ELKS NATIONAL FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS

What is Elks National Foundation Scholarship? The Elks National Foundation will award 500 prestigious, four-year scholarships to the highest-rated applicants in the competition. Each award is intended to cover a significant share of the student's educational expenses – including tuition, living expenses, books and required fees.

Applicants to this need-based scholarship are judged on their scholarship and leadership abilities. Each year, 500 scholarships are given out across the country, with award amounts (over four years) ranging from \$4,000 to \$50,000.

Applicants must advance through local, district and state levels to reach the national competition. The top national finalists will be selected to attend a Leadership Weekend, hosted in Chicago, IL.

There have been 2 rating sessions to narrow down the victors of the

scholarship. There will be 12 male and 12 female candidates selected. I am proud to tell you that Lodge 1538 has 6 candidates who made the top 52. We have 3 amazing students from Santa Maria Lodge 1538 who are moving forward to State Judging.

Rated 2nd is November SoM Deisy Sanchez Aguilar of Pioneer Valley High School. Rated 13th is November SoM Neev Vinchhi of Ernest Righetti High School, and Rated 16th is Sebastien Tello-Galindo of Pioneer Valley High School.

State Judging took place in Atascadero, from February 3-5.


