I have often been asked why our Lodge is so famous for our BBQ meals. As some of you know our Lodge was featured on the internationally-viewed show "Man Fire Food" on the Cooking Channel. We were also featured on a follow up show where the host showcased the 10 best types of food he has enjoyed from the hundreds of places he has eaten. Our Lodge was number five of the ten best steaks he has ever eaten. If you saw the show, as well as the outstanding steaks we beat out, that was pretty impressive. Those shows as well as the many books, magazine articles, and internet shows we have been featured in has increased the interest of why we are so successful.

There are a few reasons. The first is consistency: our Lodge BBQ's the same way today as our early BBQ teams did 80 years ago. The people come here again and again because they know they will get the same great meal they had, even years ago. We have not changed

the seasoning of salt, pepper and granulated garlic. The bean and salsa recipes are still the same. Even the macaroni salad recipe our Lodge uses is loved by many people. There have been attempts by some in our Lodge in the past few years to change the recipes and it did not go well. Some long-time restaurants in the area have closed because they made changes that did not work.

Next is the quality of the food - the Lodge does its best to get good quality beef. We serve a good meal at a good price. One other thing is something you normally do not think about when we talk about our success serving a BBQ meal: Our Hospitality - being friendly and courteous. These are the main reasons that our Lodge is so successful and respected and keeps bringing people back for our great BBQ. Our Lodge BBQ's have been successful for about 80 years, so why would we want to change it?




















































































TRAVELEERS
