

ELKS BBQ (A CONTINUING SERIES): HOW MUCH FOOD DO I NEED?

When doing a BBQ, a quite common question is "how much food do I need for my party?" Here are some numbers to use as a baseline, based on a group of adults. Adjust up or down depending on the guests as women and children typically eat less than men, and if you have a lot of other food, you will need less.

- 1. Top block, New York, ribeye or tri-tip: plan 34 of a pound per person raw untrimmed. If there is a lot of fat plan on 1 pound per person.
- 2. Chicken is usually a half chicken per person. Half chicken is easier to cook and keep moist than chicken pieces such as breast or thighs. You can always cook half chickens and cut them in half to serve.
 - 3. One gallon of beans will serve 25 people.
- 4. A one-pound bag of green salad will serve 14 people.
- 5. Add salad dressing to taste, but do not add too much or add it too early. The salad will get soft. As an example, 10 pounds of salad will need 1/3 gallon of dressing.
 - 6. One loaf of bread about 15" in length will

feed 10 people and a 12" loaf will feed 8. Figure 1½" thick and two slices per person. That is one top and one bottom slice when the bread is split in half before toasting.

- 7. One pound of butter will take care of two loaves of bread if you are dipping in melted butter. Use excellent quality butter for a better taste and add garlic to the bread to taste. (It will taste better than adding garlic to the melted butter.)
- 8. One gallon of salsa will feed about 50 people. This varies significantly depending on your guests. Also, if you plan to have tortilla chips to dip the salsa, figure that in.
- 9. One gallon of macaroni or potato salad will feed 35 people.

So now you have an idea how much food to buy. Best of Luck!

DRESS CODE IN EFFECT FOR ALL **ELKS FUNCTIONS**

Elks Lodge 1538 is a flagship among Elk Lodges and not just another "Bar or Club." As such we have a Dress Code. Most times it is casual and allows more casual wear: Long shorts, like Bermuda and cargo style shorts are acceptable after 6:00 pm except Thursday Lodge Night.

- · Please no mid-thigh, cutoffs, short-shorts, or torn/ frayed wear.
- · Please wear all pants at your waist, not below! And no "Plumber Pants!"
- · No Sweat Suits or Beach Apparel No Flip Flops (rubber style shower shoes) - Sandals okay
- · For Ladies: No Inappropriate tops No dresses shorter than mid thigh
