December 23rd, "the little ladies" were included. To help control who comes into the Lodge, establishing a Greeters Committee was proposed.

The kitchen extension project was voted on and approved by the Membership on February 17, 1977. The estimated cost was \$25,000 and included a walk-in freezer, much of the labor would be done by Members to offset cost. Les Brown and his Band of Renown was featured at the Lodge on March 19, same \$10.00 per person including dinner. Our stage was also built by volunteers in March, not sure if it was before or after the show. Oddly, the Purple Pig was called Sammy Pig at this time. It appears that the Woodcutting Committee was formed on March 26, 1977. Twenty-one members went out to Purvis Glines Ranch resulting in a stockpile of more than 25 cords. Games after Lodge meetings returned on May 12th with a cribbage tournament. Live music in the bar on Saturday nights was introduced as a weekly entertainment. At State Convention in May our Lodge was declared "the most outstanding Lodge in the association for 1976-1977 by the California-Hawaii Elks Association (CHEA). Five days of celebration of the Golden Anniversary of Santa Maria Lodge #1538 was begun June 14th thru 18th, 1977. The highlight of the celebration was the burning of the mortgage. The five days included dinners each night attended by State, County and Elk dignitaries.

At Grand Lodge Convention in July, 1538 received an award for being second in the nation for net percentage of Memberships gained. In 1977 CYO was averaging 380 dinners each Friday night. The Lodge finally received its new Elko License from the City so games will resume beginning September 1977. Bingo will be open to the public with proceeds going to the Cerebral Palsy and Crippled Children's Fund. The Freddy Martin Orchestra entertained at the Lodge on October 22nd. That same month the first annual Sock Hop was held. Saturday bar music and dancing seems to have disappeared. An annual Calcutta was held at the Fair Grounds October 7th, 8th and 9th, For those of you like myself that had no idea what a Calcutta is, at the beginning of an event, roping, barrel racing etc. teams enter the arena and the spectators are able to "place bids" through auction to purchase a team, let the gambling begin. Effective October 14th CYO shoots up to \$5.00. In November, the Monday thru Friday lunches are changed to a buffet.

On December 16, Harry James and his Big Band performed at the Lodge. Monday thru Friday lunches were discontinued in January of 1978 for the second or third time. Trips to Santa Anita and gambling flights sounded like fun for all that participated. In March 1978 for the first time the names of those departed members for the previous month were printed. Also, in the March Elks Horn the "Sick and Visitation" report was posted for the first time.

The Kitchen extension was complete and functional in May of 1978. Final touches would continue, if you look, you will see where the exterior brick wall is. At State Convention in May our BBQ team put on a Santa Maria Style BBQ as the opening night dinner for Grand Lodge and CHEA officials. At Grand Lodge Convention in July of 1978, Santa Maria 1538 was recognized as the number one Lodge in our membership category for Veterans Remembrance in the Nation. In August, the Lodge Parade Wagon was completed and the possibility of building an "Athletic Facility" on the grounds was discussed. Music and dancing return to the bar on Saturday evenings in September. Also, in the September Elks Horn the first advertisement appeared for the "card room", no details were mentioned. I hear the "card room" was not a new entertainment option. October 1st, drink prices skyrocketed 10 cents as did Monday Night dinners jumping up to \$2.25.

May of 1979 was the first mention of building the Lodge Room which had been part of the original set of plans. A survey regarding opening the bar on Sundays was taken in June of 1979 which was favorable so as of July the Lodge was open seven days a week. By this time, the Lodge Membership was approaching 3,000.

After the July Elks Horn there were no further ads for the "card room". July saw CYO price reach \$6.00.

First mention of a PER Meeting was in September, the BBQ and meeting were held at the home of one of the PER's. At the Grand Lodge Convention in July, our Elks Horn won third place in all of Elkdom for the best Lodge Bulletin. The first Super Bingo was played October 7th and attracted 360 players. At the September 6th meeting the construction of a dedicated Lodge Room was voted on and the vote was favorable 147-1, who was that guy? Starting in the October Elks Horn, articles by other officers began to appear. The tradition of raffling off a new car continued at the New Years Eve Party, in 1979 the car was a 1980 Monte Carlo. By the start of the Elk Year 1980-1981 the Lodge would have 60 committees to help this exceptionally large Lodge function well. The introduction of Disco Lessons on Sundays rounded out the year. As #1538 embarks on the Lodge Room project we'll see what the 1980's brings. I realize this chronicle is incomplete because the source is strictly the Elks Horn, but I hope you are enjoying this journey.
